





Geographic Hot Spots

- Generations 1-5 (1600s to 1740s) :
 - Plymouth County, MA
 - Barnstable County, MA
 - New London, CT
 - Rhode Island (Little Compton area)
 - Coastal Maine

Geographic Hot Spots

- Generations 6-10 (1750s-1880s)
 - Western Massachusetts
 - Midwest States (Ohio, Illinois, Wisconsin, Michigan, Indiana)
 - New York State (not NYC)
 - Vermont and Maine
 - Nova Scotia and New Brunswick

Geographic Hot Spots

- Generations 11-15 (1880s-present)
 - Less dependent on geography, as these generations tend to cast a wider geographic net

Cold Spots for Mayflower ***(Generations 1-5)***

- Essex County, Massachusetts
- Quebec and Pacific Canada
- Hartford, New Haven and Fairfield, Connecticut
- Providence, Rhode Island
- Mid-Atlantic (small contingent in Long Island)
- Southern States


General Considerations

- Migrants usually followed an east-to-west path
- Tended to move from populated areas to less densely settled areas
- Major period of migration was about 1790-1880
- Disconnect in record-linkage because of migration, poor record-keeping
- Was your ancestor REALLY from New England?

Example of Ancestral Migration Trails from NEHGS Staff





Verified vs. Documented

Verified:

- You will have verified the line when you locate at least one document (preferably and original document) that connects each generation back to the *Mayflower* passenger
- Creates the skeleton of your *Mayflower* line


Documented:

- You will have located documents for each individual in a generation (both the blood line and the spouse) using original documentation for every vital event
- Includes creation of a qualification outline

Vital Records

- Often provide the names of the individual's parents and/or spouse
- Depending on the state, records may be held on the state, county, and/or town/city level
- Privacy restrictions may limit access
- Certified vs. genealogical or informational copies

six years Mrs. Stilson was released, but the children were kept in captivity nearly six years longer.

On the 30th March, 1696, Mrs. Stilson m. Thomas Pitman, of Marblehead, who died in 1736, aged 94. His widow, Margaret, who was a dau. of Alexander Gould, of New Harbor, d. in 1750, aged 92.

In 1747, Capt. Amos Hilton, son of William 3d, and the crew of his schooner, who had landed on the coast of Maine, were killed by the Indians.

WILLIAM HILTON 3d lived and had lands at York and also at Manchester, Mass., where he lived in 1714. He was extensively engaged in the coasting trade and in the fisheries; he made great improvements on his lands, and owned large stocks of cattle. He d. 21st June, 1723, aged 44. On 8th Dec., 1727, his widow m. John Allen, of Manchester, who d. in 1737, and his widow d. at Manchester in Nov. 1763, aged 84 years.

Stilson Hilton d. c. 1741, and on the 7th Jany., 1762, his widow m. Richard Day. Amos Hilton, son of Stilson, was Capt. Amos Hilton 1st, of Yarmouth.

In 1765, CAPT. AMOS HILTON removed with his family from Manchester, Mass., to Yarmouth, and settled upon what was afterwards called "Hilton's Head," on the southern side of Kelley's Cove, and in 1767, when the township lands were divided, he received 1 1/2 shares, 1406 acres. He took an active interest in the shipping

of the port, and owned, either wholly or in partnership with his sons, nine schooners, besides smaller craft. Capt. Amos Hilton has had 96 grandchildren--51 grandsons and 45 granddaughters--a goodly group for a photographer; and among his descendants bearing the family name there have been 35, and probably more, master mariners.

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
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292. **Ruth⁵ Freeman** (*Edmund Freeman⁴, Mercy Prence³, Patience² Brewster, William¹*) was born, place and date undocumented, probably in Eastham, Mass., before 3 December 1686, when she was mentioned in the will of her grandfather, and possibly before 1681, the (unsupported) date of her father's second marriage,¹ the daughter of Edmund and his first wife, Ruth (Merrick) Freeman. Ruth died in Eastham, Friday, 7 June 1728.²

Ruth married, place and date undetermined about 1700 (calculated from birth of first child), **Israel Doan/Doane**,³ who was born, place and date undocumented, probably in Eastham, about 1672,⁴ the son of Daniel Doane and his first wife, whose name is not

EDMUND FREEMAN, son of John and Mercy³ (Prence, *Patience*² *Brewster*, *William*¹) Freeman, born in Eastham in June 1657^[1528] and died probably in Eastham before 25 February 1717/8.^[1529] Edmund's gravestone reads: "Here Lyes y^e Body / of Lieu^t Edmond / Freeman Dec^d Feb^{ry} / y^e 11th 1718/9 in y^e / 63^d year of his age," but this is in conflict with the probate of his estate.^[1530] An undocumented source said he died on 10 December 1717.^[1531]

Edmund married first RUTH MERRICK likely in Eastham.^[1532] Ruth, daughter of William and Rebecca (?Tracy) Merrick,^[1533] was born in Eastham on 15 May 1652^[1534] died probably in Eastham before 3 December 1686.^[1535]


Edmund married second SARAH MAYO.^[1536] Sarah, daughter of Samuel and Thomasine (Lumpkin) Mayo,^[1537] was born in Boston on 19 December 1660^[1538] and died probably in Eastham between 26 March 1736/7 and 5 March 1745/6.^[1539]

In his will dated 3 December 1686 and proved on 6 March 1688/9, Ens. William Merrick Sr. of Eastham named his grandchild Ruth Freeman and so proved Edmund's first marriage.^[1540] John Sunderland, the second husband of Sarah Mayo's mother, wrote his will on 27 September 1700 and proved on 4 April 1704 where he called Sarah Freeman the daughter of his wife and so proved Edmund's second marriage by inference.^[1541]

Edmund served as a selectman in Eastham, residing in the section called


1. **WILLIAM BREWSTER**, son of William and Mary (Smythe) (Simkinson) Brewster, was born probably in or near Scrooby, Nottinghamshire, Eng., between June 1566 and June 1567^[1] and died in Duxbury on 10 April 1644, about 9 or 10 o'clock that evening.^[2]

William married **MARY** _____ probably at or near Scrooby in 1592 or earlier.^[3] Mary was born probably in England between June of 1568 and 1569^[4] and died in Plymouth on 17 April 1627, one day after the birth of her first female grandchild, who was apparently named Mary to honor her.^[5]

His father, the senior William Brewster, had been appointed to the office of bailiff-receiver of Scrooby manor by Archbishop Grindal on 4 January 1575/6. In 1579, he claimed a "life tenancy" of land in Doncaster in the right of John Simkinson, the first husband of his wife.^[6]

2. *MD* 1: 7, the date of his death was entered in "The Brewster Book" by his son, Jonathan Brewster and was probably correct, especially if the entry was made close to the date of death of his father. His contemporaries, writing years after the elder's decease, gave different and inconsistent dates. *Bradford's Hist.*, 487 (hour), compiled between 23 Feb. and 23 Mar. 1650/1, stated William Brewster's death occurred "about the 18th of April 1643," and Nathaniel Morton gave the date of death as "about the 16th (not 10th or 18th) of April 1643," in *New Eng. Mem.*, 144, 432, but the year was changed to 1644 in *Ply. Ch. Rec.*, 1: 75-76. The place of burial of William Brewster is unknown, although some interpretations of the old colony records relating to the division of the Elder's estate, suggest that he might have been buried on Burial Hill or Cole's Hill in Plymouth, near the unmarked grave of his deceased wife, due to the fact that following the burial of their father, Jonathan and Love Brewster returned to the house of Mr. William Bradford in Plymouth to make agreement concerning division of the Elder's estate. This was done in the presence of Mr. Ralph Partridge, pastor of Duxbury, Mr. John Raynor, teacher of the church at Plymouth and Edward Buckley, pastor of the church at Marshfield. It is probable that, had Elder Brewster been buried in his home town of Duxbury (incorporated as a town in 1637), where he resided, they would have probably gathered at the Elder's late residence after the funeral, instead of in Bradford's Plymouth home; *NEHGR*, 18: 18-20 (explanation for year); *Davis*, 131 (reputed place of burial).
3. *MD*, 1: 7, calculated from the known birth date of his son Jonathan who has been identified as their first child.

5. *MD*, 1: 7; *Dexter*, 606; *MQ* 34:43. Her place of burial is unknown due to the fact that at the time of her death there was no known burial ground specifically set aside for a cemetery. Fortunately, her date of death was recorded in *The Brewster Book* in the handwriting of her son, Jonathan Brewster, as there is no other record of her demise. In 1967, a centograph of light gray Barre granite was placed at the foot of Burial Hill in Plymouth, near the street, in memory of both Elder and Mrs. Brewster, to inform the public that they rest in unknown graves.
