On August 15, 1892 Cora J. Huber contracted with Milligan to purchase a lot on Dillon Avenue (now South Lane). It was listed as Lot 22 in Walkers Sunnyside Addition of Irvington. According to the agreement, he the money to have a house built on the lot and she was both the house and the lot. It was a lovely nine-room parlor, sitting room, dining room and kitchen. All were as was the custom at that time. A small room that could from the kitchen completed the downstairs. The stairs were off the sitting room. There were three large one small one upstairs. The family must have moved in as payments were to start when the house was finished a payment is dated December 1, 1892. The house is still and has been made into a duplex. The present address is 144 South Hawthorne Lane. The parlor windows, which were set with a border of stained glass around the edges, are now windows closed. A second porch on the south side has been The stairs now go up from the new porch entrance.

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Following the death of her husband, Mary C. Huber filed for a pension under the widows with minor children act. She received twelve dollars per month starting August 18, 1894 and also two dollars each for her two minor children, Charles D. and Myrtle E. until they were 16 years old. The other daughter at home, Cora, who had bought the house, worked as a seamstress at the shirt factory and helped the family. On December 17, 1897 she decided half of the value of the house to her mother provided she would pay one half of the balance of the contract. She was planning to be married and was married on February 23, 1898 to Edward Ruschaupt. Just one month later the youngest child Myrtle E. was married to John Hunter on March 27, 1898. Then on August 30, 1899 Charles D. was married to Cora Urbesall. That left the mother, Mary, alone. As she was near Butler College, she took in a young college man as a boarder. Later she had a smaller home built next door. She moved into it and rented the big house. The family always designated the homes as "the big house" and "the little house." She continued to take in roomers to supplement her small pension until her health failed in 1908. She died on March 24, 1909 at the home of her eldest daughter and son-in-law, George and Barbara Bruckman, on East Raymond Street and is buried with her husband in the Anderson Cemetery on East Tenth Street in Warren Township, Marion County, Indiana.

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## Story Sample

After her husband died and her children moved into their own households, Mary kept the house at the corner of Commercial and Washington Avenues in Irvington until the end of the decade.<sup>412</sup> Family stories claimed that when her daughter Cora married (in 1897), Mary took on half the ownership of the lot on Dillon Avenue that Cora had purchased back in 1892. 
