**Third Treaty of San Ildefonso**

- Broke from wars, Spain and France made a trade in 1800 through the Third Treaty of San Ildefonso.
- Spain gave Louisiana to France in return for the Italian duchy of Parma.
- Napoleon envisioned using Louisiana as the "breadbasket" for French Caribbean islands, but France lost control over Haiti whose revolution began in 1791.
- The United States was worried about access to the Mississippi River.

**Treaty of Aranjuez**

- The 1801 Treaty of Aranjuez clarified that this was a restoration not retrocession on the premise that France never officially gave any part of Florida to Spain

**Louisiana Purchase**

- In 1803, Jefferson sent Robert Livingston and James Monroe to France to purchase New Orleans and West Florida for \$10 million
- In desperate need of funds, France sold the vast Louisiana territory (828,000 square miles) to the United States in 1803 for \$15 million

**The Parish System**

- In 1804, the Legislative Council divided Louisiana territory into 12 counties
  - Orleans, German Coast, Acadia, LaFourche, Iberville, Pointe Coupee, Concordia, Atakapas, Opelousas, Rapides, Natchitoches and Ouachita
- In 1807 the territorial legislature adopted the parish system and created 19 parishes (local government districts)
- By 1816, the term "parish" started appearing on U.S. maps

**1810 Revolution**

- On 23 September 1810, American rebels under the command of Philemon Thomas attacked Fort San Carlos in Baton Rouge
- After gaining control of the fort, the flag of the new Republic of West Florida was raised. This was a declaration of independence from Spain.

**Florida Parishes**

- In 1810, the United States annexed the Florida parishes east of the Mississippi River from Spain, which were previously part of the Republic of West Florida
- The parishes were the following:
  - East Baton Rouge
  - East Feliciana
  - Livingston

  - St. Tammany
  - Tangipahoa
  - Washington
  - West Feliciana

**Statehood**

- On 30 April 1812, Louisiana was admitted to the Union as the 18th state
- Louisiana was admitted as a "slave state"
- The state consisted of the Territory of Orleans, as well as the Florida parishes

### Battle of New Orleans

- Fought on 8 January 1815
- Part of the five-month Gulf Campaign where Britain tried to take New Orleans, West Florida, and Louisiana Territory
- Took place 15 days after the signing of the Treaty of Ghent, which formally ended War of 1812
- Victory for the United States

### The GU272



- Debts were mounting from the construction and maintenance of Georgetown College.
- The most valuable assets held by the college were their enslaved persons.
- On June 19, 1838, the Jesuits signed a contract with Louisiana sugar plantation owners Jesse Batey and Henry Johnson. This contract included the names of 272 enslaved persons.
- The sale raised \$115,000, equivalent to about \$3.3 million today.

### Slavery Legislation Changes

- In 1857, Louisiana banned individual manumissions by enslavers. This required court or legislative intervention.
- Officially abolished in the portion of the state under Union Control in 1864 by the state constitution

**The Occupation of New Orleans**

- In 1862, the city of New Orleans was captured by Union forces during the American Civil War
- This was a turning point in the war due to the control of access to the Mississippi River and the Gulf of Mexico

**Reconstruction**

- Reconstruction Acts of 1867
  - Black men were registered to vote
  - New constitutional conventions
- State Constitution of 1868
  - First to contain a bill of rights
  - Enfranchised freed men
  - Disfranchised ex-rebels
  - Integrated public schools
  - Property rights of married women
  - Gave pension to veterans of War of 1812

**Early Parish Records**

- Statewide registration of birth and deaths did not start until 1911
- Orleans parish started recording births in 1790 and deaths in 1804
- Some parishes started recording vital records in the late 1800's. They are filed with the parish clerk of the court.
  - Exception: Orleans Parish vital records are filed with the Office of Public Health
- Microfilmed copies can be found in FamilySearch under the Parish>Vital Records category

**Divorce Records**

- Granted by the Louisiana Legislature 1805-1846
  - The records are found in printed copies of the Legislative Calendar and Official Journal.
  - These are available at university and public libraries in Louisiana.
- Starting in 1827, district courts in Louisiana parishes and the parish court of Orleans parish were given jurisdiction to oversee divorce cases.
  - Records are filed with the clerk of the court of each parish.
  - FamilySearch has Orleans Parish divorce records 1813-1924.

**Adoption Records**

- Pre-1900's adoptions, contact the clerk of the Circuit Court in the parish where the adoption took place
- Post 1900's, adoption records are sealed and confidential. A court order is required to unseal.
- In 2022, HB450 was passed allowing any Louisiana-born person over age 24 the right to obtain their original birth certificate

Wherefore prays that he be ordered to answer this demand of her judgment of Three Thousand Dollars he rendered against him, & costs of suit.





**Louisiana Civil War Service Records of Confederate Soldiers, 1861-1865**

Confederate service records of soldiers who served in organizations from Louisiana. The records include a jacket-envelope for each soldier, labeled with his name, his rank, and the unit in which he served. The jacket-envelope typically contains card abstracts of entries relating to the soldier as found in original muster rolls, returns, rosters, payrolls, appointment books, hospital registers, Union prison registers and rolls, parole rolls, inspection reports, and the originals of any papers relating solely to the particular soldier. For each military unit the service records are arranged alphabetically by the soldier's surname. The Military Unit field may also display the surname range (A-G) as found on the microfilm. ## Southern Claims Commission Files

- Allowed claims by Southerners to file for reimbursement if they met the following criteria:
  - Proof of loss of property
  - Supported the Union during the Civil War
  - Did not provide any assistance to the Confederates
  - Resident of the following states: Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, West Virginia
- Records are held at the National Archives in Washington, D.C.
  - Some files are digitized in the catalog
