Then in September 1781 turncoat Benedict Arnold attacked New London and Groton, CT.

After seeing the damage Benedict Arnold and his troops wrought, John REID deserted the RN. Upon this news Rebecca CHESTER agreed to marry John.

Factual: My CT genealogist found lists of British prisoners who were sent to Connecticut by George Washington. These lists were compiled by the Committee of Prisoners and reported to Governor Trumbull. In the group of prisoners at Glassenbury, CT, there is #65 Reid, but the list is dated 24 Jan 1777, which may be too early for my John REID.

Factual: There are Passing Certificates at the UK National Archives, but there is a gap between the years 1776 and 1780, unfortunately. The RN Succession Books mention three John REIDs. The ship Cameleon has Sir John REID appointed 16 Mar 1781. Ship Jupiter has a John REID appointed 22 Mar 1779. Ship Cato has a John REID appointed 24 Jan 1781.

No marriage record for John REID and Rebecca CHESTER has been found, but I think they may have married late 1781 - 1783 in Connecticut. No death record has been found for John REID. No death record has been found for Rebecca CHESTER, though she may have been buried in the Starr Burying Ground in Groton, New London, Connecticut.

Family Lore: John REID and Rebecca CHESTER's son Samuel Chester REID was born 24 or 25 August 1783, possibly in Norwich, New London, Connecticut.

Factual: Samuel Chester REID 1783-1861, son of John REID and Rebecca CHESTER, became a mariner. During the War of 1812, Samuel had a Letter of Marque for commandeering the "General Armstrong". In September 1814, while the "General Armstrong" was anchored in the neutral Fayal Harbor, REID and his crew survived the unprovoked attack by three British ships during the Battle of Fayal, in the Azores.
