History

Changes in Population 1900 - 2000


- Population went from 908,420 to 3,405,565
- 1900 – 26.2% born outside U.S.
 - 42% of population in principle cities
- 2000 – 10.9% born outside U.S., of those 48.7% naturalized
 - 28.2% of population in ten largest cities

Data from the Census

- 1900/1910 – naturalization status of foreign-born aged 21 or older
- 1920/1930 – naturalization status of foreign-born people
- 1940 – citizenship status of foreign-born people
- 1950 – “Is he naturalized” asked of foreign-born people
- 1970-2000 – variation on citizenship question asked between 1 out of 5 to 1 out of 20 households

Connecticut's Youngest City

- Settled in 1648 as “West Farms” in New Haven Colony
- In 1719, became the parish of West Parish within New Haven
- Attempted incorporation in 1784
- Joined forces with North Milford (part of Milford) to form Orange in 1822
- 1921 Split from Orange
- 1961 incorporated as a city

Vital Records after 1897

Vital Record Notes

- Originally recorded at the town level
- 1897 – Statewide registration began
- 1915 – General compliance

Connecticut General Statutes

Section 7-51


- The department and registrars of vital statistics shall restrict access to and issuance of a certified copy of birth and fetal death records and certificates less than one hundred years old, to the following eligible parties (7) members of genealogical societies incorporated or authorized by the Secretary of the State to do business or conduct affairs in this state

Earlier versions

- 1971 act provided that members of “legally incorporated genealogical societies may have access to records”
- 1972 act changed age of majority from 21 to 18
- Public Act 96-258 deleted “legally incorporated” and added “incorporated or authorized to do business or conduct affairs in this state
- This language has remained the same since 1996

Approved Genealogical Societies (14)

- Annual dues range from \$10-40
- Some have age restrictions
- Several publish their own genealogical journals
- Many have their own libraries
- Some are hereditary society, ethnic specific, and/or social clubs



What is not accessible to approved genealogists

- Confidential Files relating to Adoption
- Paternity and Surrogacy Agreements
- Sex Amendments related to gender reassignment
- Social Security Numbers when they appear on records

Rights of Adoptees

- Effective July 1, 2021, all Connecticut-born adoptees [18 and over] have unrestricted right to request and obtain their original birth certificates. The right also extends to the children and grandchildren of the adopted person.

Rights of Access

- Any town hall during normal business hours
- By appointment at the State Vital Records Office in Hartford
- In either case, call ahead!



Planning a Trip to the Department of Health

- Three-hour time slots
- Indexes from July 1, 1897 to December 31, 2001, for births, marriages, and deaths
- Microfilm Roll and frame number
- Indexes afterward accessible by DPH employees

- If born in a hospital in another town, usually on file in both town of birth and residence
- Number of other children and number alive

- Dates of birth added in the 1950s
- Birthplaces of parents added later




Church Records

- Many Catholic Records (baptisms, marriages, burials) transcribed, with limitations




Catholic Diocese Records







Probate Court Districts

Probate Collection until 1948

- In reality only goes until 1915, including probate files that dragged on until 1948
- Rest kept at probate court
- Often transcribed in town clerk vaults alongside vital and land records





Connecticut Indian Land Claims Settlement

- 1666- Connecticut General Assembly voted on 2,000-acre reservation in Ledyard for the “western Pequots” and 280 acres in North Stonington for the “eastern Pequots”
- By 1790- 2,000 acres reduce to 1,000
- 1855- state sold 800 of the remaining acres
- Elizabeth (George) Plouffe died in 1973, last resident on the 214-acre Pequot reservation, land passed back to the state
- Grandson Richard Hayward initially tried to claim the land for the family, later obtaining federal recognition as the Western Pequot tribe and reclaiming the 800 acres sold in 1855

Modern day usage

- From 1 member in 1973 to 32 by 1982, the Mashantucket Pequots now have 1,086 members, descending from eleven families on the 1900 census




