

#### **Statistics**

- About 231,000 soldiers served in the Continental Army
- About 145,000 soldiers served in the Colonial Militia
- Over 22,000 British soldiers were dispatched to North America for use in the British War Effort
- About 25,000 Loyalists Soldiers served in the conflict
- Roughly 12,000 French soldiers and sailors fought alongside the colonial army
- Nearly 30,000 Hessian soldiers fought alongside the British Army

### **Colonial Militia**

- Militias were the main colonial military organization for defense
- Militias were only part-time and non-standardized



## How were colonial militias organized?

- Each town would primarily raise a militia consisting of local men
- In Massachusetts every town was expected to maintain at least one company (approx. 60 men) commanded by a captain
- Many local militia laws required nearly all men between the ages of 16 and 60 to serve, keep arms, and train

## What did training look like for the men of the militia

- Training was required by law 6 days each year: two days in April, one day each in May and June, and two days in October
- Regimental training days, called a "muster" were only held once every few years

#### Minutemen vs. Militia

- Serving in your town's militia company was required by law
- Minuteman companies were raised by volunteer
- Militia companies trained 6 days each year, minuteman companies trained two days each week
- Minutemen were also paid for training days, on average 1 shilling for each half day

## **Continental Army**

- Founded on June 14, 1775 by the Second Continental Congress
- Forces were better trained and organized than the local militias



## **Colonial Navy**


- 13 October 1775 Continental Congress authorized the creation of the Continental Navy
- By 1776 colonies had 27 warships
- Relied heavily on commissioning Privateering vessels
- A Privateer Commission was issued to vessels, called privateers or cruisers, whose primary objective was to disrupt enemy shipping


## **Cemetery Clues**




WPA veteran's graves registration, Berkshire County Massachusetts 1774 -1941




- During the American Revolution, muster rolls were prepared by the commanding officer of each company of a regiment for the express purpose of paying the officers and soldiers





History of the Town of Peterborough, Hillsborough County, New Hampshire by Albert Smith

Considerable interest has been aroused among Cambridge antiquarians over the grave stone, dated in 1775, that was found in a lot on Channing street. Mr. A. S. McLachlan, a well-known builder, who is erecting a house there for a Mr. Howe, came upon the bones and the stone, and laid them carefully aside. They were then given over to Medical Examiner Swan, who has left the matter with Mayor Champlin.

The name of Joseph Taylor, which was inscribed upon the stone, was found among the records of those wounded at Bunker Hill. The latest interesting feature is the finding of the name among records at Peterborough, N. H., from which place the stone says he came. Mr. McLachlan has received news of this fact from Peterborough, so that the inscription on the stone is corroborated by history.





#### Another Revolutionary Soldier Cone!

SAMUEL GILMER, aged eighty-seven years and ten months, a soldier of the Revolution, died at his residence in the county of Highland, Va., on the 25th day of January, 1848. Mr. Gilmer was born in the State of Pennsylvania, Lancaster county.---At the age of about fourteen, his father removed to the State of Virginia, Augusta county, bringing his son with him. In the time of the Revolutionary war with England, he enlisted as a soldier in the army; perhaps he was then about sixteen or eighteen years old. He was in an engagement with the enemy of his country; fought under the command of Col. Bluford at Waxaw Settlement, Hanging Rock, State of South Carolina, against the British, who were commanded by Col. Tarieton. In this engagement he was wounded and mangled in a terrible manner, receiving numerous wounds, one in particular, on the right hand, the fore-finger of which he never straightened afterwards, and must have been taken notice of by every one who since then has shaken hands with him. He was left lying on the ground for dead. After so far recovering from his wounds as to be able to travel, he returned home; not, however, being entiroly well. He has been heard to say in after life, that the ratification of peace, before his wounds were healed, prevented his returning again to the army. At the age of thirty-nine he married, and raised a small family of two children,-one conand one daughter, -and lived some part of his life-

live, and on one of which he died. He was a very industrious man, strictly honest, of unimpeachable character; emphatically a good citizen. He lost his eye-sight about eight years previous to his death, which affliction he bore with becoming fortitude. After this event, he was necessarily confined. chiefly to the house, and he continued able, commonly, to walk about in the house, enjoying what may be termed good health till near his exit .-- A few days before his death he was taken unwell, and never recovered. Thus he died in a good old age, in the midst of connections and friends, whom he has left to mourn their loss, and has gone to that "bourne from whence no traveller e'er returns." and where all the living must sooner or later arrive.-Rock'm. Register.

# Case Study Thomas Emerson Militia and Navy


Not only, however, have Mr. Emerson's ancestors been courageous soldiers of the Lord, but many have also been brave patriots in their country's service. His great-grandfather, Thomas Emerson, stood bravely in the ranks as one of Reading's volunteers in the first battle of the Revolutionary War, at Merriam's Corner, between Concord and Lexington; he later served with distinction in the war, and knew the horrors of Dartmoor Prison. Capt. Thomas Emerson and Capt. James F. Emerson are also familiar names in our later military annals.


## **Compiled Service Records**

- These are extracted from the original records and can give a great overview of a soldier's service during the American Revolution






