Stephen Hopkins is a valuable part of American history, as well as my own.

Stephen Hopkins's feat starts with the Sea Venture. The Sea Venture was one in a fleet of nine ships to travel to a colony in North America. The Sea Venture was the largest ship in that group, and left England in 1609. On the sea venture, Stephen Hopkins served as an assistant to Reverend Richard Bucke. The Sea Venture took off from London and traveled to Virginia, my home state. However, the ship was severely damaged off the east coast of Bermuda when they encountered a hurricane. The crew managed to make it to an island. On the island, Hopkins was a part of a small group of people who would do anything to get off this island and continue their journey. Two men claimed that Hopkins had encouraged them to disobey the captain, as such, Hopkins and his group did get arrested for rebellion. This was punishable by being hanged. Hopkins pleaded to be set free, and he and his party were pardoned soon after.

Stephen Hopkins and the people on the island were eventually rescued and returned to England. Later, he boarded the Mayflower, possibly convinced by his business acquaintances,

the Separatists. The Mayflower was one of the London Company merchant fleets where One hundred and two people, including Stephen Hopkins, boarded. During the first winter nearly half of the crew died, but Hopkins survived those brutal times. During his journey, Hopkins signed the Mayflower Compact. This is the first form of a government of people, by the people, for the people. Eventually they landed in Plymouth, New England, where Hopkins became one of the wealthiest people among the colonists.

Stephen Hopkins did have an exciting life in America. Hopkins built the first wharf in Plymouth, and he was a member of the governor's council. Hopkins became friends with a Native American, whom he entertained in his home.

Stephen Hopkins shows us how to be part of a community. Hopkins was a good member of their community by getting along with Native Americans and quickly grasping their ways and language. He appears to have run a general store, which provided supplies to everyone in need. He also contributed to the community by building houses. Hopkins fulfilled his role as a citizen and shows us nowadays what we can do to help out our community.
