Immigration Research

Contextualize

- Where does my ancestor fit into the larger history of immigration out of their home country or region?
 - FamilySearch.org wiki
 - Gale's Academic OneFile Select (available as an external database from AmericanAncestors.org)
 - Local histories

Waves of European Immigration

- Colonial (ca. 1607-1680): English; often religiously motivated
- Late-Colonial (ca. 1680-1776): Scots-Irish, German
- Nineteenth century (ca. 1820-1890): Irish; industrial revolution
- Turn of the twentieth century (ca. 1890-1924): Eastern & Southern European

Motivation

- Involuntary: enslaved persons; prisoners of war; forced expulsion...
- Economic: inability to provide for family; limited access to income, property...
- Military: escape conscription; flee war-torn areas; foreign service (ex. Hessians)
- Religious: escape persecution
- Temporary: esp. 1890-1924, not intended as permanent; remittances

Major Sources for Immigrant Origins

Colonial Period

- Passenger lists (fragmentary)
- Court records
- Indentures (Southern)

19th-20th Cent.

- Passenger lists
- Naturalization records
- Vital records
- Religious records

Cluster Research for Immigrant Origins

- Assume: Amongst an immigrant ancestor's *friends, associates, and neighbors* are individuals with a shared origin
- Hypothesize: If a preponderance of cluster members are from X, then my ancestor is likely from X as well
- Confirm: Do the records from X support my conclusion?

Why Cluster Research?

- Ancestor immigrated prior to detailed passenger and naturalization records
- Sources identify only the country of origin, not the county, town, village, etc.
- Distinguish between individuals and places of the same name

Why Cluster Research?

- Record loss in origin country
- Place name on record corrupted or indecipherable
- Female immigrant ancestors: men more often found in immigration sources


Chain Migration

Chain Migration

- Definition: the process by which immigrants from a particular area follow others from that area to a particular destination
- Highly unlikely that your ancestor was the first from his/her town or family to immigrate
- Supposes that families with similar cultures, dialects and origins settled near each other and formed diasporic communities

Chain Migration

- Opportunities, transportation, accommodation (passage 'paid by' on passenger lists)
- Bulwark against discrimination
- Resources to aid in settlement and assimilation





THE WELSH PROGENITORS OF THE MERRICK FAMILY IN AMERICA.

That the Merricks of America are descended from the purest Celtic stock, is established upon the best of authorities, to-wit, Burke's Peerage. Without attempting to refer to the original authorities from which the editors of the "Peerage" compile their family histories, an impossibility to any one not acquainted with the ancient Welsh language, and not in touch with the British Museum with its wealth of historical data, we may assume that whatever bears the imprint of "Burke" is historically correct. It is the accepted authority in all matters relating to the ancient families of Great Britain. We shall therefore content ourselves with quoting from "Burke's Peerage," edition of 1887, page 946, *et seq.*, as follows:

"The Meyricks are of the purest and noblest Cambrian blood, and have possessed the same ancestral estate and residence at Bodorgan, Anglesey, Wales, without interruption above a thousand years. They have the rare distinction of being lineally descended both from the sovereign Princes of Wales of the Welsh royal family, and from King Edward I., whose eldest son was the first Prince of Wales of the English royal family.

CADVAN (Catamanus), descended from a long line of regal ancestors, was King of North Wales at the end of the 6th century, and had his palace at Aberffraw. He fought at Bangor Iscoed, and is supposed to have been killed there, and buried at Bardsey. His grandson—

KING CADWALADR, a chivalrous and illustrious Prince, founded the church of Llangwaladr, A. D. 650—the parish church of Bodorgan, which is still the family seat, near Aberffraw, which became a sanctuary. He removed thither the remains of King Cadvan, which were re-buried in a stone coffin. The lid of the coffin with the following original description, still legible, is now affixed to the wall inside the church.—"*Catamanus Rex, sapientissimus, opinatissimus omnium Regum;*" *i. e.*



dwyer households in mid-nineteenth century Ireland




Household numbers by county in Griffith's (1847-64), as on the map






