Work from general to specific, capturing author, record type, record subject, and repository.

Author (name of state or local agency), Type of Record (birth, marriage or death) for Name, Date, certificate Number; citing records of Repository, Town, County, State.

Newspapers are an exception to the general → specific rule. We want to start out with the article title. We need to include information about the original source and the digital repository.

"Article Title," *Newspaper* (Town, County, State), Date Published, Page, Column; image (or transcript) viewed at *Website* (URL : accessed date).

"Deaths," *Boston Recorder* (Boston, Suffolk, Massachusetts), Thursday, 28 March 1861, page 51; digital image at *GenealogyBank* (www.genealogybank.com : accessed 15 Feb 2022).
