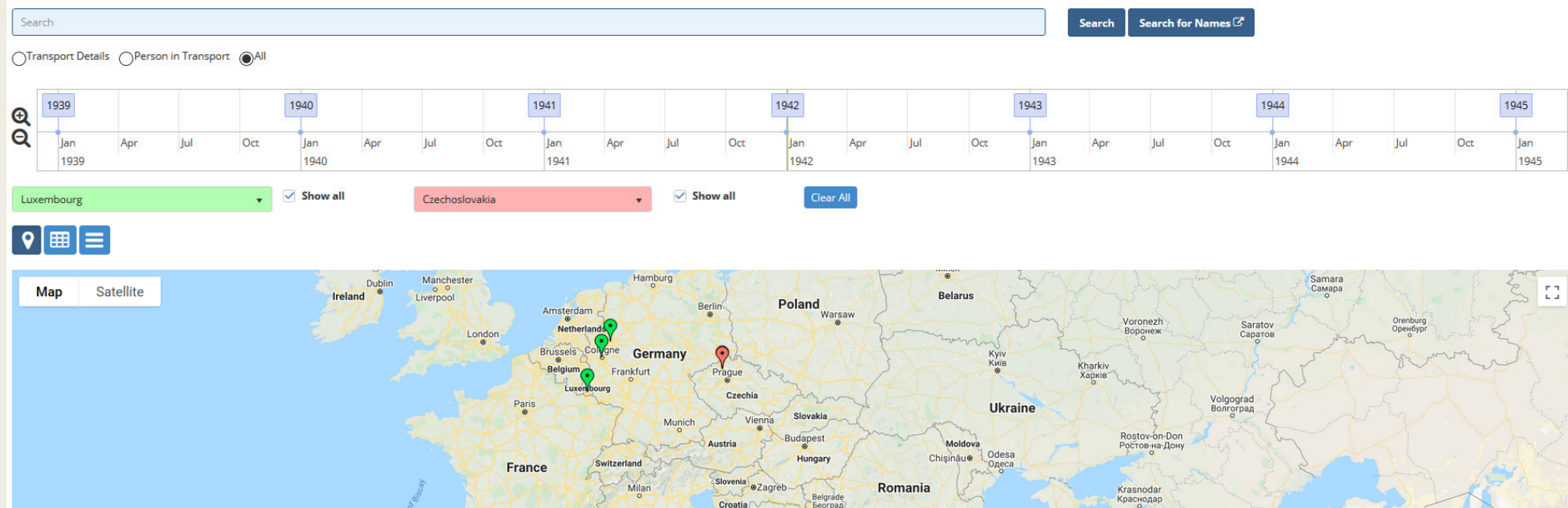

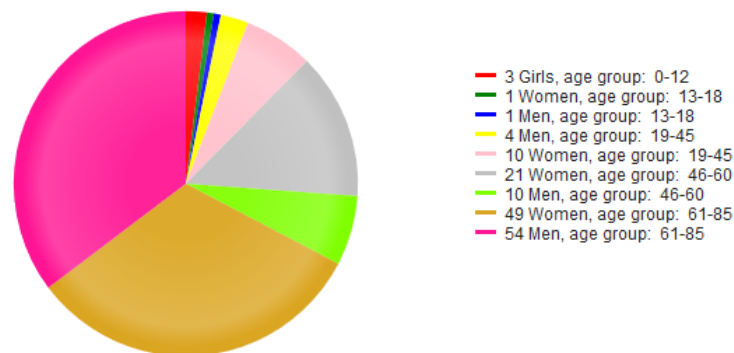

Introduction by Peter Landé

Background

In the last six months of the war, as Russian forces approached, thousands of Jewish and non-Jewish prisoners were transported westward from Auschwitz and Gross Rosen to camps in Germany, such as Buchenwald. Auschwitz and Gross Rosen records were frequently destroyed, and these transport lists are often the only lists available showing who had been held in the east. The largest categories of prisoners sent at that time were Polish and Hungarian Jews, mostly males, but virtually every nationality is included as are significant numbers of non-Jewish prisoners.

This database includes records for two transports: 22-Jan-1945 and 26-Jan-1945.

The 22-Jan-1945 transport arrived in Buchenwald on January 22, 1945. The list, compiled from the Captured German Records collection (A-3355 reel 133 at NARA and 1996 A-0342 reel 165 at the USHMM), is of poor legibility. Nevertheless, it was possible to decipher almost all the names. Blank spaces were left where the material was illegible. The information was entered as it appeared, i.e. categories of prisoners, personal names and town names were entered as they appeared. The last column, Auschwitz prisoner number, was particularly difficult to read, and since it is impossible to confirm these numbers, they should be used with caution.

The 26-Jan-1945 transport arrived in Buchenwald on January 26, 1945 and was one of the largest transports, with over 3,000 prisoners. While the project is not complete, I have entered the names of all Polish, German, Austrian, French, Czech, Dutch and Belgian Jews. I began by including information on their profession and Auschwitz prisoner numbers, but this proved to be too difficult. Accordingly, I have limited the data to names and dates and places of birth, as well as category of prisoner. As information on other prisoners in this transport are digitized, they will be added.

The fate of these persons once they arrived in Buchenwald is not given. Researchers seeking such information on individuals should contact the Buchenwald Gedenkstätte (D-99427 Weimar, Germany, email buchenwald@buchenwald.de, or fax 49 3643 43010.).



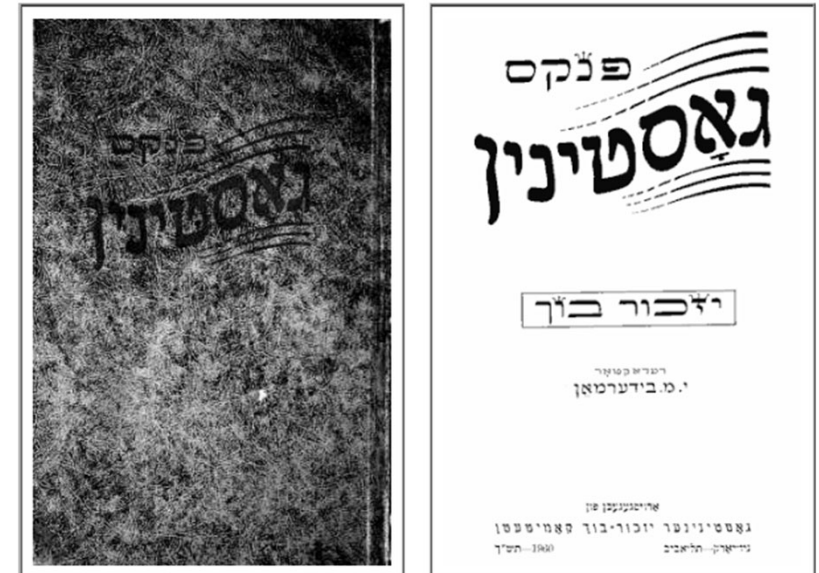

The latter we thought advisable to keep here for a short time in case any queries might arise while the clients are in transit. Were we to ship them now it would take five to seven weeks before they would reach New York.

As soon as the bills of lading are prepared and we know the boat on which the files are to be transported we will cable you the essential details.

Friederike or Frieda was the first of seven children born to the cigar maker Hermann Nathan (b. 1832 in Schleswig) and his wife Seraphine, née Schöning (b. 1833 in Hamburg). The family had settled in Schleswig in the 18th century. The couple had married in Wandsbek in 1857. The family apparently lived in good circumstances; the father belonged to the executive board of the Jewish Congregation in Schleswig. In 1885, the couple moved with five children to Hamburg; a daughter had previously died; a son moved to Munich.

In the Hansa City, the male members of the family worked in the prosperous tobacco business. The father ran a tobacco factory there since 1886; his son Martin (b. 1863) became independent in the same trade, but apparently not as successfully. Carl (1864–1953) was active as a tobacco broker and emigrated in 1939 to the USA, as did his brother Siegfried (b 1870), who like the eldest brother Jacob (b. 1861) was a businessman.



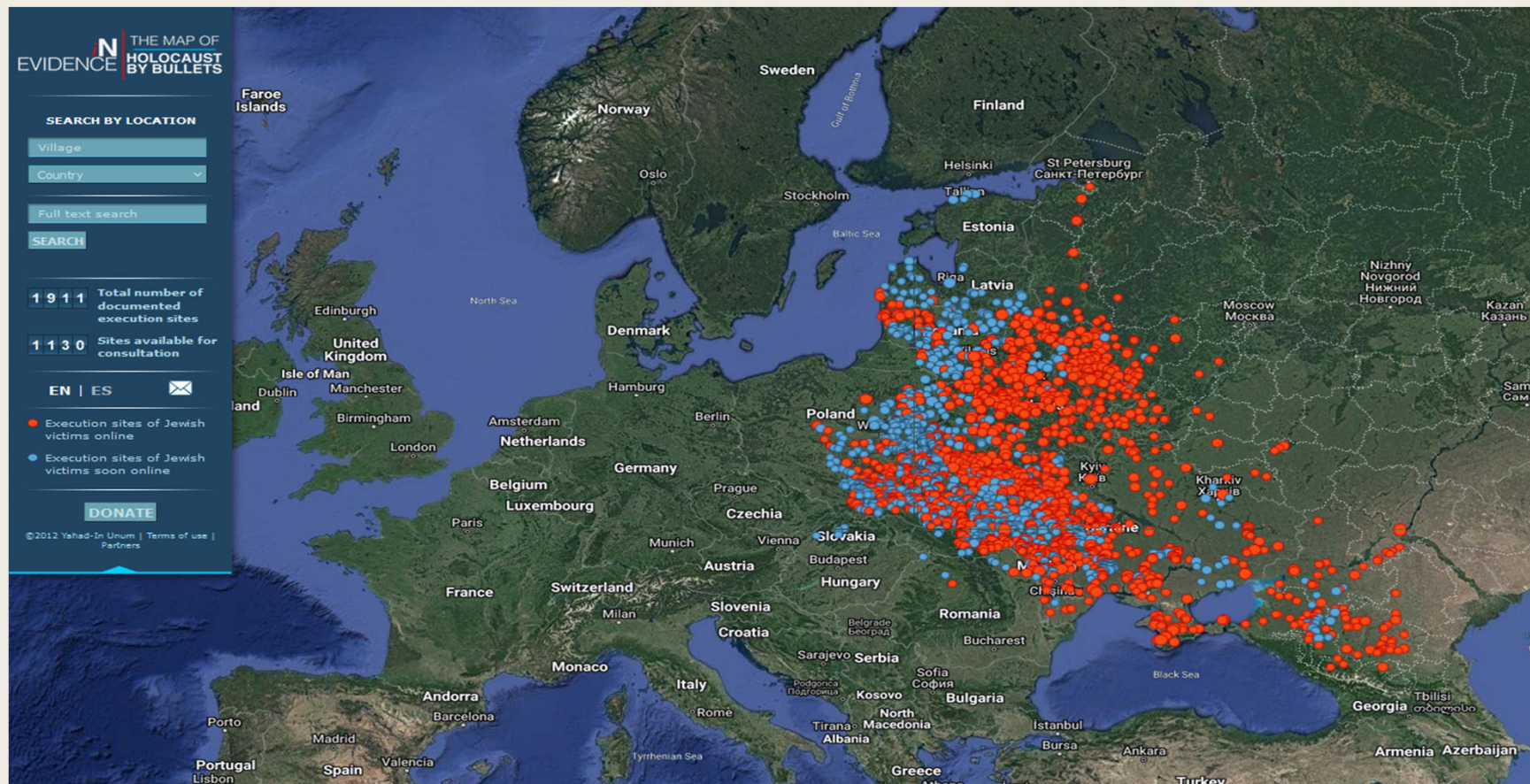

Ryszard W. born in 1933, recalls: "The camp was located just behind my house. The fence was about 10m away from my house. At the beginning, in 1941 or 1942, 7,000 Soviets soldiers died there due to hunger and diseases. They are buried 2km away from here. Then, once there were no more prisoners of war, the Jews were brought to this camp. At the beginning, it wasn't a camp but a factory which belonged to Mr. Plater" (Witness n°1033, interviewed in Blizyn on May 30th, 2019).

Historical note

Blizyn is located 45km north-east of Kielce. The Jewish community of Blizyn was rather small. In 1921 there were only 47 Jews registered in the town. A few hundred more Jews lived in the surrounding villages. According to Ryszard W. born in 1933, shops from Blizyn were mainly owned by Jews. Other Jews lived off crafts. There were no synagogues, nor a Jewish cemetery in the town. According to the local witnesses, the Jewish children went to school together with the non-Jews.

Holocaust by bullets in figures

Blizyn was occupied by Germans on September 3rd, 1939. According to historical sources, in February 1941 there were 375 Jews. However, the Jewish population continued to increase over time with the arrival of Jewish refugees from Lodz, Plock, and other surrounding villages. After a while, due to its close location to the railroads, Blizyn was transformed into a transit ghetto. At the same time, there was a camp for the Soviet prisoners of which numbered from 5,000 to 7,000 inmates according to different sources. In August 1942, about 600 Jewish inmates from the ghetto were displaced to Suchedniow. From there they were deported to the Treblinka death camp on September 22, 1942, along with some 3,500 Jews who remained in Suchedniow.

On March 8, 1943, a labor camp was created in Blizyn at the dye factory. The camp numbered from 5,000 to 6,000 inmates, both male and female, Jews and non-Jews. There were no children. The camp was fenced in with barbed wire, and there was a watchtower. In February 1944, it became a sub camp of the Majdanek death camp. All the Jews were subjected to perform forced labor, such as tailoring the clothes for the German army. They had to work for Deutsche Ausrüstungswerke. According to the local witness interviewed by Yahad, the Jews were also subjected to different kinds of humiliation and torture. According to testimony of Józef Detko, given after the liberation in front of the District Commission for the Investigation of Nazi War Crimes in Kielce, a small number of Jews were killed 50m outside the camp almost every day. The remaining inmates were deported to Auschwitz in February 1944.

Roman P., born in 1929, recalls: "There was no mass execution of Jews here, but there were many isolated shootings; the Jews were killed on the streets. They stood in hiding being afraid of Germans. I saw one Jewish woman being killed on that street. That's why they were afraid to get out in the street. Afterwards, they were all deported." (Witness n°1036, interviewed in Bodzentyn on May, 31st 2019)

Historical note

Bodzentyn is located 29km north-east of Kielce. The first records about the Jews go back to the second half of the 19th century. Jews were mainly craftsmen. They had a synagogue and their own cemetery. On the eve of WWII, 1,000 Jews lived in Bodzentyn making up the third of the total population.

Holocaust by bullets in figures

Bodzentyn was occupied by Germans in September 1939. Straight after the occupation, many refugees arrived or were forcibly displaced to Bodzentyn from such areas as Łódź, Kielce, and Płock. By the end of June 1941, 3,700 Jews remained in the town according to the registration document. Due to overcrowding and bad living conditions, a typhus epidemic broke out at the end of 1941 taking many victims. Starting from 1942, according to a historian Martin Dean it was in Mid-March 1942, an opened ghetto was created. In May 1942 several groups of young Jews fit to work were taken to the Skarżysko-Kamienna labor camp. On July 3-4 1942, a synagogue with several dozen deportees was burned down. The remaining Jews from the ghetto were gathered and deported to Suchedniów; from there they were sent to the death camp in Treblinka where they were gassed soon afterwards. In 1943 about 39 Jews were shot near the synagogue. After the war, their bodies were exhumed and buried at the Jewish cemetery.

Witness interview
Vladimir S. recalls: "The shooting took place during the summer, it was hot. There were bushes near the execution site. The Jews arrived one by one near the grave, and they received a bullet in the head. All was quiet. A well-dressed woman with a little 2 year-old girl fell in the grave but the little girl wasn't shot. One of the boys of the village had to put the corpses in order in the grave." (Witness N°650, interviewed in Rudkovshchina, on June 20, 2013).

Historical note
According to some sources, there were around 100 Jews in the village upon the arrival of the Germans in summer 1941. The Jews were merchants or artisans.

Holocaust by bullets in figures
At the end of February 1943, the Jews of the village were rounded up by the Germans and local policemen. According to Vladimir S. (Witness N°650), the Jews were gathered in a big house (an old maternity hospital) about 500 meters from the Maslaki road. According to Soviet sources, they were taken to the execution site on carts or on foot. The grave was located near a forest, 500 meters from the village. The Jews had to come one by one to the grave and were shot with a bullet in the head.

Lyudmyla M., born in 1932, remembers life before the war: "There were many Jews here. I would say about 800, but I am not sure. I was just a child back then. They lived in the center of the colony. They had their cemetery, but it is abandoned now. We went to school together with Jewish children. I remember my Jewish friend Zoya Itskovich. She was very sharp at math." (Testimony n°2083, interviewed in Andriev-Ivanivka, on June 01, 2016)

Historical note

Anriev-Ivaninka is located about 135km north of Odessa. Before the war it used to be a Jewish agricultural colony, called Shteln. The majority of Jews worked in the kolkhoz, while others were merchants and artisans. In 1928 there was a windmill and an oil factory. There was a Jewish cemetery, which doesn't exist anymore. According to the local witness, there were about 800 Jews living before the war.

Holocaust by bullets in figures

The village was occupied in early August 1941 by the Germans, followed by Romanians. Under the Romanian rule, it became part of Transnistria. According to the local witness, the local Jews were taken away and executed afterwards. However, many Jews from Moldova were marched through the village in the direction of Domanivka. Those who didn't have strength to move forward were shot on the spot and their bodies were left behind. Local witnesses buried them afterwards. Sometimes they stopped and stayed in a village for a couple of days or weeks, confined within the yard of the local gendarmerie. There was an execution of about 100 Jews brought from Moldova in late August 1941. The execution was most probably conducted by the Germans. The majority of victims were children, women and elderly people.
