# Identifying Your Jamestowne Ancestor

# Criteria for Seventeenth-Century Qualifying Ancestors

You are eligible to join the Jamestowne Society if your ancestor was . . .

1. A stockholder in the London Company or the Virginia Company, or a member of one of the guilds which invested in the above, during the active investment period;
2. Owned land on Jamestown Island or lived on the Island prior to 1700 (owning land in a neighboring area or neighboring county does NOT of itself qualify an individual);
3. Was a resident in Virginia at the time of the 1624/25 Muster or earlier;
4. Served as Governor, Secretary of State, Treasurer, Attorney General, Clerk of the General Court, Member of the Council or House of Burgesses prior to 1700; these persons shall be conclusively presumed to have had their domiciles on Jamestown Island during their terms of office;
5. Was an Anglican Church (Church of England) minister in Virginia prior to 1700;
6. Served as an official Indian Interpreter in Virginia prior to 1700.

## Class 2: Verifying Your Jamestowne Lineage

The list of Qualifying ancestors is below. The Register can be ordered using the form under the Shop section of this website. In addition to information posted on this website, the Register also includes the number of members with lineages proven back to that Qualifying Ancestor and problem lines of Qualified Ancestors.

**PLEASE NOTE: The Jamestowne Society does not provide genealogical research for individuals. If you are interested in adding a Jamestowne-era ancestor to the Qualifying Ancestors Index, you must prove that they had appropriate service as defined by this Society, and your lineage, as part of the Membership Application Process.**

Note that 17th century spelling was very variable. Look for variations of the spelling of names you are interested in.





The office of Indian Interpreter was recently added to the list of offices that are considered to be acceptable for representation in the Jamestowne Society. The position was paid by the colonial government and was a responsible position handling relations with the native population of Virginia.

The following is a list of Indian Interpreters prior to 1699. There is no official listing of such office-holders, but rather, the items are located in court order books or minutes of the colonial government. This list is definitely not complete and will be happily expanded when citations to public records can confirm that an individual was the holder of this office while the capital was at Jamestowne.








In an effort to help people find their Jamestowne Society lineage(s), we are listing people, living in c.1770-1783, who are themselves descendants of Jamestowne Society Qualifying Ancestors or whose spouse is a descendant. Each listing represents an approved lineage paper which can be purchased. QA is an abbreviation for Qualifying Ancestor, and their assigned ancestor number for the Society follows their name. This number **IS NOT** a paper number, but an assigned number for ancestors in the Society's Qualified Ancestor Register.

Below are listed couples for whom one or both was an adult during the American Revolutionary War period. The Jamestowne Society Qualifying Ancestor (QA) is also listed. The list is in alphabetical order by the husband's surname.

**IMPORTANT DISCLAIMER:** Revolutionary War service has not been examined by the Jamestowne Society. We do not vet Revolutionary War service. Do not use this list as the basis for proof of service on an application to another society.



### About the Project

In April 2008, Brantley Association founder and president, Kenneth Brantley, met with the new Probate Clerk of Southampton County, Virginia; the honorable Richard Francis. The Brantley family once resided in the county but little had been gleaned from the records there because few were indexed and published.

Eager to see this remarkable collection made available to researchers of the Brantley family as well as thousands of other researchers whose ancestry had traversed the County, Mr. Brantley made a bold commitment. He agreed to digitize and, at least attempt, to facilitate through the Association the indexing of the entire court records there from 1749 through the early 1880s, under the condition that the county would (1) either display the records on a web site for no charge or (2) provide for the Brantley Association or its assignee the right to display the same.

Mr. Brantley knew that this was a considerable undertaking, as there were an estimated 60,000 pages of court pages and well over one million name entries within the covers of the ancient books. He did, however, feel strongly that there would be support by many


