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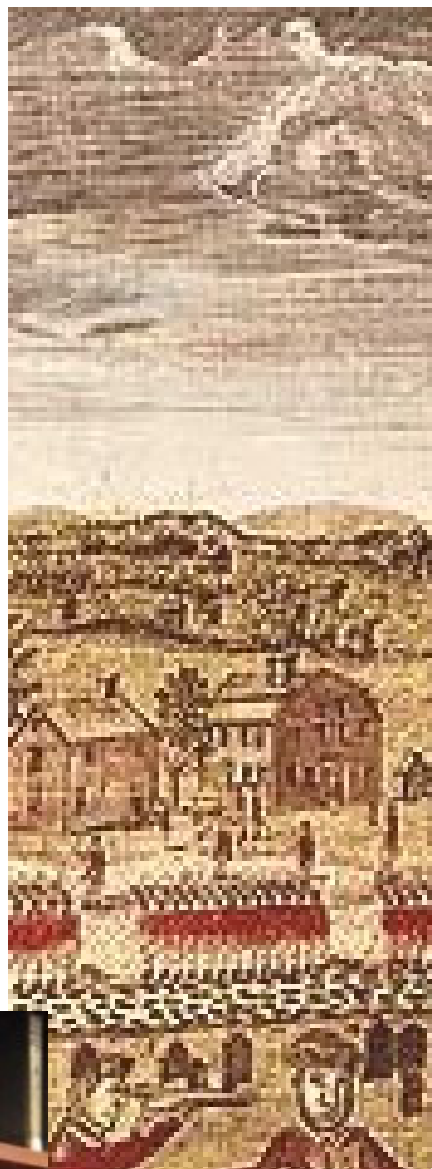

These are compiled service records for the regular soldiers of the Continental Army, and for the militia, volunteers, and others who served with them. The records are arranged under the designation "Continental Troops" or a state name, then by organization, and then alphabetically by a soldier's surname. Records consist of card abstracts of entries relating to each soldier from original records. Also included are regimental lists including muster rolls, pay lists, and caption cards.

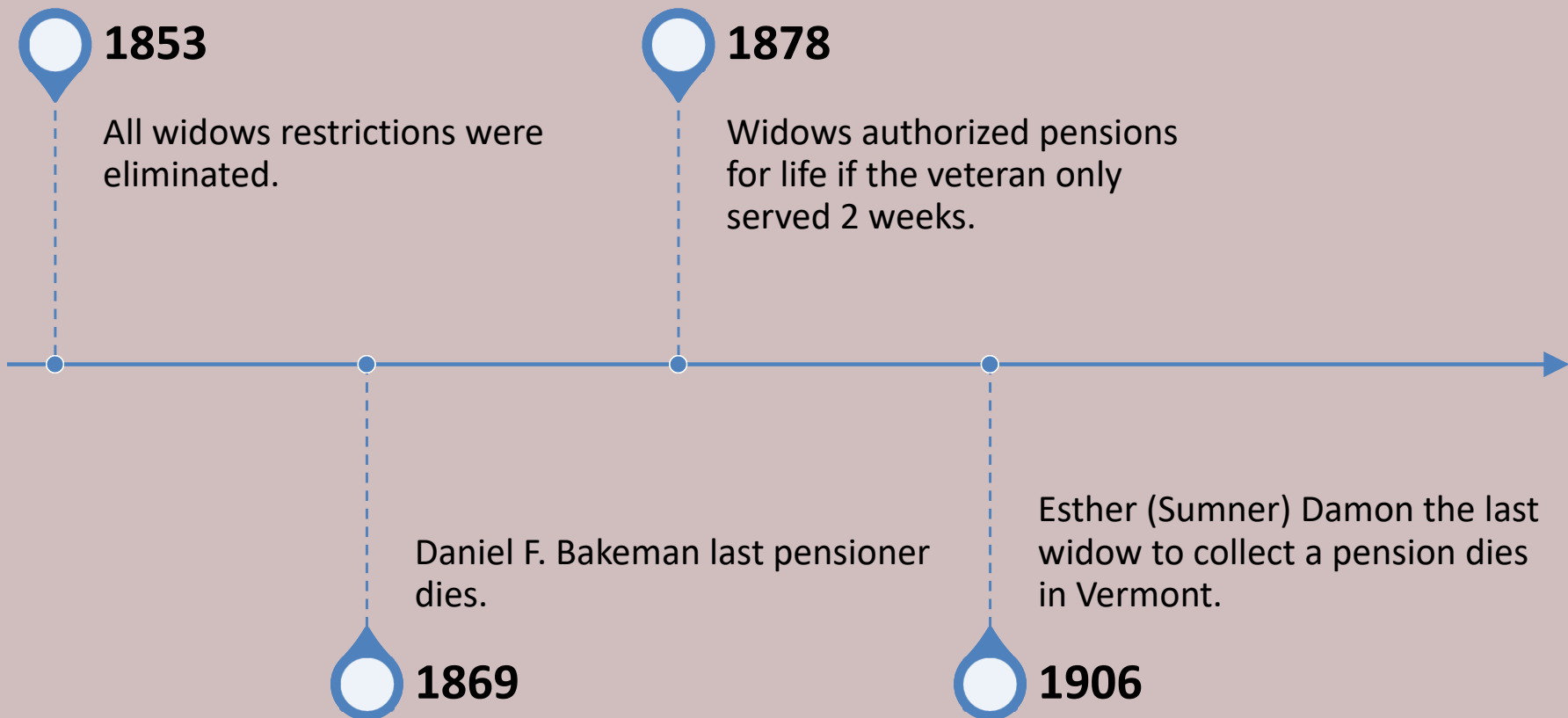
Pension Timeline

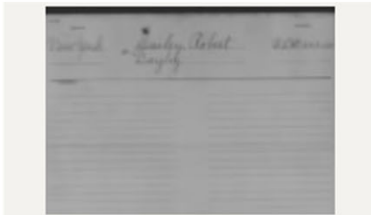

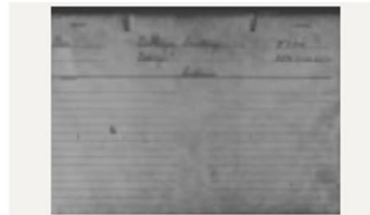

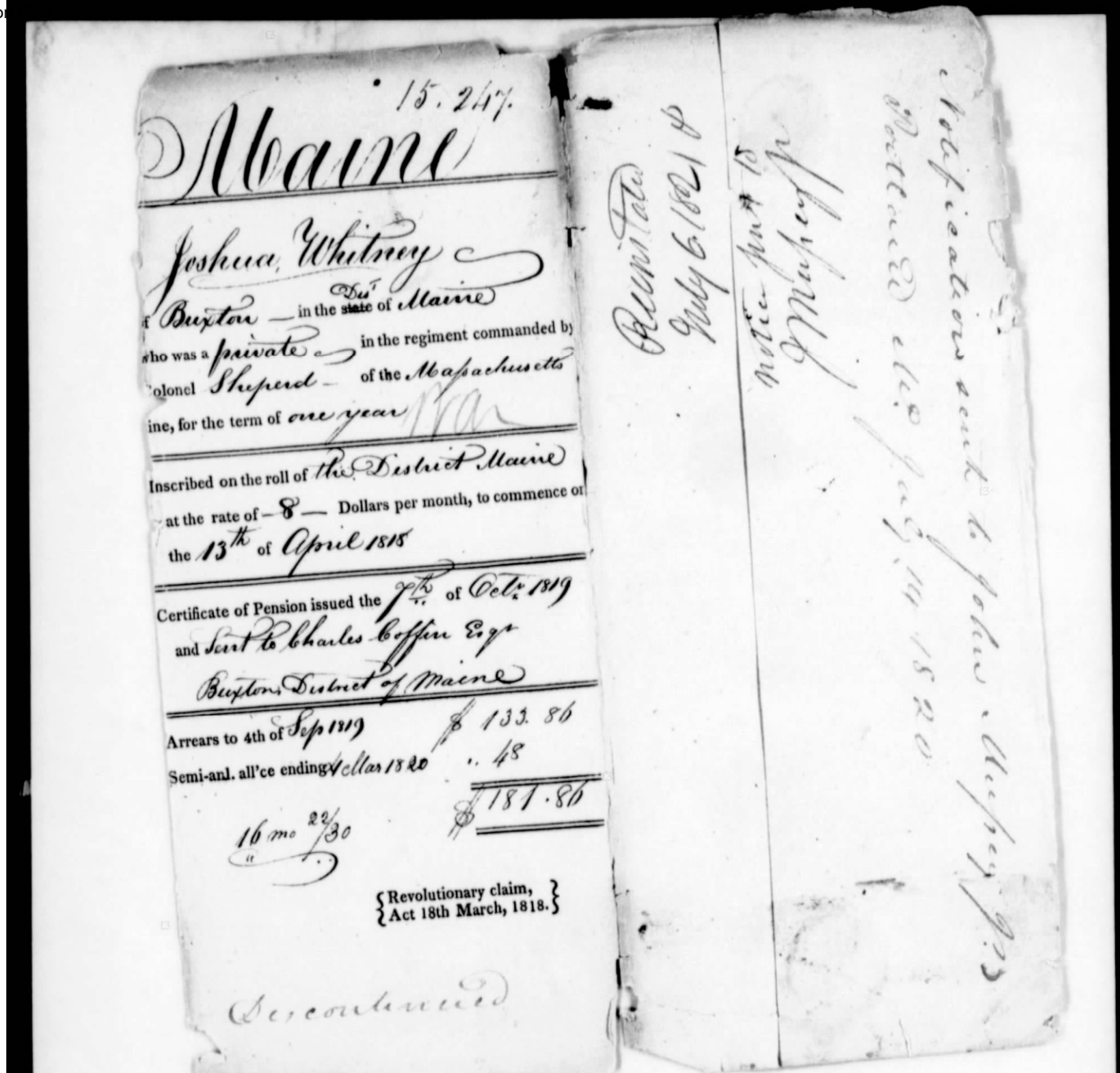

Joshua Whitney of Bunton in the County of York and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, aged fifty seven years, on oath testify and say, that I enlisted a private in the Continental Army of the Revolution in the first part of the month of January in the year of our Lord seventeen hundred & eighty two, the day of the month I do not recollect. The Company I enlisted into was when I enlisted commanded by Capt. ~~Monte~~ the same Company while I was in it was commanded by Capt. North, and afterwards when I was discharged from the army was commanded by Capt. Blanchard. The Regiment was commanded by Col. Shepard the whole time I was in ^{Massachusetts since} the army, and the Brigade was commanded by General Patterson from the time I ~~joined~~ the army till I was discharged from the same at the close of the war. I received my discharge from the army at the close of the war on the twenty eighth day of Oct. in the year of our Lord ~~eighteen~~ ^{seventeen} hundred & eighty three, signed by Major General Henry Knox. Which discharge is lost. I further on oath declare, that from my reduced circumstances, I need the assistance of my Country for support and am a citizen of the United States.

Pension payment records are not typically found in pension application files. These cards were created as an index for the final payments made to either the veteran or his widow. They provide additional details on where a family may have moved in the early- to mid-19th century, death dates of veterans, widows, or dependent children, and sometimes the maiden name of a widow.

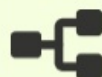

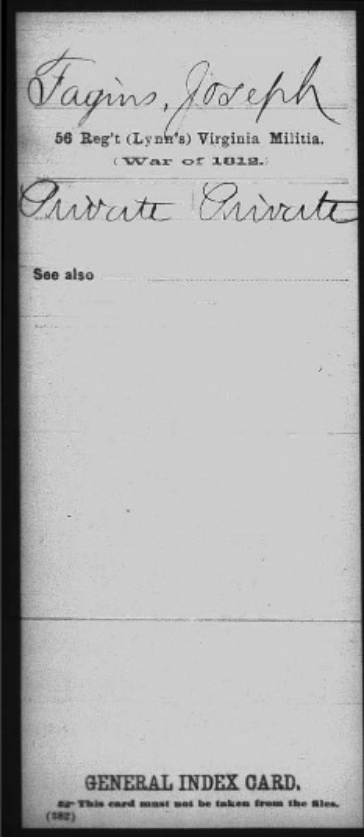

Introduction

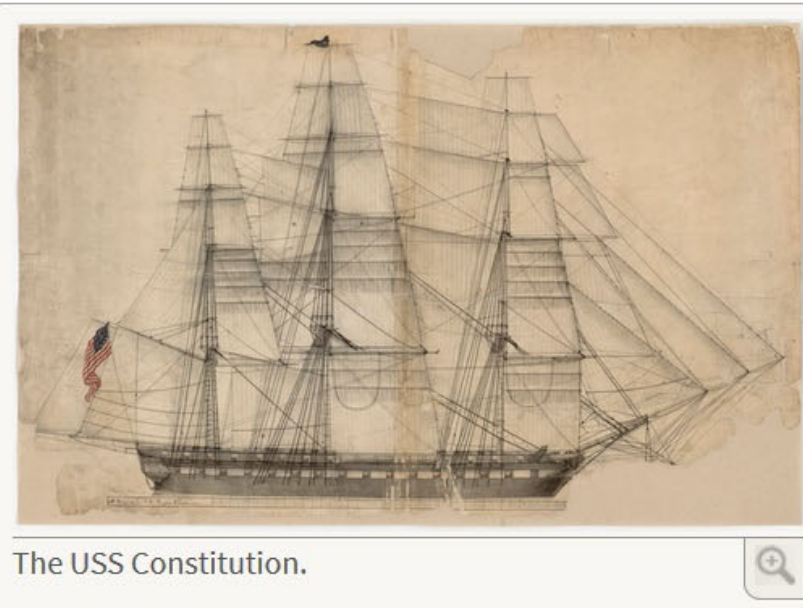
Logbooks, also referred to as Captain's Logs or Deck Logs, consist of chronological entries documenting the daily activities of a Navy ship or unit. Individual logbooks are arranged chronologically by date, with entries in each day's log arranged chronologically by the time of day.

The level of information contained in these volumes ranges from simple entries documenting daily routines to detailed meteorological and operational accounts.

Information also can include:

- Documentation of disciplinary hearings
- Sick lists
- Occasional injuries
- Use of daily rations, etc.

Information available differs widely based on when the logbook was created.

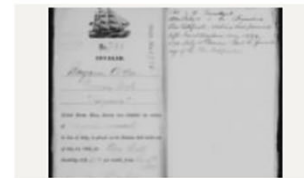

The agencies listed below are repositories for Confederate pension records. **The veteran was eligible to apply for a pension to the State in which he lived, even if he served in a unit from a different State.** Generally, an applicant was eligible for a pension only if he was indigent or disabled. In your letter to the repository, state the Confederate veteran's name, his widow's name, the unit(s) in which he served, and the counties in which he and his widow lived after the Civil War. Some repositories also have records of Confederate Homes (for veterans, widows, etc.), muster rolls of State Confederate militia, and other records related to the war.
