Using the Manuscripts and Rare Books Collection

Manuscript and Rare Book collections are available to American Ancestors/NEHGS members who have made arrangements with the library at least 48 hours in advance of their visit. Please contact manuscripts@nehgs.org to request specific items. Upon arrival, manuscripts may be viewed on the 5th floor and rare books on the 7th floor.

Can I get in-depth help with my research?

Yes! If you would like hands-on assistance with your research, you can hire an American Ancestors genealogist to work side by side with you either online or at the Research Center to guide you through records and help advance your research. In-person and online sessions are offered as half-day (three-hour) or full day (five-hour) options.
