- Determine who the other soldiers in the same vessel, company, and or regiment are.
- Create a spreadsheet of names and dates.
- Repeat the steps as you would for your own ancestor
- Locate where they resides to search for diaries and letters they may have left.
- Search Pension files for mutual "affidavits"
- Create a Social Media page for descendants

I do know it is impossible to get records from Alabama. For some reason they were lost or destroyed. Any way they were never sent to Washington. Mr Nonemacher's father enlisted in Mountown, Ala. and served throughout the War, yet Mr Nonemacher



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



Some repositories also have records of Confederate Homes (for veterans, widows, etc.), muster rolls of State Confederate militia, and other records related to the war.

The applicant must fill in all the blanks in the application in a neat, legible hand, and swear to its correctness before one of the County Board of Examiners or some other officer authorized to administer an oath. The accompanying schedule of property must also be filled out and sworn to, both application and schedule of property must be filed with the Board of Examiners of the County. The affidavits for witnesses must also be filled out and sworn to by persons of personal knowledge as to the service and other matters contained in the blank affidavits for witnesses. It is not necessary that the witnesses be residents of the State, but they must have a personal knowledge of what they swear to. All application not verified by the affidavit of two persons must be rejected. As the application will become an office record, it should be made out carefully and neatly.

The County Board of Examiners must have each applicant (who is not physically or mentally unable to appear) appear before them, when they must examine the applicant orally as to all matters pertaining to this application, and such examination must be by the County Board reduced to writing and forwarded with the application, affidavits and schedule of property, to the Auditor of the State, to be by him laid before the State Board of Examiners. Should an applicant be unable to appear and represent herself, the Board may take such measures as in their opinion may be necessary to satisfy themselves of the merits of the application. In such cases the full facts of the case must be set out in their written report and recommendations. All persons who served in the "Militia, State Reserves or Home Guards of the State of Alabama during the war between the States are eligible to relief under this Act. 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



WILLIAM BRYAN HUTTON.

William Bryan Hutton, born in Greene County, Ala., February 15, 1841, was the fifth child of Dr. A. D. and Mrs. E. H. Hutton, both of whom were natives of South Carolina, but residents of Alabama from their early youth.

Dr. Hutton was a relative of John C. Calhoun, and taught his son Calhoun doctrines of patriotism and government. As soon as his State seceded William Hutton at once left college and entered the tented field.

He was retiring and sedate, exhibiting the most delicate respect for others; he was most exemplary in his habits; he was energetic and apt in his studies, and

always maintained a high position in his classes. In the fall of 1857 he matriculated at the University of Virginia. During his course of nearly four years he had received diplomas in several languages. Through the influence of Dr. Gesner Harrison he had determined to complete his study of ancient languages by a course in Germany. During his fourth session, however, Alabama withdrew from the Union, and he returned home and joined the North Sumter Rifles

vision hospital. He died and was buried under an apple tree near the road. After the war his body was removed to Spottsylvania C. H., and his grave marked by a stone erected by his only sister, Mrs. D. H. Williams.

After his death, among the many letters received, one of his comrades writes: "After the first battle of Fredericksburg, he was elected junior second lieutenant, and his conduct justified the correctness of our choice. He was a skillful drillmaster. He was often consulted by his superiors in rank, when on the field, as to the proper execution of a movement, and he was regarded by all as being in the line of promotion."

JAMES POLK FIELDER.

James Polk Fielder departed this life January 21, 1900, in Greene County, Ark. He was born in Maury County, Tenn., November 28, 1837, and was reared in Hickman County. He enlisted in the Confederate army in April, 1861, in Capt. Tom P. Bateman's Company, the first made up in Hickman County, Eleventh Tennessee Regiment, Col. Raines, and afterwards commanded by Col. (later Gen.) G. W. Gordon, now of Memphis, Tenn. Comrade Fielder was in the battles of Perryville, Murfreesboro, Chickamauga, and all the later battles fought by that prince of warriors, Gen. Cheatham, surrendering with Joe Johnston.

A. H. LAHATTE.

Albert Henry LaHatte, of Cayuga, Miss., was accidentally killed on September 30, 1899, by a fall from the upper tier of Tallahala Bridge, upon which he was working. Comrade LaHatte was born in Georgia, and at the age of twenty enlisted at Columbus in Company E, Tenth Georgia Regiment, under Col. Cummins. He was with Johnston at Bull Run and under
