| Pertinent information about individual | <p>I submitted primary source information about Dr. Fifield to the Indiana Historical Bureau during the application process for a 2025 Historical Marker. Dr. Michella Marino, IHB Deputy Director and Historian has verified all my research. There are many gaps as Dr. Fifield was a "lost heroine" and is buried in an unmarked grave. I can send you the document when I applied for the IHB marker as well as evidence submitted in August for a VA CW marker because of finding five U.S. Army hospital muster rolls. The research I have done is considerable and I am organizing in anticipation of the November SLC trip. Birth: Dr. Marino and I believe Almira was born in New Hampshire in 1833 to Thomas Hale and Alice Fifield of Enfield NH. She is confused on the Internet with another Almira Fifield of Salem MA born in 1836. 1. 1850 U.S. Federal Census in Valparaiso IN (age 17). 2. ? NH birth certificate for an unnamed female with Fifield father, Canadian. A genealogical proof needs to be done. 2. Valparaiso Republic March 19, 1863 Obituary has information regarding her teaching and her decision to go to medical school in Boston. She graduated from the New England Female Medical College in Boston in 1859. The founder, Samuel Gregory, was a member of Congregational Church. Her family has a strong history of Congregationalism in Enfield, N.H. I am exploring the family network for this angle. 3. A letter written by Rep Schuyler Colfax to Dorothea Dix, Administrator of Arm Nurses, advocating for her to serve with the 9th Indiana Infantry Regiment after the Battle of Cheat Mountain in December 1862. 4. Five US Army hospital muster rolls. She was not allowed to use her M.D. but was placed as a nurse female. (Of the 19 known women M.D.s, only Mary Walker who is now on a quarter was allowed to use her M.D. credential) 5. Jane C.B. Hoge, Associate Administrator of the Chicago Sanitary Commission describes "Miss Fifield" in her Boys in Blue Book.</p> |
| Specific question(s) or goal(s) for consultation | <p>1. Is the February 26, 1833 New Hampshire birth record Almira Fifield? 2. Why did 24 yo unmarried Almira Fifield go to medical school in Boston in 1857? 3. What was the Fifield family and friends network in Wheeler, Union Township, Porter County IN that links to Chicago area and Bureau County IL? (I spent five days in Bureau Co and Porter Co this summer. Family oral histories describe the family as believing in abolition, temperance and women's rights. There is a strange family connection with Annie Wittenmyer, the first president of the Women's Christian Temperance Union). 4. Where was Dr. Fifield between her graduation in March 1859 and December 1861? The Valparaiso newspapers announced she placed to set up practice, but Dr. Marino and I cannot find her.</p> |

I believe this is actually from a piece of a doc at RIHS and actually pertains to ABIGAL Briggs. First Families state he is the son of John Briggs & Sibyl Chase. The Briggs & Chase families intermarry many times over the centuries. I strongly feel it's more likely he was born in the Freetown/Berkely area. This is where James Chase and family lived. He is the parent whose daughters married the Briggs boys (As you know MA/RI borders overlapped). Conclusively, he had a brother named Ebenezer(1758-1807), born in Freetown, MA- unknown parentage. Ebenezer married Diadema Chase, sister of Abial's wife. Both brothers were loyalists who went to NB in 1784 ish. He died in Jacksonville NB in 1844. He married Elizabeth Chase, formerly of Freetown, MA) around 1788 in New Brunswick. Old Church records also mention Phebe, and show a baptism of her along with Abial & children in 1796 waterborough Anglican church. |
| Specific question(s) or goal(s) for consultation | 1) who were his parents? 2)where was he born? 3) what is the relationship between the Briggs & Chase families. How do I determine the answers to these questions. How do I find out more than I know? |

| Pertinent Information 2 | Adeline was born, according to my great grandmother on 26 April 1850. According to her son, George, she was born in St. Simon PQ. Her death certificate indicates Montreal. This is the crux of my search. She and my great great grandfather, Georges Cardarette (1848-1894, also PQ) were itinerant at best, never staying anywhere long. They married sometime around d the time she was 15- 1865-1867. I cannot find where, whether it was in Quebec or US. Their first son George Maurice was born in Exeter NH one 17 Jul 1867, Their second son was born 13 Aug 1869 in South Berwick Maine. Joseph Morris was my great grandfather. Their first daughter, Emily Lena was born in Hallowell(on an aside, I am not certain as they recorded many of the births in Hallowell- including Georges(the father), although I've sourced his baptism in St. Rosalie, PQ. Emily Lena died in 1912 in Tewksbury at the state hospital. Following was a set of fraternal twins, Mackie and Julia, both of whom died not long after birth in 1872. Adeline was born and died in 1874. Frederick Louis was born in Hallowell 28 Mar 1875 and lived in Brockton, MA as an adult. Willie was born 1 Jan 1877 and died 7 Dec 1877 in Clinton, MA. Alice May was born in Hallowell on 25 Dec 1878 and lived until 1923. Philip Samuel cam net, he was born also in Hallowell on 14 May 1881. I have not found his death record. Annie Lavigne was born 18 Jan 1883 in Hallowell, Maine. She lived in Revere, MA as an adult and died in 1960. Victor Arthur was born 15 May 1885 in Augusta Maine, he settled around NYC and lived until 1941. Albert was Victor's twin; he passed in 1972. Eva Della followed, She was born in Winthrop, ME and lived three years until 1889. Joseph was born as a fraternal twin with Jennie, who lived until 1893. Joseph is someone I have no information on. These twins were born in Somersworth, NH. After the death of her husband, Adeline lived in Somersworth, Manchester NH, Lynn, MA, and Boston. She may have been living in Chelsea at the time of her death. |

| Pertinent information about individual | Optional spellings: Lindsley-Linzey-Lindsay-Zephanah *There is also a Zephaniah Jr born 1852 1816 NY - 1865 MI; the only "proof" of his death date is the 1890 Veteran's Census filled out by his 2nd wife/widow Sophia. No one has yet to find definite who his father/mother are. I believe it is Allen Lindsay (1772-1872 NY) and Amy Brown (? RI? - 1822 NY/RI). This was taken from Margaret Lindsey's book The Lindsey's of America. Unfortunately Allen died after Zephaniah so there are no will/probate records that would name him, but I need to look again to see if any grandchildren were listed. I have found at least one deed for a mortgage from Allen to Zephaniah, but no relationship is stated. I also want to be able to find his children, specifically prove/disprove that his son is Samuel Lindsley (1844 NY-1911 WI) with wife Eve Stickler (no dates/places.) Others have listed Archibald W Lindsay (1821-1887) as the father of Zephaniah, but I feel comfortable that is not correct based on dates/census, etc. I have yet to find any census post-1850 where I might find him listed and his name does not come up when doing a search of newspapers, etc. |
| Specific question(s) or goal(s) for consultation | 1) Help me solve the missing "man in the middle" between Samuel Lindsay and Allen Lindsay-is it Zephaniah? Is Samuel Lindsley's father someone else? 2) Help me learn how to use American Ancestors better |

| Pertinent Information 2 | Margaret was born in Oxford, Johnstown, Canada on 19 Aug 1844 and baptized 13 Sep 1844 in Oxford, Johnstown, Canada. Information per Canada, Wesleyan Methodist Baptismal Register, 1828-1910 from website rootsweb.com In the 1851 Canadian Census she was in Grenville, Canada West (Ontario) Canada living with her parents Thomas (1800-1876) and Margaret (Irwin/Irvin/Ervin)(1808-1889) Brown and siblings James, Jane, George, Thomas Jr, John, Elizabeth (Eliza), William, Samuel E, Alexander, Mary Ann, and Charlotte. **Charlotte later married Zephaniah Lindsley Jr, son of the subject of my consultation 1, Zephaniah Lindsley** On 21 Jun 1860, Margaret was in the US Census living in Marion, Ogle, Illinois, in the residence of Robert Zimmerman, as a servant. On 1 June 1865, Margaret was in the US Census living in Ashland, Dodge, Minnesota. She was Margaret Lindsay, living with Samuel (inferred husband) and Merrit (inferred son.) The 1870 US Census she was living in Kasson, Dodge, Minnesota. Wife to Sam'l Lindsley with children Merit, Edwin, Nellie (Willie) and Robert. We have found in township records the birth of her daughter Emma on 4 Jul 1871 in Dodge County MN and son Irvin (Manley) born 25 Apr 1873 in Ashland Twp, Dodge County MN. The 1 May 1875 Ashland, Dodge, MN census shows the family as: Samuel (head of house); Margaret; Merrit; Eddie; Willie; Robert and Irvin. Township records show on 16 Jun 1876, Ashland Twp, Dodge County, MN the birth of son James Marshall. A newspaper item from the Dodge Center (MN) |

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| | Press dated 07 Jun 1878 stated: "The funeral of Mrs. Lindsley was held at the M.E. Church last Sunday at the hour of the regular morning service. A large procession followed the remains to Riverside Cemetery." She would have been 34. No further records or information has been found. Note: township birth records for James and Irvin were found recorded after Margaret's death date. Her name was listed as "Sarah." |

Peter had two sons, Peter Jr. (b. 1776) and died 05 Aug 1856 in New Lebanon. There is an 1856 will for Peter Barker Jr in Columbia County, NY. Peter Sr. also had a son named Reuben. Members of this Peter Barker family are buried in the Barker Cemetery (burying ground) at Barker Farm in New Lebanon, NY. |
