




- 1900 – NJ ranked 16th
- 1900-1930 - population more than doubled
- 1910-2000 – smallest increases in 1930s and 1970s, highest in 1920s and 1950s
- 2000 – NJ ranked 10th; most densely-populated















The petition of Isaac Feldbain, hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is Woodbury, STATE OF NEW JERSEY.

Second. My occupation is Tailor.

Third. I was born on the 25th day of October, anno Domini 1897, at Radomsk, Russia.

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Philadelphia, Pa., on or about the 11th day of January, anno Domini 1910, and arrived in the United States, at the port of Philadelphia, Pa., on the 11th day of January, anno Domini 1910, on the vessel Frisland.

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 12th day of August, anno Domini 1912, at Cape May Court House, in the Common Pleas Court of Cape May County.

Sixth. I am married. My wife's name is Sadona, she was born on the 12th day of August, anno Domini 1893, at Woodbury, N. J.

I have 2 children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:
Joseph Feldbain, Dec. 28, 1915, Woodbury, N. J.
Sylvia Miriam Feldbain, Apr. 25, 1918, Philadelphia, Pa.

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to the Great Government of Russia, of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 11th day of January, anno Domini 1910, and in the STATE OF NEW JERSEY continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 11th day of January, anno Domini 1910, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. I made petition for citizenship to the Court of ... and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit, ... and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.

I attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.

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



1901-1903

In 2016, the non-profit organization Reclaim The Records obtained microfilm copies of the data for these years from the New Jersey State Archives in Trenton, and the non-profit organization FamilySearch donated the microfilm digitization equipment and labor, thereby creating the first-ever digital copies.

The information provided by these early years of the death index is very basic. However, **1902 is the only year of the index that provides information as to the race of the deceased person**, denoting every African-American with the notation "(B)" (for "Black"). No other racial categories are noted and no other years of the state index do this.

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1920-1929

These records were obtained from the New Jersey Department of Health under an Open Public Records Act (OPRA) request. The death index for the 1920's is unusual in that the records are grouped in five-year periods, 1920-1924 and 1925-1929. Within each grouping, they are then **separated out by locality name, such as county or major city**. Within each locality, they are broken down by year, as represented by the single final digit of the year, such as "4" for 1924. And finally, within each of those years inside each of those localities, the records are then listed alphabetically by surname.

Note that **half of the 1920-1924 index is missing**, as the New Jersey Department of Health could not locate their own copy of the information. A copy of the missing document is being sought from the reference microfilms at the New Jersey State Archives and if found, will be digitized and put online, probably by the end of 2018.



- **Certifications** are issued on plain paper with no seal and clearly indicate they are not valid for establishing identity or for legal purposes. Certifications are generally useful for genealogy. Certifications of death records do not contain the Social Security Number or the Cause of Death medical terminology.
- **Apostille Seal** – An Apostille Seal is an additional seal required for certain certified records that will be presented to a foreign government that is a member of the Hague Treaty. The seal is often required on documents for international adoptions or establishing dual citizenship. Contact the consulate of the country involved to determine if you need an Apostille Seal.

To get an Apostille Seal, first obtain a certified copy of the vital record from the State Office of Vital Statistics and Registry by checking the Apostille Seal box on the application. - **Certifications** are issued on plain paper with no seal and clearly indicate they are not valid for establishing identity or for legal purposes. Certifications are generally useful for genealogy. Certifications of death records do not contain the Social Security Number or the Cause of Death medical terminology.
- **Apostille Seal** – An Apostille Seal is an additional seal required for certain certified records that will be presented to a foreign government that is a member of the Hague Treaty. The seal is often required on documents for international adoptions or establishing dual citizenship. Contact the consulate of the country involved to determine if you need an Apostille Seal.

To get an Apostille Seal, first obtain a certified copy of the vital record from the State Office of Vital Statistics and Registry by checking the Apostille Seal box on the application. You will receive a certified copy of the vital record issued by the State Office of Vital Statistics and Registry. **You must forward this document to the [New Jersey Department of Treasury](http://www.state.nj.us/treasury/revenue/apostilles.shtml), which issues the Apostille Seal.** Additional information is available at: <http://www.state.nj.us/treasury/revenue/apostilles.shtml>.

Applications for a certification or certified copy of a **Non-Genealogical** record **require** the applicant to provide a completed application, valid proof of identity¹, payment of the fee² and, if requesting a certified copy, proof that establishes you are:

- the subject of the record;
- the subject's parent, legal guardian or legal representative;
- the subject's spouse/civil union partner, domestic partner, child, grandchild or sibling, if of legal age;
- a state or federal agency for official purposes; or
- requesting pursuant to a court order.

To request a certified copy of a Certificate of Birth Resulting in Stillbirth, use form REG-68, which is available on the department's website at: <http://nj.gov/health/vital/registration-vital/stillbirth/>.

The State Office of Vital Statistics and Registry accepts walk-in applications at the location shown below. Office hours are 8:30 AM through 4:00 PM, Monday – Friday, excluding State holidays. There is up to a two-hour processing time and you must submit your application by 3:30 PM to obtain your certified copy the same day.

Amendments to vital record and registrations of adoptions or legitimations are not processed at the walk-in counter. These requests, along with supporting documentation and fees³, must be sent to the attention of the Record Modification Unit at the application mailing address below.

Proving relationships

How to prove relationship for non-genealogical records

If you are requesting a **certification** (an informational copy of a vital record not valid for legal purposes), you **do not** need to provide proof of relationship.

If you are looking for a **certified copy** of

- your own birth certificate and you have assumed your spouse's/civil union partner's surname
you must provide a copy of the certified copy of your marriage/civil union certificate to link the name on your current ID to the name on your birth certificate.
- your child's birth certificate
you don't need any additional documents.
- **your spouse's/civil union partner's** birth certificate
you must provide a copy of your marriage/civil union certificate.
- **your parent's or sibling's** vital record
you must provide a copy of your birth certificate.

if you have assumed your spouse's/civil union partner's last name you must also provide a copy of your marriage/civil union certificate to link the name on your current ID to the name on your birth certificate.

- **your grandparent's** vital record
you must establish that you are the person's grandchild by providing proof that links the name on your ID to the name of the grandparent.

For example, if you changed your last name after marriage/civil union and want a grandparent's vital record, you must:

1. Provide your marriage/civil union certificate to show your name at birth,
2. provide your birth certificate to identify your parent, and
3. provide the parent's birth certificate to identify the grandparent.

If you **are not** a person qualified to get a **certified copy** of a record

- but **you are helping** a person receive a certified copy of a vital record they are eligible to receive

you must show your valid ID and a notarized, written release authorizing you to get the record on that person's behalf including their proof of relationship to the subject of the record.

Dies at 89

Mrs. Whitley Saw J.C. Grow from Rural to Urban Area

Mrs. Mary Anne Whitley, 89, often gazed from the window of her second-floor apartment at 311 Liberty Ave., in Jersey City, in search of memories from a bygone era.

She remembered vividly the days when Jersey City transformed from rural farm life to the hustle and bustle of a teaming city.

She lived on Liberty Avenue 54 years. Long enough to for-

It brought to mind her children, whom she took fishing for eels, lobster, and crabs in the summer and ice boating on the river in the winter.

SHE PROBABLY thought how careful she had been—strapping the energetic youngsters to their seats so they would not stand up in the boat amidst the excitement.

Mrs. Whitley reminisced about the roomy farmhouse they lived in, now the site of Koppers Koke Co.

She remembered Hudson Boulevard, too. A busy artery now, it was then a rickety cow path.

Then her eldest son, Gilbert Jr., was killed in the Argonne Forest campaign in World War I.

Now lonely, she decided to board wayward children and others from broken homes. To feed and clothe them—at times, as many as 11—she took up crocheting and embroidery as a business and a hobby.

The generosity had to be relinquished in 1930 when she took a second husband, William Whitley.

IT WAS SOON after the wedding that she satisfied a persistent ambition—travelling.

She recalled her trips to Yellowstone Park, her vacations in New England, Canada, and Washington, D.C.

Memories of the 1950's would often come to her, too. In those years, her health faltered and she was confined to her home

... and her favorite window.

AS SHE LOOKED toward the site of that beloved farmhouse, since razed in the path of awesome industries, she remembered those cheerful moments on the Hackensack River.

Often, she raised her window to exclaim to a neighbor: "My, how things have changed!"

MRS WHITLEY UTTERED that sentence for the last time this past week. She died Friday of a heart attack.

She leaves her husband, William; a son, Harold, of Jersey City; two daughters, Mrs. Myrtle Meier of Jersey City and Mrs. Edna Hirst of Linden, one grandchild and five great-grandchildren.

The burial was yesterday from the Beddige-Seitz Funeral Home, Jersey City.

Employment Declines 4,700 in New Jersey

Non-farm employment in New Jersey declined 4,700 from mid-October to mid-November; to 1,921,200, the Department of Labor and Industry reported today.

Cutbacks due to the steel shortage more than offset employment gains resulting from the termination of strikes in the steel and related industries.

However, continued recovery in many of the industry groups resulted in an employment gain of 23,600, or 1.3 per cent over the year.

Jobs in manufacturing industries dropped 4,100 to 772,700 during the month, with 78 per cent of the losses occurring in the durable goods industries. The November total was 4,900 or 0.7 per cent above that of last year.

The durable goods industries declined 3,200 to 410,100 during the month, but, compared with last year, employment in this group increased 3,000 or 0.7 per cent.

The non-durable goods industries reported a job decrease of 900 to 362,600 during November, but a gain of 1,900 or 0.6 per cent over the year.

Employment in non-manufacturing industries declined 600 during November to 1,148,500, but increased 18,700 or 1.7 per cent over the year.

Earnings of production workers increased 36 cents to \$93.53 weekly. Over the year, weekly earnings increased \$2.81 or 3.1 per year.

UDDO & TAORMINA COMPANY OPENS VINELAND CANNERY

Tomato Paste First Made In United States In 1899 By Uddo & Taormina Co.

Tomato paste—that indispensable ingredient for spaghetti sauce and many other Italian sauces—was first manufactured in the United States by the firm of Uddo & Taormina Company, which recently established its third manufacturing plant at Chestnut avenue and East Boulevard, Vineland.

Authority for the statement is Vincent G. Taormina, general manager of the Vineland branch of the company. According to Taormina, tomato paste was made exclusively in Italy until 44 years ago, when the first Uddo & Taormina plant was established in New Orleans. The other member of the firm is Joseph Uddo, who is at the company's main office in California.

At that time another member of the firm, Rosario Raspanti, developed a process whereby tomato paste could be made in America, and it was equal in taste and quality of the imported product. Facilities for the manufacture of canned tomato products were crude in those days, but Uddo and Taormina persisted in putting quality foremost, despite handicaps experienced in manufacture.

Competition with tomato products manufactured abroad was severe, but within a comparatively short time, Uddo and Taormina were shipping more than 2000 cartons of tomato paste all over the United States. Methods of manufacture improved, and the firm found the need for expansion. They moved to Crystal Springs, Miss., where the Uddo & Taormina cannery is still in operation.

With expansion in plant facilities came an expansion in the number of products canned. At the new plant, string beans, roast green peppers and chick peas were among the items canned. The New Orleans plant was converted into a warehouse and a jobbing house was opened in the same city.

name of "Raspanti," was introduced early in the history of the company. According to Taormina, "Caponata" was first produced by Raspanti in Italy. After it gained wide popularity among gourmets there, it was manufactured in the Uddo and Taormina plants in the United States.

Its acceptance here was immediate and it is still being produced in large quantities by the company. We can testify that it is a real taste sensation since we jealously guarded a container of it ourselves for inspiration in writing this story.

Other brands marketed by the company are: Mountain Beauty, Baby Brand, Flag Brand, Giardiniera, Rosa and Bandiera. The company also cans olive oil under the Bandiera and Progresso labels.

With the outbreak of war, the firm of Uddo & Taormina turned to canning for the armed forces, for which they received a high priority on material from the government. Today the three plants are shipping about 74 per cent of their output to the armed forces or foreign countries under the Lend-Lease program.

\$100,000 Investment

The Vineland cannery, located on the site of the old Lucas Kiltone Co., was established with an investment of close to \$100,000. The building has been extensively remodeled inside and out, and provides more than 80,000 feet of floor space in its two floors. An addition is being erected behind the present plant which will measure 30 feet by 131 feet.

It is expected that 75,000 cases of tomatoes, tomato paste, peppers and eggplants will be canned at the plant during the present season. Joseph Accardo, personnel manager, places the production capacity of the plant on a favorable competitive basis with most canneries in this vicinity. Production

possibilities during the present season are limited because operation of the plant was started later in the season than most other plants.

At the present time, about 60 men and women are employed at the Vineland branch, but it is expected that that figure will jump to 150 at peak production. The plant had to be remodeled according to specifications dictated by the nature of the machinery used. Floors had to be reinforced with steel beams, and concrete bases

Rushed Building Improvements
The firm was congratulated on its ability to begin operation this season, since work on remodeling the building and installing equip-

Skilled Hands Transformed Old Building

The task of improving the former Lucas-Kiltone building into a modern food processing plant was accomplished in quick order by Vineland contractors for the Uddo and Taormina Company, at Chestnut avenue and East Boulevard.

The brick structure was improved with structural steel, repainted, and many windows added to make it a daylight plant. An addition is being built at the rear of the main building, and a loading platform was also constructed. The plant has a railroad siding to move large consignments of its products to the Army, and destined to all points in the United States.

Deficient Diets Cause Fatigue

New Jersey County Clerks and Surrogate's Records

The New Jersey County Clerks and Surrogates are Constitutional 5 year term elected offices whose record holdings (in most cases) date back to the incorporation of their county.

The County Clerk oversees elections, and retains the related records as well as land and property records, county marriages, registered businesses, and county level naturalizations.

The County Surrogate is a Clerk of New Jersey Superior Court, Chancery Division, Probate Part and Judge of the Surrogate's Court, who acts in place of the Governor for each county, overseeing the administration of estates and adoptions. The Surrogate retains the records related to these functions, including: administrations, wills, divisions of land, probate, orphan's court, and adoption records.

Note that the individual County Clerks' and Surrogates' Offices are their own unique entities, not part of the New Jersey State Library. For questions about collections, services, or copy fees, please contact the appropriate individual offices.

The New Jersey State Archives has microfilmed copies of Clerk's and Surrogate's records for in-person public use for most counties until about 1900. The county offices generally retain ownership in of the original records, and should be contacted if copies are needed for any official purpose.

Familysearch.org has begun digitizing various county records, including County Marriages and Deeds. Genealogical researchers may use this site to obtain copies for unofficial use. If copies are needed for any other reason, the owning office should be contacted. (Note: to access collections on the website, you must login with a free account.)

This database currently indexes over 74,857 land records held by the New Jersey State Archives, containing over 374,851 name entries. It references many of New Jersey's earliest extant deeds and surveys found in over 120 record books. This includes newly indexed East Jersey Survey Books L (1675-1688) and O (1670-1716), and Liber II (1670-1727; referred to as "Carteret's Conveyances"). Both proprietary filings and transactions recorded by the Provincial Secretaries of the colony and the Secretary of State are indexed here. The Archives staff continues to revise and add records to this database.

As part of the grant-funded New Jersey Early Land Records Project, Archives staff are also adding PDFs of selected deeds and surveys.

Dates range from 1650 through 1996, but *the vast majority of records date between 1675 and 1900.* ←

Please keep in mind that most deeds executed after 1785 were recorded at the county level, not with the State. County land records are not included in this database.

Note that there are a small numbers of non-land records included, such as bills of sale for slaves (e.g., George, Negro, Book H-West Jersey, folio 159) and lists of new arrivals to the colony (e.g., Governor Gawen Lawrie, Book A, folio 154).

The Regular annual meeting of the Council of Proprietors of the Western Division of New Jersey was held May 1, 1951 at their office on West Broad Street, Burlington, New Jersey.

The meeting was called to order by Henry S. Haines, Temporary Chairman. Certificates were presented showing election at Gloucester, N.J., April 13, 1951 of: Henriette C. W. Calcott, Donald F. Cameron, Hubert M. George and William S. Calcott by the election at Burlington, April 10, 1951 of: Franklin W. D'Oliver, Henry S. Haines, Edward S. Comfort, S. Snowden Haines and William H. Zelly, as members of the respective Councils.

Motion was made by Mr. Cameron, seconded by Mr. Zelly that the certificates be entered in the Minutes and filed.



Genealogical Research at The New Jersey Historical Society

Genealogical research is just that, **research** – research that take genealogists from the Internet to libraries to courthouses and beyond. Although genealogy is not the only subject we focus on at the NJHS (a characteristic of many libraries), we have many resources that can assist the genealogist in his or her search. Cemetery Transcriptions

Epitaphs on cemetery gravestones can be useful in providing birth and death information for an ancestor and many times these epitaphs have been transcribed and indexed. Occasionally family relationships are also apparent (or can be explored further) from information on gravestones and their location next to other stones. Additional books of cemetery records can be found by using the card catalog in the reading room.

Index To Civil War Soldiers' Graves In New Jersey

Genealogical Card Indices

Some genealogical researchers developed a series of indices on cards to help make some record sources easier to use or to organize their own research. The Society has several card indices of use for genealogists that contain family relations or vital record information. Some of these indices have been microfilmed.




