- Often a published series with verbatim transcriptions or abstracted detail.
- Originals can be located on Fold3 and Family Search.
- Most muster rolls are in the possession of the State Archives for the individual units. The National Archives only has microfilm copies available.

# Mass. Soldiers & Sailors

The following example is a Revolutionary War sketch from *Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors in the Revolutionary War* (12:559).

**Poor, Jonathan**, Newbury. Captain of a company of militia, Col. Samuel Gerrish's (2d Essex Co.) Regt., which marched on the alarm of April 19, 1775; service, 6 days; also, Captain; return of militia officers who joined Col. Jedediah Huntington's Regt., dated Roxbury Camp, Dec. 22, 1775; ordered in Council Feb. 3, 1776, that said officers be commissioned; also, Captain; list of officers of companies under command of Col. Huntington which reinforced the army; commissioned Feb. 3, 1776; also, copy of a return of said Poor's co. [year not given]; copy of a receipt dated Newbury, march 18, 1777, signed by men belonging to said Poor's co., for wages for 6 weeks service, appears on reverse of return; also, Captain, 1st co., Col. Daniel Spafford's (7th Essex Co.) regt. of Mass. militia; list of officers to be commissioned in said regiment; ordered in Council June 26, 1777, that said officers be commissioned; reported commissioned June 26, 1777.

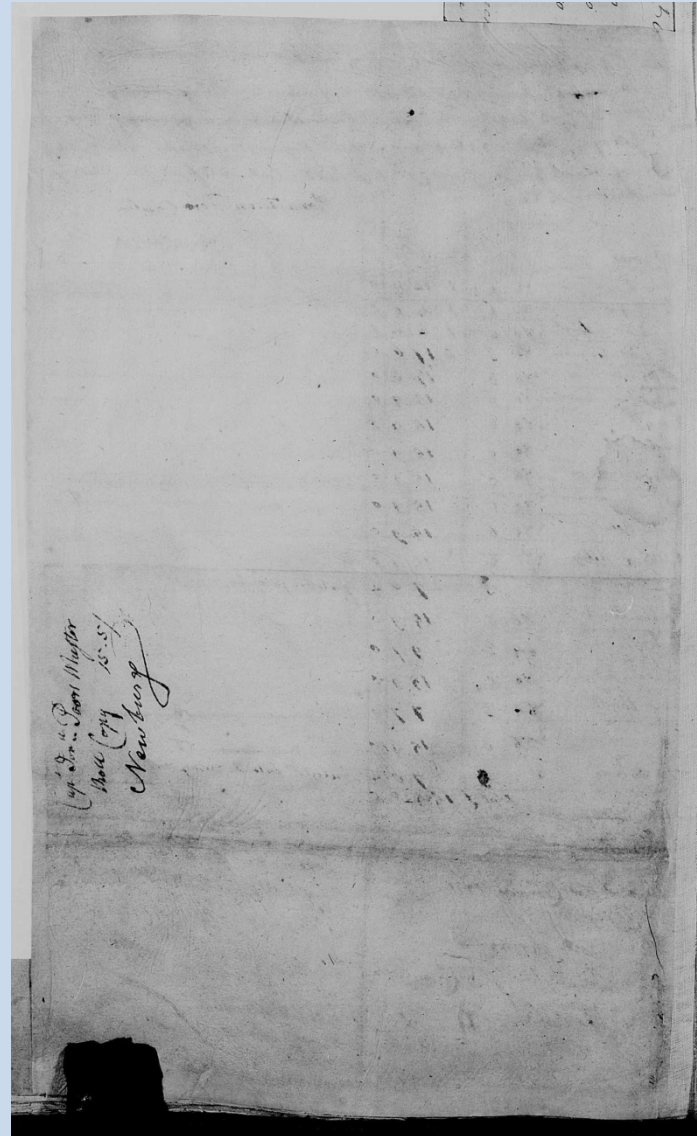

- Early Bounty Land records were destroyed in two fires at the War Department in 1800 and 1814. Many Pensions will make a reference to a BLW Number, and state "No papers".
- Fold3 has digitized all Revolutionary War Pension records from the microfilm.
- Revolutionary War Pensions cannot be examined at NARA.



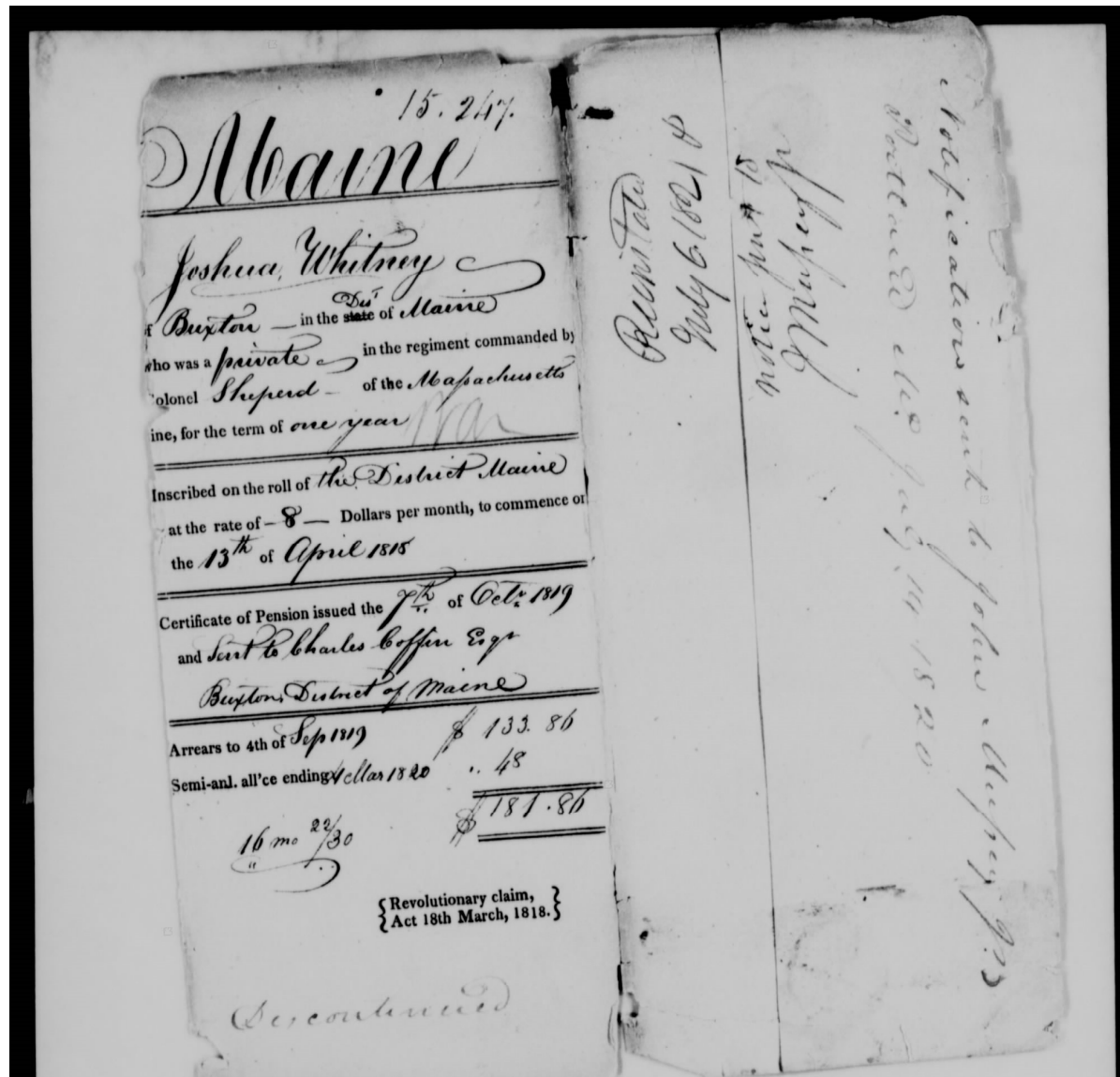

## Joshua Whitney Pension File

Joshua Whitney of Boston in the County of York and Common-  
 wealth of Massachusetts, aged fifty seven years, on oath testify and  
 say, that I enlisted a private in the Continental Army of the Revolution  
 in the first part of the month of January in the year of our Lord  
 seventeen hundred & eighty two, the day of the month I do not  
 recollect. The Company I enlisted into was when I enlisted com-  
 manded by Capt. ~~Blanchard~~ the same Company while I was in  
 it was commanded by Capt. North, and afterwards when  
 I was discharged from the army was commanded by Capt.  
 Blanchard. The Regiment was commanded by Col. Shepard  
 the whole time I was in <sup>Massachusetts Line</sup> the army, and the Brigade was  
 commanded by General Patterson from the time I ~~enlisted~~  
 the army till I was discharged from the same at the close

 and am a citizen of the United States.

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## Revolutionary War Final Pension Payment Vouchers

Final pension payment vouchers for Revolutionary War veterans were originally located in the voluminous series, "Settled Accounts of Pension Agents, 1813–1899," Entry A1-712 in Record Group 217, Records of the Accounting Officers of the Department of the Treasury (National Archives Identifier [302049](#)).

Recognizing the genealogical value of the vouchers and the difficulty in locating them in this large series, National Archives staff in the 1960s culled the records to make them more accessible to researchers. The result is the series, "**Selected Final Pension Payment Vouchers, 1818–1864**," Entry A1-722 in Record Group 217 (National Archives Identifier [605894](#)).

## Contents of Vouchers

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Final pension payment vouchers consist of paperwork relating to the last pension payment made to the veteran pensioner, to the surviving widow, or to the pensioner's heirs.

Payment vouchers may include any or all of the following information:

- Name of the pensioner and name of the spouse
- Pensioner's county of residence
- Military service of the veteran, including rank and organizational information
- Congressional pension act that covered the claim
- Monetary provisions of the pension
- Final pension payment amount
- Date that the last pension payment was made
- Name of the attorney or executor handling the filing of the claim
- Names of the pensioner's surviving children
- Dates of death of the veteran and/or his widow
- Name of the administrator of the pensioner's estate

# War of 1812 – Bounty Land Records

- Many War of 1812 veterans or their widows did not live long enough to collect a pension in 1871.
- Original Bounty Land records can be searched first on the Bureau of Land Management website.

## War Bounty Land Warrants, 1789-1858

- First series Bounty Land for War of 1812 service were issued under acts of December 24, 1811, January 11, 1812, and May 6, 1812
- Congress stated that noncommissioned officers and soldiers serving for five years (or discharged earlier), or their heirs, would eventually be entitled to 160 acres of land from the public domain in partial compensation for their military service
- Six million acres of land in the Territories of Michigan, Illinois, and Louisiana were set aside for this purpose

## War Bounty Land Warrants, 1789-1858

- Second series per act of Congress on December 10, 1814
- Act increased by doubling the acreage offered to soldiers enlisting after that date
- These warrants per this act were called “Double Bounty Warrants”

MICHAEL J DOHERTY 42035500, Infantry, Private, Company I, 179th Infantry Regiment, for gallantry in action on 24 August 1944 near Geres, France. Attacking across an open area before a town, Private Doherty's platoon encountered heavy machine gun fire, followed by an artillery and mortar concentration which stopped the advance. While the other members of his unit were pinned down, Private Doherty crawled toward the enemy machine gun position. He worked himself to within twenty yards of the enemy in spite of the sniper fire directed at him, and fired a rifle grenade into the emplacement which silenced the gun and killed or wounded four of the crew. He then made his way back to his platoon, now able to regroup and continue the attack and secure the town. Private Doherty's boldness and courage reflect credit upon himself and his organization. Entered the military service from Long Island City, New York.
