Context

Why?

- Most American records will not name an exact birthplace
- Shifting borders in Europe
- European records are organized at the local level
- Lack of reliable, unified indexing projects

Types of Records

- Naturalization records (before and after 1906)
- Visa Files (1924-1944)
- Alien Registration Forms (1940-1944)
- Alien Files (1944-1956)
- Passport Records

Naturalization pre-1906

- Range of local and federal courts
- Resident of United States for at least five years
- Information collected varies from court-to-court
- Basic information: name, age, date of arrival, birth country
- Citizenship granted to wives of U.S. citizens

1900: *Broddy* family at 17 Norman Street, Boston. Simon (b. Dec 1844, Russia; im. 1898). Lillian (b. Apr 1845, Russia; im. 1898). Harris (b. Dec 1877, Russia; im. 1892). Annie (b. May 1882, Russia; im. 1899). Henry (b. Mar 1884, Russia; im. 1898). Annie Brysor, granddaughter (b. Jan 1890, England; im. 1898). Haskell Orinsky, lodger (b. Aug 1839, Russia; im. 1884).²

1903: Harry *Browdy* petition for naturalization. Residing at 52 Lowell Street, Boston. Occupation: Tailor. Born: 22 Oct 1878, Russia. Arrival: 15 Mar 1892, New York. Witnesses: Harry Novograbelsky, 134 Brighton Street, Boston, and Jacob Rosenberg, 81 Brighton Street, Boston.³
