Melvina's marriage certificate lists her mother as Ellen Lutrell and William Fleetwood. Ellen Fleetwood died 7 November 1907 in Ellensburg, WA

Pertinent information about individual	Lucinda BOONE was born about 1794-97, likely in Clark County (was Fayette Co. until 1792,) or Bath County, Kentucky. She is one of at least five children of Joseph and Rebecca (Fry) Locke BOONE. Her (unverified) siblings include Joseph Jr., Parthew Martha, Lydia Ann and Memory Boone. Lucinda married Clifford Butler on 16 June 1818 in Bath County, KY (per marriage record.) They had 4-5 children including Martha Butler in about 1818 (4x greatgrandmother). Other children might include Joseph, Mary, Elizabeth. Lucinda is the granddaughter of Edward Boone b. 1840, the grandniece of the famous pioneer, Daniel Boone and great granddaughter of Squire Maugridge Boone.
Specific question(s) or goal(s) for consultation	1. Vital records or other for Lucinda Boone: Resolve conflicting birth and death dates around March of 1892. Was she 101? 95? 2. Pertinent information about individual	Jacob was born 14 Jan 1755 and died 9 Jun 1831 in Henry Co., Indiana. Jacob's parents were Thomas Brown and Margaret Moon. Jacob was a Quaker. At New Garden MM in Guilford, NC, 30th of the 11th month 1776, there was a complaint against Jacob for "taking up Arms in a warlike manner, and accomplishing marriage contrary to the rule of Friends". At the meeting the following month (28th of the 12th month 1776): "The Friends appointed last meeting to visit Jacob Brown, report they had an opportunity with him; but he not appearing in a suitable condition to condemn his misconduct, they produced a paper of denial against him, which was read approv'd, and sign'd." It wasn't until 26th first month, 1782 that Jacob "appeared at this meeting and offerd a paper Condemning his outgoings and also for Taking up arms in a warlike manner which was accepted." The paper was read at the meeting on 23 Feb 1782, and during the March meeting, Jacob requested a certificate to Cane Creek MM, which was granted at the meeting 27th of fourth month 1782. Jacob has subsequent certificates showing movement his movements. He was granted a certificate from Cane Creek second month, received on certificate in Deep River Nov 1786. He requested a certificate from Deep Creek 1st tenth month 1814 to Elk MM in Ohio where he joined some of his children – the family eventually moved to Henry county, Indiana.
Specific question(s) or goal(s) for consultation	Though Jacob is registered with DAR (patriot number A015488), I would like to find enough evidence to support that he really did fight in the revolutionary war (or not). The DAR evidence given for service is: Roster of Soldiers from North Carolina in the American Revolution, published by NC DAR: 1932, p. 199 and 225 – He's number 479 – but only his name is listed. Encyclopedia of American Quaker Genealogy, Supplement to Volume 1, by Thomas Worth Marshall, p. 9. (https://archive.org/details/encyclopediaofam00gene/page/8/mode/2up) However, examining the actual meeting minutes, you can see that the timing is questionable – Jacob was condemned in 1776 (most likely for fights against the Indians). He condemned his deeds in 1782 – which could have included fighting on the continental line, but not necessarily, since he most likely was presenting his paper in order to be reinstated so that a certificate could be made for his move to Cane Creek MM.

Roger first bought land in Grant Township, Washington, Minnesota on 4 Feb 1854 (E ½ NW ¼ Section 15, Township 30N, Range 21W – 80 acres). Pertinent information about individual	<p>She is referred to as Olsdatter in some church records, following Norwegian use of patronymics. However as Bergen was on the leading edge of the adoption of hereditary surnames and there was a strong German influence in Bergen, she is also referred to at times by the surnames Jørgensen and Ottesen. I hypothesize that her father's name might have been Ole Jørgensen, and this is consistent with her son's names; however I have researched every Ole Jørgensen I can find who might be a candidate for her father with no luck.</p> <p>Anne Margrethe was born about 1780, probably in Norway (possibly Denmark or another country with ties to Norway, although I've already explored these possibilities to the extent possible). She had her first child out of wedlock with Iver Ottesen in Bergen in MWho are ?ay 1804. The child died at four weeks of age, but she and Iver married in November 1804 and went on to have nine more children before her death in 1824. I began researching this family a long time ago with only the surname of my grandmother Otterson (spelling was changed). By about 10 years ago I had managed to trace her great-grandfather, John Otteson (Johan Ottesen) b. 1815, to Bergen, Norway, as the son of Iver and Anne Margarethe (have since obtained DNA corroboration of this). I've assembled extensive documentary and DNA evidence establishing Iver's identity and ancestry; however despite devoting over five years of nearly full-time research to Anne Margarethe, I cannot find any remotely conclusive evidence of her existence prior to the birth of her first daughter in 1804.</p>

Any Additional Comments	I incorporate DNA triangulation into my research to the extent possible. In my online tree on Ancestry, I use the initials of DNA matches in the appendix field as a breadcrumb trail to identify convergence between matches. I've tested on all major DNA platforms and I'm on Gedmatch. I use DNA Painter extensively. I've managed to map multiple segment of interest to Iver through identifying matches in common with myself and other known descendants. DNA evidence strongly suggests a connection to a family in Karmøy, Rogaland, back in the late 1600s/early 1700s; however I researched this family and can't find where Anne M. would fit in. There was loss of church records in Karmøy. I have also resarched the families of all her kids' baptism witnesses as these were usually family members; however this does not seem to be the case.

Question 2 : Anna Ledyard	
Pertinent Information 2	Anna was born in the area of Bristol/Farmington Connecticut around 1775 and married Zenas Curtis there around 1793. Their first son, Sheldon, was baptized in the New Cambridge Episcopal Church in 1794, and the family moved to Farmington, Trumbull, Ohio around 1806. I have not been able to connect Anna to any of the known Yankee Acadian lineages. A few years ago, I developed DNA evidence that strongly indicates that Anna was of Acadian descent. I then came upon a newspaper article about a "Charles Ledyard, Frenchman" of Farmington, CT, who had gone AWOL from his military unit in 1779. That Charles Ledyard eventually married Phebe Hale and several of their children were baptised in the same church as Zenas and Anna Curtis's children. Eventually Charles and Phebe moved to Vermont. Charles provided in his Revolutionary War Pension Application that he was born in Port Royal Nova Scotia in 1746 and came to Connecticut at a young age. There was a Leger family from Port Royal who were deported to CT with son Charles, but he was born in 1749 and was left behind in Canada. I cannot find evidence that Anne Ledyard Curtis is the daughter of Charles Ledyard, however my Acadian DNA segment is about 50cm and includes all of the same surnames as the expelled Port Royal families.

DNA analysis (genealogical convergence between 3 matches) shows a connection to a Mary Ann Park born 1796 in Ireland (probably Northern); who married William Steven/Steen, a collier, in Paisley around 1812. This raises the possibility that due to the movement of colliers back and forth between Ireland and Scotland for work, there might be a need to check Irish records as well; however these are often missing.
