
Landed Estates

What are landed estates?



- Begun with the 17th century Plantation of Ulster
- Cromwellian Restoration and Williamite land settlements continued the practice
- System in which a single individual holds title to the lands ranging from 1,000 acres to 100,000 acres and leases to farmers and other tenants
- In effect until the late 1800s, early 1900s when Acts of Parliament broke them up

Landed Estates


- Owners of the larger estates (upwards of 100,000 acres) were usually members of the aristocracy who may have had several estates in Ireland and Britain
- Smaller estates of 1,000 to 3,000 acres were often owned by more modest farmers and the records may not survive
- Almost all landowners were members of the Church of Ireland

Estate Records

What are estate records?

- Documents generated by administration of landed estates
- Prior to 20th century, majority of the land was owned by large and small estates
- Landowner was a member of nobility, landed gentry, or Church of Ireland clergy
- Land could be held by others such as the London guilds and various companies

Estate records

Strengths

- Excellent resource for 18th c. and early 19th c. ancestors
- Useful source for searching poor ancestors
- One of the few record sets that may survive in an area where church records start late

Weaknesses

- Most rental and tenant's lists document only major tenants
- Limited time periods
- Not all areas of Ireland had large landed estates
- Some records destroyed or still in private hands

- Leases and lease books
- Rentals, rent books and tenant lists
- Maps
- Correspondence
- Emigration lists and eviction records
- Account books
- Manor Court Records



Anatomy of a Lease


- Name of the lessor (the landowner)
- Name of the lessee (the tenant)
- Location of the farm
- Rent to be paid
- Tenure of the lease
- Conditions required of the lessee


Estate parishes of Barony Strabane Lower






Correspondence

- Seldom between the renters and the landed gentry
- May help in identifying middlemen/jobbers
- May be listed in any summary lists simply as “letters” or “concerning estate and financial affairs”
- Unlikely to be indexed

Emigration or Eviction Records

Emigration or Eviction

- Because the large landed estate collections are seldom indexed, you may want to search newspapers for such information first
- Once you have the date, then it may be easier to locate your ancestor in the actual records
- These entries may appear in the rental books

CONNACHT AND MUNSTER LANDED ESTATES DATABASE

The Connacht and Munster Landed Estates project, funded by the [Irish Council for Research in the Humanities and Social Sciences](#) and the [Programme for Research in Third Level Institutions](#) respectively, undertook the research for, and the publication of, a comprehensive and integrated resource guide to landed estates and historic houses in Connacht and Munster, c. 1700-1914. The aim of the guide is to assist and support researchers working on the social, economic, political and cultural history of these provinces from c.1700 to 1914.

The project involved the distillation and collation of data from a broad range of historical sources, and the concise codification of these data on an estate/name basis. The optimum use of the data determined that the database be published in electronic form. Full details of the sources used can be viewed under Reference Sources in the database. See the Help link for further details on the creation of the database.

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

2b JOHN KING, 3rd BARON KINGSTON, PC; *b* c 1664; turned RC and accompanied JAMES II into exile in France, hence outlawed, but was later pardoned; *m* 1683 Margaret (*d* 29 April 1721), one of his f's servants, dau of Florence O'Cahan, and *d* 15 Feb 1727/8, leaving:

1c JAMES KING, 4th and last BARON KINGSTON, PC (I 1729); *b* 1693; *m* 1st Elizabeth (*d* 6 Oct 1750), widow of Sir Ralph Freke, 1st Bt, and dau of Sir John Meade, 1st Bt (see CLANWILLIAM, E), and had:

1b Edward, *Viscount Kingsborough*; *b* 10 Nov 1795; *educ* Exeter Coll Oxford; MP (Whig) Co Cork 1818-26, antiquarian, ed Aglio's *The Antiquities of Mexico* (6 vols, 1831), Kt Austrian Order of Crown of Italy; *d* unm 27 Feb 1837 of typhus in a Dublin debtor's prison, having stood security for his I, whose debt it was

2b ROBERT HENRY KING, 4th Earl of Kingston; *b* 4 Oct 1796; Offr 5th Foot, MP (Whig) Co Cork 1826-32, Sheriff Co Cork 1836; indicted for sodomy April 1848 but jumped bail of £10,000 (over £46,000 in early-2000s terms); by 1860 he was more civic-minded, actually appearing in the magistrates' courts to answer charges of intoxication, assaulting the police or bilking cabmen of their fares; adjudged insane 1861; *d* unm 21 Jan 1867


3b JAMES KING, 5th Earl of Kingston; *b* 6 April 1866, barrister King's Inn Dublin 1825 and Lincoln's Inn 1827; *m* 25 Aug 1860 Anna (*m* 2nd 29 July 1873 William Downes Webber, of Kellyville, Queen's Co, and *dsp* 29 Oct 1909), 4th dau of Matthew Brinckley, of Parsonstown, Co Meath, and *dsp* 8 Sept 1869, when the UK Barony expired

1b Helena Caroline; *m* 8 Dec 1829 Philip Davies-Cooke (*d* 20 Nov 1853), of Gwysaney, Flints, and Owston Hall, Yorks, and *d* 9 May 1871, leaving issue (see COOKE, Bt)

2b Adelaide Charlotte; *m* 1834 Charles Tankerville Webber, QC, and *d* Aug 1854, leaving issue

2a ROBERT EDWARD KING, 1st Viscount Lorton of Boyle, Co Roscommon, so *cr* 28 May 1806, as also earlier 29 Dec 1800 BARON ERRIS OF BOYLE, Co Roscommon (both I); *b* 12 Aug 1773; *educ* Eton and Exter Coll Oxford; MP Jamestown 1796-97 and Boyle 1798-1800; tried at roughly the same time as his f (April 1798) for the murder of Col FitzGerald (but at the Cork Assizes, being then a commoner) and also found not guilty; rep I peer 1823-54, Gen 1830; *m* 9 Dec 1799 his cousin Lady Frances (*d* 7 Oct 1841), dau and heiress of 1st Earl of Rosse (*qv*), and *d* 20 Nov 1854, having had:

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
