Don't head straight for
the database search
box

More to a site

- Read the database descriptions
 - Places covered
 - Time periods covered
 - Completeness of records
- Make liberal use of a site's catalog (if it has one)
- Consult the wikis or help pages

Search Terms as Art

- Think first:
 - Location
 - Event (birth, marriage or death)
 - Time period (century, decade)
- Think second:
 - Name – use quotes to force the search for the entire name
 - Occupation (e.g. “soldier,” “minister”)
 - One-word modifiers

When Searching a Database

- “Less is More” when searching
- Look at the records before and after your target
- Seek the original; don’t trust the transcription (or indexing)
- Don’t expect to find everything for free



- Looking for subjects and historical events may offer insight into choices your ancestors made
- Don't ignore a page or book because it doesn't seem to have genealogy

This way, the search engine has to find the uncommon word first, and then from those sites the search engine finds, ...

Sir James Stephen called the period the age of charitable societies. "For the cure of every sorrow [...] there are patrons, vice-presidents, and secretaries. But at least one question has largely escaped the historian: the role of charitable women among the "Fathers of the Victorians".

Generations of scholars have accepted women as charitable in their habits, and now and then they have raised the exceptional female philanthropist to the level of biography. But they have not been much interested in the origins or scope of women's participation in organized charity, and they have little idea of the impact of social forces upon female generosity.³ This study tackles the problem on a numerical basis, and is confined to the years 1790-1830, decades in which a significant amount of published data is available from charitable societies. After establishing the proportion of women involved in these societies and in what way their numbers altered, we must look to the literature
