<p>94 The Great Migration</p> <p>13 November 1669 [TAG 16.26, citing Millford Church Records, p. 1].</p> <p>CHILDREN:</p> <p>With first wife</p> <p>I SAMUEL, by Little Hadham, Hertfordshire, 19 December 1636, no further record.</p> <p>With second wife</p> <p>II HANNAH, b. say 1636; m. (1) by 1653 Stephen Freeman [Parke-Giddensleeve 69, citing Millford church records in which Hannah is called "wife of brother Stephen Freeman and daughter of Capt. Astwood's] m. (2) after 1675 Robert Porter [Parke-Giddensleeve 69, citing Millford LR 1.336, 3.7 (correct date for which is 23 November 1683)] m. (3) after 1689 [John?] Clark (on 10 March 1693) Hannah Clark is called "now widow formerly the wife of Robert Porter" [Millrod LR 3:97].</p> <p>ASSOCIATIONS: Brother James Astwood came a few years later and settled in Roxbury, having a 1663 will bequeathing £5 to "brother John Astwood" [BFR Case # 132].</p> <p>On the same day and in the same parish, John Astwood married Deis Stalworth and William Fowler married Grace Stalworth. Astwood and Fowler were long associated in New England, and it is apparent that Parke and Jackson, who noted this pairing of familiar names, but denied they were the New England immigrants, did not see the baptism of Astwood's son Samuel on the burial of his first wife Dina in Little Hadham [Parke-Giddensleeve 71].</p> <p>COMMENTS: On 3 April 1635, "Husbandman [o] Astwood," aged 26, was enrolled at London on the <i>Haywell</i> as a passenger for New England [Boston 46]. Enrolled at the same time were "Jo. Raughe," aged 30; "Martha Carter," aged 27, and "Marie Elliott," aged 13 [Fotter 46]. "Captain Ashwood" performed the marriage between Joseph Pecke and Widow Burritt at Millford 12 September 1658 and was still performing marriages in 1662 [NHVR 12, 10].</p> <p>On 7 July 1655, Susan Clarke, daughter of James, charged Ellis Mew with indecent assault. During the course of the case, Susan's mother stated "that the girl should have gone to Millford to dwell with Capt. Astwood," but her good disposition had caused John Jones to keep her in his service instead [NHTR 1:182-83]. It is probable that John Astwood was still in Connecticut at this date. It seems likely that he went to England,</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">John Astwood 95</p> <p>planning to return after a brief visit, since he calls himself of Millford in his will, implying he had not changed his residence to "Boston."</p> <p>BIBLIOGRAPHIC NOTE: In 1939 Nathan Cozer Parke and Donald Lane Jacobs compiled a brief account of the family of John Astwood [Parke-Giddensleeve 71-72].</p> <p style="text-align: center;">JOHN ATHERSON</p> <p>"[he] Atherson" was enrolled on 18 April 1655 at London as a passenger for New England on the <i>Susan d'Alon</i> [Hoxton 61].</p> <p>COMMENTS: Not seen in any New England record.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">THEODORE ATKINSON</p> <p>ORIGIN: Unknown</p> <p>REGISTRATION: 1634</p> <p>FIRST RESIDENCE: Boston</p> <p>OCCUPATION: Feltmaker, hatter, beavermaker [SLR 6:337-38]. On 17 December 1652, Theodore Atkinson recorded a number of legal documents, including deeds and debt instruments, most of which were probably related to his business activities. In one of these records, on 7 October 1652, Thomas Wolster, master of the good ship called the <i>Mayflower</i> ... now riding at anchor in the river at Boston" sold to "Theodore Atkinson of Boston feltmaker" one-sixteenth of the ship and its furnishings [SLR 1:258-99].</p> <p>CHURCH MEMBERSHIP: "Theodorus Atkinson servant to our brother John Newgate" was admitted to Boston church on 11 January 1649/5 [BCMR 39].</p> <p>FREEDMAN: 19 May 1642 [MBCR 2:291].</p> <p>EDUCATION: Signed his deeds.</p> <p>OFFICES: Boston constable, 12 March 1649 [BTR 1:94]. Clerk of the market, 12 March 1645 [BTR 1:122].</p> <p>ESTATE: On 31 August 1640, "Theodorus Atkinson is granted his Great Lot, for two heads at Middle River, if it be there to be had after others are served that had their grants before him" [BTR 1:55].</p>

Nathan Snow moved to Cummington about 1778. The 1790 census of Cummington lists Nathan Snow, Nathan Snow Jr., and Jacob Snow. On 1 June 1798, ack. 1 Aug. 1803, Nathan Snow of Cummington, gentleman, with the assent of his wife Mary, sold 3 acres in Cummington to Beriah Shaw. No Hampshire Co. PR for Nathan Snow.
