Colonial Conflicts

Step #1 - Determine if he fought

- Determining the Military Service of your ancestor before the Revolution.
- How old was your veteran?
- What colonial wars occurred during his lifetime?

17th Century Conflicts

1. Pequot War: 1636-1638
2. King Philip's War: 1675-1676
3. King William's War: 1689-1697

18th Century Conflicts

1. Queen Anne's War: 1702-1713
2. War of Jenkins Ear: 1739-1742
3. King George's War: 1740-1748
4. French and Indian War: 1754-1763
5. Cherokee Uprising: 1760-1761
6. War of the Regulators: 1771

Consider family heirlooms for clues

1. What might be in the attic?
2. Ask relatives.
3. Museum and Archives.
4. eBay or Auction catalogs.

Step #2 - Confirm published sources

1. Don't re-invent the wheel.
2. What has been published?
3. State by state lists.
4. Local histories.
5. Internet resources when available.

The rich collections of records for soldiers of the Revolutionary War have aided scholars for generations. It is the purpose of this lecture to introduce and review these resources in researching the life of the veteran during the war and in their post-war life.

Basic Steps of Military Research

1. Determine if your ancestor fought.
 - a. Does his age “fit”?
 - b. What do family heirlooms / tradition say?
2. Research Analysis.
 - a. Documents and artifacts.
 - b. Genealogies and published histories.
 - c. Online resources.
3. Seek or Apply to Hereditary Societies.

3. Look at family heirlooms for clues.

1. Published accounts to Muster Rolls.
2. Going beyond abstracts and dissecting Pension files.

Consider Adopting the Regiment or Crew

Consider using the steps you have learned and examine the pensions and stories of those men who served with your ancestor. The details in the diaries, letters, and pensions of his fellow veterans may add more detail to the story you know from researching his records.
