- Defining moment for our young country changing its trajectory forever
- Nearly 3 million Americans served, resulting in 750,000 casualties
- Everyone living in America at that time was affected in some way by the events of 1861-1865 and its long aftermath

How the Civil War may have affected your ancestor

- Economy
- Employment
- Divided the allegiance of their family
- Destroyed their livelihoods, destruction on the battlefield of their farms, or troops raiding their property or occupying their homes
- Loss of family members and friends who fought on both sides of the war



Probates & Deeds left by your Veteran

PROBATE

- Did they leave a will before enlisting?
- Was there an intestate probate to settle their estate after their death?
- Notices in the newspaper of their estate

Probates & Deeds left by your Veteran

DEEDS

- Did they own land before they enlisted?
- Was the land foreclosed upon when they were serving?
- Is there a mortgage deed by the soldier or his wife?
- Was the property sold by their widow?

City Directories

- Listing the veteran at a residence in 1860, and not present 1861-65
- Veterans listed in appendix
- Abbreviations denoting service in Army or Navy
- The date death of the veteran listed in the directory occasionally

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




Malvern Hill

This was the sixth and last of the Seven Days' Battles. On July 1, 1862, Gen. Robert E. Lee launched a series of disjointed assaults on the nearly impregnable Union position on Malvern Hill. The Confederates suffered more than 5,300 casualties without gaining an inch of ground. Despite his victory, McClellan withdrew to entrench at Harrison's Landing on James River, where his army was protected by gunboats. This ended the Peninsula Campaign. When McClellan's army ceased to threaten Richmond, Lee sent Jackson to operate against Maj. Gen. John Pope's army along the Rapidan River, thus initiating the Northern Virginia Campaign.



quently served in the Army. He served as private in the Fifty-eighth Pennsylvania Volunteer Militia, from June 29, 1863, to August 7, 1863. He was commissioned captain in the One Hundred and Twenty-seventh United States Colored Troops, August 22, 1864, and major, March 24, 1865. He was mustered out Nov. 6, 1865.

He afterwards engaged in the woollen manufacture, at Meadville. He went to St. Paul, Minn., for the benefit of his health, in August, 1868, and died there Oct. 21, 1868.

WILLIAM FREDERIC JONES, son of Thomas Jefferson and Eliza (Wier) Jones, was born in Boston, Dec. 2, 1841. He fitted for college at the Dorchester High School.

He left college at the end of the first term of the Sophomore year, and went into business with his father in Boston. He afterwards served as a private and corporal in the Forty-fourth Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry, from July, 1862, until June, 1863.

SIDELIGHTS ON LINCOLN GIVEN

Memories of Emancipator Recalled by Angeleno

Civil War Veteran Tells of His Acquaintance with Birthday to be Observed by Many Organizations

"With malice toward none and charity for all" as the attribute of Abraham Lincoln which he most vividly recalls, Charles B. Wilson of 2338 Eleventh avenue, yesterday told of his acquaintance with the great Emancipator during the Civil War days when bitterness and hatred bid fair to tear the nation asunder.

Mr. Wilson, then Lieut. Wilson, was on Gen. Whittell's staff at Richmond, Virginia, in 1863 when the end of the war came. Word was received that Lincoln was coming down from Washington and Wilson was detailed to meet him at the landing a few miles out of town and escort him into Richmond. The President was met, he said, by scores of freed slaves who fell on their knees before him with cries of "God bless Master Lincoln! God bless Master Lincoln!" And the short distance into the city took two hours to cover because at every step of the way he was shaking hands with the negroes with both his hands, his stove-pipe hat remaining on his head and his umbrella tucked under his arm.

When finally they reached the State House at Richmond, the President sat in Jefferson Davis' chair and discussed the disposition of the Confederate leaders with his generals.

"What shall we do with them, Mr. President?" he was asked, and Mr. Wilson tells how Lincoln sat there looking up at the ceiling and his only comment was: "Let 'em up easy, boys, let 'em up easy."

UNGAULN HORSEMAN

Earlier in the war when Wilson was one of Berden's sharpshooters, he related the story of their mutiny because they had been promised a certain kind of rifle to use, instead of which they were given old Enfield muskets. McClellan placed them all under arrest and then went to Lincoln with the story. Lincoln promptly mounted a horse and rode to their camp a short distance outside of Washington.

"With the stirrups too short and his long legs protruding at an ungainly angle, his stove-pipe hat and his umbrella under his arm, he made about as bad a figure on the horse as ever I saw," said Mr. Wilson. "But he came out to talk the matter over with the boys and he told McClellan that just as soon as the promised rifles could be procured we were to have them. He always was fair and he always talked straight from the shoulder. That's why everyone loved him."

Mr. Wilson, who will be 85 years of age this month, is a past senior vice-commander-in-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic. He has been a resident of Los Angeles since 1895.

LINCOLN LETTER OWNED BY LOCAL WOMAN

Coincident with the commemoration today of the 120th anniversary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln, it was revealed that one of the few hitherto unpublished letters written by the great emancipator, is the property of a resident of Beverly Hills, Mrs. Ernest Chase of 721 Madoc Drive.

The letter was written to Adm. Gen. Thomas toward the close of the Civil War in reference to the names of plantations owned by Mrs. Eugenia F. Bass, Mrs. Chase's aunt, who later became the Countess Hertling. At her death, about ten years ago, the letter, along with a collection of valuable antiques, many of which are said to be of outstanding historical value, became the property of Mrs. Chase.

Countess Hertling won fame in Washington, D. C., as a southern beauty during antebellum days, and after her marriage to the Italian nobleman, traveled extensively.

Mrs. Chase, before her marriage, lived abroad with her aunt for almost fifteen years.

ANCESTRY MOLDER OF LINCOLN'S CHARACTER

Prof. Walter Stryker Hertog, KSLI historian, spoke yesterday before 2000 students of Belmont High School on "The Contribution of the State of Pennsylvania to the Greatness of Lincoln."

"The simplicity of his life, his calmness in the midst of the struggle of the Civil War, his gentleness and kindness toward friend and foe, were due to the spirit of self-compassion which was implanted in his heart by the simple teachings of his Quaker ancestors of Berks county, Pennsylvania," the speaker said.




