How we got here

1673	Louis Jolliet and Jacques Marquette explore the Mississippi River.
1682	René-Robert Cavelier, sieur de La Salle, claims the Mississippi basin for France. He calls the territory <i>La Louisiane</i> .
1716	Fort St. Jean Baptiste is established as the first permanent settlement in what will become the state of Louisiana.
1718	Jean-Baptiste Le Moyne de Bienville founds New Orleans.

Where we are going

1719 The first enslaved Africans are brought to Louisiana. Five years later, the Code Noir establishes rules for the colony's enslaved people as well as its population of free people of color.

1721 German immigrants settle outside of New Orleans in what will become known as the German Coast.

1762 The Treaty of Fontainebleau gives much of colonial Louisiana to Spain.

1765-70 Acadians who had been expelled from Canada settle outside of New Orleans.

1768 French Creoles revolt against Spanish rule.

1769 Alejandro O'Reilly takes control of Louisiana.

1770s Isleños, immigrants from the Canary Islands, begin to arrive in Louisiana.

1790s Haitian immigrants arrive in the colony.

1795 The Treaty of San Lorenzo gave Americans the opportunity to bring goods to New Orleans to sell and trade.

1800 Spain returns Louisiana to France in the Third Treaty of San Ildefonso.

9 September 1788: Quit-claim, Dlle. Augustine Porche, of major age, declaring she received of Augustin Porche, her brother, a Negresse brute Julie, Macua, about 16, for the 524 piastres he owed her.

29 November 1788: Charles La Chiapella to Baptiste Porche, Negre brut, Thiamba, about 25, for 360 pounds of good indigo.

29 November 1788: Charles La Chiapella to Vincent Porche, Negre brut, Thiamba, about 25, for 350 pounds of good indigo.

3 December 1788: Pierre Sauvé of New Orleans to Joseph Decuir, for 1580 pounds of good indigo: one Negress about 16; two young Negro boys about 10; one Negro of unknown nation, about 16, knowing only that he comes from Portuguese Africa. All of the above from the cargo of the brig Catherine, captained by Magdona. Another Negro, Nago [nation], about 18, from the cargo of the schooner La Louisianne, captained by Carrie.

22 May 1790: Obligation. Baptiste Porche and Marianne Langlois, his wife, favor of Julien Poydras, 647 piastres for purchase of mulatto Honore and other goods. Security: Negro Michel, Bambara, about 30; Negress Rose, Macua [Macua], about 18, and her creole daughter Eugenie, about 1; Negress, Macua nation, about 30, and her daughter Francoise, 3.

Unfortunately, the Catholic registers of Fort Kehl were destroyed. The Lutheran registers of Fort Kehl begin in 1560 and are continuous; however, the name of Johann Georg POCH or BOCK was not found. The 1724 census provides an approximate date of birth in 1686 for Johann Georg POCH.¹⁴¹¹ His wife was born about ten years later, as her age at the time of her death in 1746 was given as 50 years. As there was a ten-year age difference between Johann Georg POCH and his wife and also as there was only one nursing infant in 1724, the question is raised as to whether this was his second wife. Considering that the Catholic registers of Fort Kehl have been lost, the answer may never be known.

Jean George POUCH, his wife and 1 child, of "Calisbourg," were listed aboard the ship, La Saone, in 1721.¹⁴¹²

The first encounter with the family in Louisiana was on the 1724 census¹⁴¹³ of the German village of Hoffen:

No. 4: Jean Georges POCH, 38, native of Golcper at one league from Fort Kehl and from Strasbourg, weaver by occupation, Roman Catholic; his wife; a nursing infant; one and a half arpents of terrain on which he is since two years. He harvested about five quarts of rice.

On January 1, 1726, on the census of the German village, there appeared Jean George PECK, wife, & 1 child, with associate.¹⁴¹⁴ Eighteen months later, on July 1, 1727, the family of Jean Georges PICH, German brewer, wife, and 2 children were residing on the Rue du Quay in New Orleans.¹⁴¹⁵

On the census dated 1731 Jean Georges POK, wife, 3 children, and 1 male capable of bearing arms were enumerated at the German villages.¹⁴¹⁶ On yet another list of landowners after 1731, Jean George POQUE was found to be residing on land that he claimed by possession.¹⁴¹⁷

By 1741, Johann Georg POCH and his family had moved from the German Coast to Pointe Coupee.¹⁴¹⁸ A general census of Pointe Coupee was taken on December 20, 1745 which recorded that Jean George PAUQUE, age 70 years,¹⁴¹⁹ Marie Catherine QISELIN, his wife, age 54 years, and Martin, their son, age 14 years, were residents.



The *Le Bon Papa* left France, led by Captain Pelletier, on Tuesday, May 10. The 280 ton ship made the trip in 80 days, arriving in Louisiana on July 29, 1785. 15 families (156 people on board). Three additional families had signed up for the trip but failed to report at the departure. One child died on the trip.

After arriving in New Orleans, the group increased by 12 (3 births, and 9 deaths) and decreased by 13 (10 died, and 3 deserted). There were 38 family groupings with time to settle down: 37 of them settled in the area around St. Gabriel along the Mississippi River, and 1 family chose to settle along Bayou Lafourche.





In 1792, one finds at New Orleans André Bouquet, a former soldier in the Bourbon regiment who had been living in Saint-Domingue since 1788. Remaining a bachelor, he had practiced the trades of ironsmith and gunsmith. He would not establish permanent residency in Louisiana. In 1804, he was in Veracruz, Mexico.

Denis-Gaston *dit* Saint-Léonard, from Saint-Léonard in Limousin,¹³⁷ established in Saint-Domingue since 1780, left for Louisiana in 1793 with his mistress, a woman of color. He did not stay long, for he was in Cuba in 1803.¹³⁸

In late 1792 or early 1793, Mme de Gripière departed for New Orleans with her child and her mother, Mme d'Anglade. This departure was more like a chartered cruise than a hurried escape, but it took considerable wrangling to persuade the captain of the coastal schooner, who was planning to sail along the southern coast, near Cavaillon, to embark the five or six slaves who wanted to accompany Mme de Gripière. Their baggage included several barrels of coffee.¹³⁹

Louis Duclot escaped "during the slave uprising," probably after the fire in Cap-Français on June 21, 1793. A printer and engraver, he moved to New Orleans, where, with the governor's permission, he published the *Moniteur de la Louisiane*, whose first edition is dated March 3, 1794. It was Louisiana's first newspaper. He was associated in 1796 with J.-B. Lesueur-Fontaine whom he had first known in Cap-Français and who had first been a refugee in New York.¹⁴⁰

The deponent, being first sworn, deposeth and saith:

That about 25 years ago this deponent received an order from Mr. Declouet to put the father of the claimant in possession of the land claimed, which he did and the father of the said claimant with his family resided thereon a year and half, when he left this country for the purpose of collecting a large sum of money which was due him in the U.S.; that previous to his going away he removed his family to Opelousas where some of his relatives resided; that the father of the said claimant was never heard of after he left the country; that Mrs. Hays, the mother of the claimants, always claimed the said land, and about thirteen years ago sent a man with one of her sons to take possession of the same, but they were prohibited therefrom by Jacob Hepper who also claims the said land and was then residing thereon; that when the father of the said claimant left this country he put a man in possession of said land who resided thereon two years and a half as his tenant, who, after the expiration of that time, removed from the same having no inducement longer to continue thereon.

Land claims

No. 49.—JOSEPH LANDRY claims a tract of land, situate on the west side of the river Mississippi, in the county of Acadia, containing six arpents fifteen toises and two feet in front, and forty arpents in depth, and bounded on the upper side by land of Estevan Landry, and on the lower by land of Silvain Leblanc.

This land was surveyed by Don Louis Andry, in the year 1774, in favor of the claimant, who obtained a complete grant for the same, in 1775, from Governor Unzaga. Confirmed.

No. 50.—JOSEPH LANDRY claims a tract of land situate on the west side of the river Mississippi in the county of Acadia, containing five arpents sixteen toises and five feet in front, and forty arpents in depth, and bounded on the upper side by land of Joseph Babin, and on the lower by land of the claimant.

This land was surveyed by Don Louis Andry, in the year 1774, in favor of Estevan Landry, who obtained a complete grant for the same, in 1775, from Governor Unzaga. The present claimant holds by purchase, under the title of the grantee. Confirmed.

No. 51.—JOSEPH LANDRY claims a tract of land being the second depth of forty arpents, situate immediately behind the two preceding tracts mentioned in Nos. 49 and 50; claimed by him, and bounded on the upper and lower sides by vacant lands.

This second depth of forty arpents was surveyed by Don Carlos Trudeau, in the year 1791, in favor of the claimant, who obtained a complete grant for the same in the same year from Don Estevan Miro, then Governor. Confirmed.


