

**RHODE ISLAND QUARTERLY MEETING (P/G/U)**  
(Rhode Island, Massachusetts and briefly New Hampshire)

Rhode Island was the first Quarterly Meeting in the present New England Yearly Meeting, and began meeting for business in 1699. Smithfield Quarterly Meeting was set off in 1801. Narragansett Quarterly Meeting was absorbed in 1951. Smithfield merged with Rhode Island in 1971, and the name was changed to Rhode Island - Smithfield Quarterly Meeting.

## Overview

In 1661, less than a decade after the first Friends arrived in British North America, the precursor to the New England Yearly Meeting was organized as the Rhode Island Yearly Meeting. As one of approximately two dozen yearly meetings in the United States, the NEYM currently comprises eight quarterly meetings and approximately 85 monthlies, which are the basic unit of organization for the Society. Like many Yearly meetings, the NEYM has been diverse in spiritual practice, reflected in a history of separations and reunions. Most famously, Orthodox Friends in New England divided in the 1840s into the increasingly evangelically-oriented Gurneyites, who went by the name Yearly Meeting of Friends for New England (joining Friends United Meeting in 1902), and the Wilburites, sometimes called Conservative Friends. In 1945, the disparate branches formally reunited.

Consolidated beginning in the 1960s, the NEYM collection contains the official records of the New England Yearly Meeting from its founding in the seventeenth century to the present, along with

Henry Benedict, a minor having gone to reside within the limits of Smithfield Monthly Meeting, Aaron Benedict and Daniel Benedict are appointed to prepare a certificate for him and produce to next meeting.

The Women's meeting now sitting informs that it has come to the conclusion to disown Rachel Redfern - formerly Gregg, for outgiving in marriage, and identifying herself with the followers of Elias Hicks, which this meeting concurs in, and appoints David Osborn and Reuben Wood to prepare a testimony of denial against her and produce to next meeting.

The friends appointed to forward our proposition of the Yearly Meeting's stock, reports the service performed. The meeting now concludes.

Alton Creek Monthly Meeting held 26<sup>th</sup> of June 1835.  
 James Vernon and Rachel Wood appear in this meeting and

 declared the continuance of their intentions of marriage with each other, consent of parents being had, and he having produced a minute from Commerce monthly meeting, expressive of his cleanness to proceed, therefore they are therefore left at liberty to accomplish their marriage observing the order of discipline. Aaron S. Benedict and William Gialby are appointed to attend and see that good order be observed, hand the marriage certificate to the recorder and report to next meeting.
