**Ordnance Survey of Ireland,
1829-1842**

- Established in 1824
- Undertake townland survey of entire country
- Creation of maps at a scale six-inches to one mile
- Maps used by Richard Griffith's surveyors

Tithe Applotments, 1823-1837

- Tithed a tenth of produce to COI clergy
- Farmers living on an acre or more had to tithe
- All denominations paid tithe
- Tithes abolished in 1838

Dealing with placenames in Tithes

- Standardization of placenames through Ordnance Survey in 1830s
 - Townlands and parishes divided
 - Many place names renamed
- How to identify current place name
 - Obtain list of townlands in Civil parish
 - Can you find similar names, total area in Griffith's?
 - Utilize online place name websites
 - Logainm.ie, Placename database of Ireland



What is Griffith's Primary Valuation?

- Property tax survey
 - Every occupier of property
 - Every parcel of taxable land, buildings
- Published between 1847 and 1864
- Produced large quantities of records and maps

Sir Richard Griffith

- Civil engineer and geologist
- Made Boundary Commissioner, 1824
- Head of Valuation
- Griffith's Primary Valuation
 - Published instructions
 - Native Irish surveyors



Three Valuation Periods

Townland Valuation Act 1826
Focus on qualities of land and eventually buildings valued at £3, by 1836 all buildings valued at £5. Very few names.

Tenement Valuation Act 1852
Single valuation of all lands and tenements. Valuers re-visit properties every few years.


Tenement Valuation Act 1846
Every individual holding or tenement including names of occupiers to determine poor law rate. Townland Valuation for cess tax continues.

Townland valuation begins in Londonderry and No. Antrim 1830


Tenement Valuation begins in 1844 in County Dublin and Province of Munster counties except Co. Clare





Why use Griffith's Valuation?

- Gateway to 19th century research
- Ability to identify exact place of origin
- "Census-substitute"
- Can determine ancestor's socio-economic status

Who should use it?

- Ancestors in Ireland in mid 19th century
- Your ancestor left relatives behind



What do I need to know?

- Exact place of origin
 - Parish is okay to get started
 - Townland is best
- *Who* the ancestor most likely to be in Griffiths based on age, etc.







- Small letter 'a' references the farmer's house (main householder on lot)

- Capital letters A, B, etc. represent different parcels of land on lot with different types of soil






Possible records to consult

 - Agent's records and correspondence
- Landed Estate Court Rentals, 1850-1885, aka Encumbered Estate records
 - Bankrupt estates from Great Famine
 - Courts setup, state took ownership and sold lots
 - Lists every occupier, tenancy, description of land, maps
 - On Ancestry.com and FindMypast.ie
- 1901 Census
 - Lists every occupier in townland
 - Includes occupation


