

Review: Earliest European Settlements

- 1614: Adriaen Block sails up the Connecticut River and reaches present-day Hartford
- 1623: Dutch West India Company presence in the Hartford area as a fur-trading outpost
- 1633: Windsor becomes the first English settlement (encompassing present day towns of Windsor, Enfield, Suffield, Simsbury, Coventry, Tolland, Litchfield, Bolton, and others)







Online Databases

Connecticut: Vital Records (The Barbour Collection), 1630-1870 (American Ancestors)





“Diligent genealogists should go beyond the Barbour Index in three different ways:

1. Vital records in the Barbour Index should be verified by comparison with the original source...
2. Vital records not in Barbour may be in other sources
3. Other evidence for vital statistics may be found in church and cemetery records, town compilations and other publications...”



Boolean Searches

How to Search

You can apply Boolean search logic to your keywords and terms, using AND, OR, NOT, and parentheses. You can also use specific indexes for your search terms.

Broaden Your Search

Put an upper-case OR between your keywords. For example, **dust OR bowl** retrieves records containing either dust or bowl.

Narrow Your Search

Put quotes around your keywords to find records with an exact phrase. For example, **"dust bowl"** retrieves records with the words dust and bowl together, but would not match a description where those two words were not adjacent and in that order.

Put an upper-case NOT between your keywords. For example, **dust NOT bowl** retrieves records containing dust, but not bowl.

Put a - and a number between 1 and 4 at the end of your exact phrase. For example, **"dust bowl"-4** retrieves records where dust and bowl appear within four words of each other.

Put parentheses around your search terms. For example, **(dust OR bowl) NOT oklahoma** retrieves records containing either dust or bowl, but not Oklahoma.





- 410 Capitol Ave, Hartford, CT 06134

- Cost is \$20 per record, payable by cash or credit
- For walk-ins, only 2 records retrieved per day

Godfrey Memorial Library

- 134 Newfield Street (Route 3), Middletown, CT 06457
- Home of the American Genealogical-Biographical Index (AGBI)
 - Comprised of 4 million names
 - Drawn from 800 books held by Godfrey Library
 - Also derived from 2 million records from the *Boston Transcript* genealogical column
 - \$15 per citation (personal check or PayPal)




