Your soil has been invaded by your Abolition foes, and we call upon you to rally at once, and drive them back. We want Volunteers to march immediately to Grafton and report for duty. Come one! Come ALL! and render the service due to your State and Country. Fly to arms, and succour your brave brothers who are now in the field.

The Volunteers from the Counties of Pendleton, Highland, Bath, Allegheny, Monroe, Mercer, and other Counties mentioned in this point, will immediately assemble, and report at Monterey, in Highland County, where they will join the Companies from the Valley, marching to Grafton. The Volunteers from the Counties of Hardy, Hampshire, Randolph, Pocahontas, Greenbrier, and other Counties mentioned, will in like manner report at Beverly. And the Volunteers from the Counties of Upshur, Lewis, Barbour, and other Counties, will report at Phillip, in Barbour County. The Volunteers, as soon as they report at the above points, will be furnished with arms, rations, &c., &c.

Action! Action! should be our rallying motto, and the sentiment of Virginia's inspired Orator, "Give me Liberty or give me Death," animate every loyal son of the Old Dominion! Let us drive back the invading foot of a brutal and desperate foe, or leave a record to posterity that we died bravely defending our homes and firesides,—the honor of our wives and daughters,—and the sacred graves of our ancestors!





Review

Probates & Deeds left by your Veteran

DEEDS

- Did they own land before they enlisted?
- Was the land foreclosed upon when they were serving?
- Is there a mortgage deed by the soldier or his wife?
- Was the property sold by their widow?



City Directories

- Listing the veteran at a residence in 1860, and not present during 1861-65
- Sometimes veterans listed in appendix or abbreviations denoting service in Army or Navy
- The date death of the veteran listed in the directory occasionally

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

The Civil War Soldiers and Sailors System (CWSS) is a database containing information about the men who served in the Union and Confederate armies during the Civil War. Other information on the site includes histories of Union and Confederate regiments, links to descriptions of significant battles, and selected lists of prisoner-of-war records and cemetery records, which will be amended over time. The CWSS is a cooperative effort between the National Park Service and several public and private partners whose goal is to increase Americans' understanding of this decisive era in American history by making information about it widely accessible.



CONFEDERATE VIRGINIA TROOPS

3rd Regiment, Virginia Infantry

OVERVIEW: 3rd Infantry Regiment was organized at Portsmouth, Virginia, in 1856 with volunteer companies attached to the 7th Regiment Virginia Militia. It entered Confederate service during July, 1861. Its members were from Portsmouth and Petersburg, and the counties of Nansemond, Dinwiddie, Surry, Isle of Wight, Southampton, and Halifax. Three companies were in the fight at [Big Bethel](#), then the regiment was assigned to General Colston's, Pryor's, Kemper's, and W.R. Terry's Brigade. It fought with the Army of Northern Virginia from [Williamsburg to Gettysburg](#) except when it was detached to Suffolk with Longstreet. Later it was active in the conflicts at [Plymouth](#), [Drewry's Bluff](#), and [Cold Harbor](#), the [Petersburg](#) siege south and north of the James River, and the [Appomattox Courthouse](#) Campaign. This unit totalled 550 men in April, 1862, and reported 97 casualties during the Seven Days' Battles, 19 in the Maryland Campaign, and 11 at [Fredericksburg](#). Of the 332 engaged at [Gettysburg](#), more than thirty-five percent were disabled. Many were captured at [Five Forks](#) and [Saylor's Creek](#), and only 1 officer and 60 men surrendered in April, 1865. The field officers were Colonels Joseph Mayo, Jr. and Roger A. Pryor; and Lieutenant Colonels Alexander D. Callcoote, William H. Pryor, and Joseph V. Scott.

ESTIMATED CASUALTIES: 84 total (US 76; CS 8;)

DESCRIPTION: This was the first land battle in Virginia. Maj. Gen. Benjamin F. Butler sent converging columns from Hampton and Newport News against advanced Confederate outposts at Little and Big Bethel. Confederates abandoned Little Bethel and fell back to their entrenchments behind Brick Kiln Creek, near Big Bethel Church. The Federals, under immediate command of Brig. Gen. Ebenezer Pierce, pursued, attacked frontally along the road, and were repulsed. Crossing downstream, the 5th New York Zouaves attempted to turn the Confederate left flank, but were repulsed. Unit commander Col. T. Wynthrop was killed. The Union forces were disorganized and retired, returning to Hampton and Newport News. The Confederates suffered 1 killed, 7 wounded.

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

Magruder, John B.

BIO: In 1861, Magruder was commissioned as a brigadier general in the Confederate service. He was quickly promoted to major general. He commanded Confederate forces at Yorktown, Virginia, with great skill. However, his lack of aggressiveness during the Seven Days campaign led to his reassignment to the command of the District of Texas, New Mexico, and Arizona. His greatest success was his brilliant performance in the Battle of Galveston on January 1, 1863, which resulted in a temporary lift of the Union blockade. In August 1864, he was transferred to the command of the Department of Arkansas. On March 31, 1865, Confederate president Jefferson Davis returned Magruder to the command of the District of Texas, New Mexico, and Arizona, but only in time to witness the surrender of the Trans-Mississippi Department at Galveston on June 2, 1865.

Malvern Hill

This was the sixth and last of the Seven Days' Battles. On July 1, 1862, Gen. Robert E. Lee launched a series of disjointed assaults on the nearly impregnable Union position on Malvern Hill. The Confederates suffered more than 5,300 casualties without gaining an inch of ground. Despite his victory, McClellan withdrew to entrench at Harrison's Landing on James River, where his army was protected by gunboats. This ended the Peninsula Campaign. When McClellan's army ceased to threaten Richmond, Lee sent Jackson to operate against Maj. Gen. John Pope's army along the Rapidan River, thus initiating the Northern Virginia Campaign.

Virginia Confederate Rosters Index

- Overview (from Library of Virginia)
- This is an index to a collection of unofficial rosters of soldiers from Virginia who served in the military forces of the Confederate States of America during the Civil War.
- These rosters represent the work of the Department of Confederate Military Records and its predecessor, the Office of the Secretary of Virginia Military Records, from 1904 until 1918.
- The rosters provide the name of the soldier, rank, date of enlistment or commission, and sometimes remarks including killed in battle, captured, etc. Each record also indicates the source of the indexed information and microfilm reel number.

- Overview (from Library of Virginia)
- Admiral Augustus O. Wright, at the urging of fellow members of the United Confederate Veterans, led an initiative in 1921 to obtain military records of approximately 6,000 men who served in the Confederate States Navy.
- The lack of surviving original Confederate naval records, and the fact that no Compiled Military Service Records were abstracted for either Union or Confederate naval personnel, compounded the difficulties faced by veterans and their dependents trying to secure state pensions.
- Wright's successful efforts garnered support from eight southern legislatures and included a correspondence campaign to contact all surviving naval veterans to record their recollections of military service.







John Spoon, Escambia County's Last Civil War Veteran, Is Dead

Commander, Camp Ward
Succumbs At Brent At
Age Of 97

The end for which he waited without apprehension for years came yesterday for Comdr. John E. Spoon, last surviving member of Camp Ward No. 10, United Confederate Veterans, and believed to have been the last Civil War veteran living in Escambia county. He died Sunday morning at Brent at the age of 97 and had been active until an illness a short while ago. Death was attributed to old age.

Recalled Experiences

Although he buried the hatchet years ago over issues of the conflict in which he fought, he loved to recall his experiences which took him into Escambia county from Alabama during the war and ended with his discharge at Meridian, Miss., after serving in battles at Pensacola and Spanish Fort.

Daughters of the Confederacy, who called on Commander Spoon on special holidays in honor of the South's heroes, held their last celebration with him last July, when he observed his birthday by getting dressed in his gray uniform and recounting stirring days during the Battle of Shiloh.

Survivors include his third wife, Mrs. Fannie Spoon; two daughters, Mrs. Laura Berry and Mrs. Dora Rowe; two grandchildren, F. H. and John C. Berry, and two great grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held in his Brent home at 11 a. m. Monday with the Rev. I. I. Roberts officiating. Burial will be in Clopton cemetery with the following acting as pallbearers: active, F. H. Berry, J. C. Berry, Lewis Clopton, Elbert King, Richard Jernigan, Lamar Rawson; honorary, Frank Johnson, Frank Coskrey, C. S. Angel, Joe Barker, Frank Westmark and J. A. Odom.

Postmaster 41 Years

The veteran had been postmaster at Brent for 41 years and station agent for the Louisville and Nash-

continued. He was born in Chambers county in Alabama and spent his boyhood in the mountain section of East Alabama.

Soon after his first wife's death, which occurred two months after he had married her at the age of 20, he joined the Confederate forces at Montgomery, later going in a company under command of former

of the 17th regiment. This regiment was ordered to Pensacola where it attempted to take Fort Pickens at the time of the bombardment in 1861.
