
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The Scots in Ulster

- Some Scots received lands from James I
- Lands in 6 “escheated counties” formed part of the Plantation
- 9 precincts set aside for Scottish grantees
- 81,000 acres were granted to Scots
- 59 Scottish undertakers




THE HAMILTON & MONTGOMERY LANDS, CIRCA 1606.

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

Landed Estates

What are landed estates?

- Begun with the 17th century Plantation of Ulster
- Cromwellian Restoration and Williamite land settlements continued the practice
- System in which a single individual holds title to the lands ranging from 1,000 acres to 100,000 acres and leases to farmers and other tenants
- In effect until the late 1800s, early 1900s when Acts of Parliament broke them up

Landed Estates

- Owners of the larger estates (upwards of 100,000 acres) were usually members of the aristocracy who may have had several estates in Ireland and Britain
- Smaller estates of 1,000 to 3,000 acres were often owned by more modest farmers and the records may not survive
- Almost all landowners were members of the Church of Ireland

Landowners


- Entered into leases with individuals/tenants
- May have used agents/middlemen to handle the leases

Lessee/Tenant

- Entered into lease with landowner
- Had to pay set rents – 2x a year
- May have had a specific number of years on the lease
- May have then rented some of their land to sub-tenants or cottiers

Estate Records

What are estate records?

- Documents generated by administration of landed estates
- Prior to 20th c. majority land owned by large and small estates
- Landowner was a member of nobility, landed gentry or Church of Ireland clergy
- Land could be held by others such as the London guilds and various companies

Estate records

Strengths

- Excellent resource for 18th c. and early 19th c. ancestors
- Useful source for searching poor ancestors
- One of the few record sets that may survive in an area where church records start late

Weaknesses

- Most rental and tenant's lists document only major tenants
- Limited time periods
- Not all areas of Ireland had large landed estates
- Some records destroyed or still in private hands





Anatomy of a Lease

- Name of the lessor (the landowner)
- Name of the lessee (the tenant)
- Location of the farm
- Rent to be paid
- Tenure of the lease
- Conditions required of the lessee




3 Nov 1807 Lease – Lessee




3 Nov 180 Lease – Location of Land

6. Landed estate records

Until the beginning of the twentieth century the most important unit of land organisation in Ireland was the estate. Very few farmers owned their farms outright, but rather leased them from a landlord.

The early seventeenth-century Plantation of Ulster, followed by the Cromwellian, Restoration and Williamite land settlements of the 1650s through to the beginning of the eighteenth century all contributed to the evolution of the landed estate system. It was not until the passing of a series of acts of parliament in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries that these estates were broken up and an owner-occupier class of farmers was created.

6.1 Landed estates in Ulster

Landed estates in Ulster ranged in size from over 100,000 acres to under 1,000. There were thus considerable variations in the wealth and lifestyles of landowners, and to regard them as forming a single homogeneous group would be wrong. The owners of the largest estates were usually titled aristocrats and often owned properties in several parts of Ireland and in Britain. Their homes were generally built on a grand scale and were set within extensive demesnes. They exerted considerable control over representative politics in their respective counties. The smaller landowners, on the other hand, lived more modestly and in many cases were on the same level as many of the more substantial tenant farmers. One thing that most landowners shared was membership of the Church of Ireland. Only a small number of landed proprietors were Presbyterians, and even fewer were Roman Catholics.

Those in outright ownership of a landed estate could either manage it directly, with the assistance of agents, or they could lease the estate in its entirety to an intermediary known as a middleman. In these circumstances the tenant farmers held their farms from the middleman rather than from
