Army Serial No 37 139 530. Fifth Army Air Force 59th Air Service Group. Service records lost in fire. I have his Separation Record, Certification of Military Service, Honorable Discharge record, and document from 5th Air Force. Also have some notes, some letters, and photos of Dad's. He was in the HDQ company and said their job was to keep planes supplied with guns, bombs and ammunition. On airstrip in Okinawa when first bomb dropped. Ordered to Tokyo to help organize occupation (flew in C47) and there a few weeks before doing the same in Korea. (flew into Seoul and stayed in Yung Dung Po.)Prior to 1945, dad took a 9 week officer candidate course in Aberdeen, MD (not sure when; he was in San Antonio (at Kelly I believe) by Feb</p>

	'43, Carlsbad by 6 Oct '43-10 May '44; and Utah (dad said Salt Lake, but I think perhaps Ogden) in May '44 perhaps 6-7 months prior to shipping out from San Francisco 1/1/45. In SWPA, he was in New Guinea, and served on air strips in Mindora, Mindanao, Leyte and Luzon,(by March he says in PI HDQ after changes islands several times); Okinawa, Tokyo, and Korea. Returned through Seattle.
Specific question(s) or goal(s) for consultation	<p>I hope to find Dad's unit and commander (and direct boss) to help fill in the story. I have found RG 496 which includes Series 520 which looks promising. Ideas for how to narrow it down?</p> <p>Lt Gen Ennis Whitehead was Commander of the 5th while dad was in SWPA. Is there a way I can find his org structure? Gen. Clements McMullen oversaw 5th and 13th so this also may be a lead.</p> <p>Dad said he was the commander's(on Leyte Island) right hand man serving as his secretary, supervising payroll, assigning jobs in company, and kept track of daily tasks. He also said from that point on, he traveled in a C47 Fat Cat.</p> <p>At dad's level, what clearance level would he have likely had?</p> <p>In notes, dad wrote "the fighter pilots from our air strip escorted the B29 to Mainland Japan (when first A bomb dropped) and then returned to us. Where could I find more out about this?</p> <p>What is the likelihood I find dad's name on a document as a clerk typist?</p> <p>Dad wrote that in the SWPA he was fortunate to work under his former boss and commander he met in Carlsbad in 1943. Brother Nils (Nels) Larsson arrived 17 Mar 1881/82 with wife Anna Carlsdotter and their 3 children Per, Johanna, and Maria from Norra Sandby and settled in Gibson City, IL. He was b 16 May 1831 (same place). Sven and Ingrid are my great grandparents through Grandpa Olaf and my father Robert Larson.</p>
