

This collection represents several generations of the Grosvenor and Thompson families and reflects life in both the Boston, Massachusetts, and Pomfret, Connecticut, areas. Account books belonging to Lemuel Putnam Grosvenor contain both personal accounts and records from Hingham Umbrella Manufactory in the Boston area. There are numerous diaries, including travel diaries kept by Charles O. Thompson and by Clara Grosvenor Thompson. Clara Thompson also recorded her conversion to the Catholic faith in a diary. Elizabeth Thompson also kept diaries, and other volumes include lectures notes taken by Ebenezer Thompson while a student at Brown University in the late 1860s. Ebenezer would become an ordained preacher, and held pulpits throughout the Midwestern United States. Correspondence sent back East documents his locations. The family correspondence begins with letters between Clarisa Downes and Lemuel Putnam Grosvenor prior to their marriage. The most recent letter was sent to Elizabeth ...

The collection consists of correspondence, printed materials, and clippings. The correspondence by John Fulton and others includes letters on organizing the program for the dedication, hundreds of handwritten and typed RSVPs to the Dean of the School of Medicine, Francis G. Blake, accepting the invitation or declining, and letters of congratulation after the ceremony. The printed materials include pamphlets while the library was being constructed, the invitation to the dedication, a map of the library and the exhibits on display, the "Blessing of the Books" by the Reverend George Stewart, reprints of the speeches, and an illustrated reprint on the architecture of the library. Clippings include articles from the New York Times, the New Haven Register, other newspapers, and journals

The collection consists of correspondence, data forms, name indexes, and pedigree charts related to William Woodbridge Rodman's work on the genealogy of the Pomeroy family, much of which was arranged in a series of scrapbooks. Also present is correspondence of Rodman's sister-in-law Rebekah Pomeroy Bulkley, who continued the genealogical work after his death

William Woodbridge Rodman was born on April 1, 1817, in Stonington, Connecticut, the son of William Woodbridge Rodman (1789-1854) and Lucy Sheldon Woodbridge Rodman (1794-1865). He graduated from Yale College in 1838 and from Jefferson Medical College in 1844, after which he opened a medical practice in Waterbury, Connecticut. On November 26, 1844, Rodman married Jerusha Pomeroy (1820-1871), the daughter of Benjamin and Jerusha Williams Pomeroy of Stonington, Connecticut, and on December 26, 1872, married her sister, Anna Grosvenor Pomeroy (1840-1919). William Rodman moved his medical practice to New Haven, Connecticut, in 1860; he died in New Haven on March 30, 1900






