Essay Question

Select and research a story from your family history. What have you learned about yourself, a community, and the nation from this story?

- Grades 7-8: 750 words
- Grades 9-12: 1,000 words

- Number all pages
- Double-spaced
- 12 pt Times New Roman
- 1-inch margins on all sides
- Submission file must be a PDF
