Immigration in the 20th Century

- By the 1900s, immigration was running at an all-time high
- Ellis Island was a major entry point for immigrants
- The influx of those who looked and dressed differently from the Anglo-Saxons was beginning to cause concerns among some
- Settlement patterns were suggesting a sense of isolation among certain ethnicities

Why Head to America?

- Unskilled laborers could find many types of jobs in a growing urban community
- Abject poverty in certain countries
- Chain migration of families
- Improved methods of travel, faster ships
- Pogroms against the Jewish continued to escalate

- Newspaper articles
- Promotional brochures
- Steamship lines & their advertisements
- Railway lines & their advertisements

“New” Immigrants

- Appeared less likely to assimilate into American life, preferring to congregate together apart from others in America
- Came from southern and eastern Europe with new religions, manners, style of dress
- Unskilled men who often came, not to settle, but to work a few months to make money
- Concentrated in industrial centers

Ellis Island Reopens

MOVING TO ELLIS ISLAND.

Work of Transferring the Immigration Station From Barge Office Begun Yesterday.

The transfer of the immigration station from the Barge Office to Ellis Island commenced in earnest at noon yesterday. The work will be continued to-day and it is hoped to have all the various divisions of the immigration service ready for business at 9 o'clock on Monday morning.

Commissioner Fitchie received several calls from social and political friends, who congratulated him on getting into better quarters. The customs department and the medical department will be transferred to-day. The money changing department, in charge of Mr. Scully, and the railroad department, in charge of Mr. Faulkner, was moved last night. The Ellis Island ferryboat John G. Carlisle, Captain Anthony Arena, went into commission at 9 o'clock yesterday morning and will ply between Ellis Island and the Thirty-ninth street ferry slip, at the foot of Whitehall street, making fourteen trips a day, leaving Ellis Island at 6:20 A. M. on her first trip and leaving the foot of Whitehall street on her last trip at 6:55 P. M.

Passenger Examination

Unacceptable

- *If on such examination there shall be found among such passengers any convict, lunatic, idiot, or any person unable to take care of him or herself without becoming a public charge, they shall report the same in writing to the collector of such port, and such person shall not be permitted to land.”*

Additional Exclusions

- To avoid health epidemics
- To prevent anarchy
- To prevent the undermining of the American “way of life”
- To protect immigrants from forced labor

Immigrant Inspection

- 1st and 2nd class passengers were inspected on board the ship
- 3rd class, “Steerage,” were transferred from the ship to an immigrant inspection station
- Notations made on passenger lists

6-Second Exam

- Doctors at Ellis Island would examine newly arrived immigrants as they walked up stairs, etc.
- Chalk marks identified possible problems requiring additional examination.






Immigrant Restriction League

- Founded in 1894 in Boston by Charles Warren, Robert DeCourcy Ward, and Prescott F. Hall
- All three were Boston Brahmin Harvard alumni of the class of 1889
- Warren & DeCourcy Ward were Mayflower descendants while Hall's ancestors arrived from England in the 1600s
- Believed that immigrants from southern and eastern Europe were ethnically inferior to Anglo-Saxons

Prescott F. Hall

- 27 Sep 1868 – 28 May 1921
- Also served as general secretary of the National Association of Immigration Restriction Leagues
- The IRL disbanded after his death

Beginning of Quota System

- Act of May 19, 1921
- Set the annual quota for each nationality group at 3% of the number of foreign-born persons of that national origin as enumerated in the 1910 census
- Asiatic barred zone immigrants still denied
- Exempted certain classes of alien

National Quota Act of 1924

- Heavily weighted to limit the southern and eastern Europeans from gaining entry
- The “national origins” system became fully operational in 1929
- Capped total immigration outside of Western Hemisphere to 150,000
- Averaged out to 5 northwestern Europeans to 1 southeastern European

The following list of over 1380 organizations includes all landsmanshaftn listed in *A Guide to YIVO's Landsmanshaftn Archive* by Rosaline Schwartz and Susan Milamed, YIVO Institute for Jewish Research, New York, 1986, and *Guide to the YIVO Archives*, compiled and edited by Fruma Mohrer and Marek Web, YIVO Institute for Jewish Research, 1998. The list also includes the additional landsmanshaftn collections that YIVO has acquired since then that have been catalogued. Several synagogues and other Jewish organizations are also included if their YIVO file contains records pertaining to burials or if they have a cemetery plot in the New York metropolitan area. We have indicated on this list whether or not an organization contains a cemetery plot map, but you may also see [The JGSNY Burial Society Database Project](#) for a separate listing of burial societies in YIVO's landsmanshaftn collection that contain one or more plot maps. (Many thanks to Jerry Seligsohn for alerting us to these).

Some of the files in YIVO's landsmanshaftn collection that do not contain cemetery plot maps may contain other death-related records, such as burial permits and death certificates. Examples: Bogopoler Unt. Verein contains two books of stubs from the burial permits. The stubs include the name of the deceased and the name of the cemetery in which they were buried. The Bronx Bakers Mutual Aid Association and the Brotherhood of Israel have copies of members' death certificates (sometimes for their wives also). The Mutual Benefit Society of 1865, Inc. (Hungarian Society) has files of family members with family data on the file cover and often death certificates in the file.

How to Site See

Local history research seeks information about a place, the way genealogy research pursues information about a person. It is a common subject at the reference desk in the Milstein Division of US History, Local History, and Genealogy: "I want to know more about my building," or "What was the neighborhood like back in the day?" Constructing the reality of a historic neighborhood is analogous to Jurassic scientists recreating the living image of a brontosaurus using only the record left by fossils.

The subject of this research guide is "site research," which encompasses both individual building research, and researching a neighborhood, area, locale or region - any physical spot on a map within fixed boundaries. Some resources are specific to what kinds of information a researcher may be looking for - like an address directory for researching a building, or a local history monograph about a neighborhood - and some resources are useful in general, like image collections and newspapers. Yet, essentially, anything can count as a resource for local history: a matchbook, business card, advertisement, vintage dress label, old beer can - anything that yields dimension for a time and a place. Research methods demand an open mind. If you gain an iota of knowledge or insight, if there is a turn in your perception, a new ray of light on the past, no matter how faint, then that resource belongs in your [bibliography](#) (which this librarian vouches is allowed to include materials other than books and still sustain its original meaning).


