Biographical Sketch of Alexander Denniston

The ancestor of the Denniston family was Alexander Denniston, the brother-in-law of Charles Clinton, who with many of his friends and neighbors, all being Scotch Presbyterians, and tired of the exactions and demands of the crown, emigrated from the town of Edgeworth, county of Longford, Ireland, in the early summer of 1729. After a long, tedious voyage of nearly five months, they landed on Cape Cod; thence two years later they came to Little Britain. A family legend is, that these pioneers stood upon a hilltop about two miles northeast of Washingtonville and called the land in sight to the north, Little Britain, and there they settled. Alexander had six sons, James, George, Alexander, William, John, Charles, and four daughters. They were all stern patriots devoted to their country. The father was a member of Colonel Ellison's New Windsor regiment in 1738, and on frontier service in 1755. The six sons were all members of the Third Ulster County regiment, which was called out many times during the dark days of the Revolution. Two were members

Biographical Sketch of John McCarthy



JOHN McCARTHY, Little Rock township farmer, has made his home on the farm where he now resides ever since he was seven years of age. He is a native of the city of Boston, where he was born Jan. 9, 1873, the son of the late Dennis McCarthy and Catherine (Collins) McCarthy.


It was on the first day of April, 1880, that the family arrived in Adrian as members of the Irish Catholic Colonization association, determined to make their future homes in Nobles county. The father bought the south-east quarter of section 17, Little Rock township, and that has been the family home ever since.

Dennis McCarthy was born in the county of Cork, Ireland, on Christmas day, 1840, and resided in his native land until 24 years of age, engaging in farming. He arrived in the new world Aug. 15, 1864, and located in Boston, where he worked at the paving business. He was united in marriage at Boston on Feb. 19, 1865, to Catherine Collins, who survives her husband and resides on the Little Rock farm. To them were born the following children: Dannie, Nellie, Mary, John and Dennis. The first three named are deceased. The other two reside with their








UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (Wilkinsonville). —The Associate Church, to which the Sutton United Presbyterian congregation first belonged, was originally a secession from the church or kirk of Scotland in the year 1733, and was known as the Seceders' Church. The original founders of the Sutton United Presbyterian congregation were families from the province of Ulster, Londonderry County, Ireland; and were from their earliest associations trained up in the Presbyterian faith, and when here, longed for the church of their choice, in which their children could be taught the Shorter Catechism, and otherwise instructed in the distinctive principles of that faith which they had carried with them from their homeland beyond the seas.

John Noonan, 59, a prosperous farmer of Great Barrington, died very suddenly of heart trouble this morning, while seated in his sleigh in front of Mr. Adams' feed store in that town.

By a singular coincidence, Miss Julia Noonan, a sister of the deceased, died suddenly of the same malady a year ago Monday, being found dead in bed.

Mr. Noonan had driven to Great Barrington this morning from his farm at Three Mile Hill to take his daughter, Miss Marion Noonan, to the Searles school where she is a teacher in the seventh grade, and two other children, Mabel and John to the Justin Dewey school, where they are pupils. On his way back he stopped at Mr. Adams' store and sat in his sleigh waiting while the clerks were filling his order for four bags of grain. Three of the bags had been put into the vehicle and the clerks went after the remaining bag. When they returned a few moments later, Mr. Noonan was found unconscious leaning partly out of the sleigh, his close proximity to the side of the building alone preventing him from falling to the ground.

He was taken into the office and Dr. Beebe was summoned. When the latter arrived, however, Mr. Noonan was dead. The physician after an examination of the body gave heart disease as the undoubted cause of death. Undertaker Maloney took charge of the body and prepared it for burial.

Mr. Noonan was a native of Ireland and formerly lived in New Marlboro where he was engaged in farming. Some years ago he sold his farm in that town to Ponsby Ogle of England and moved to Great Barrington where he bought the farm he has since conducted. He was married to Miss McCaughey of New Marlboro who survives him as do four children, Miss Marion, Miss Mabel, James and John Noonan. The deceased also leaves two brothers-in-law, Rev. William McCaughey of St. Mary's church of Spencer and Rev. John McCaughey of St. Paul's church of Warren. The funeral arrangements have not been made.





Introduction

The records of Brennan's Select™ Community Funeral Homes & Crematorium capture the descendants of many of the immigrant families that arrived in Saint John and the surrounding area in the mid nineteenth century. In particular through complete transcription of the records from 1901-1960 it became evident that many of these records consisted of individuals with Irish origins. It should also be noted that in its early years Brennan's Funeral Home dealt largely with Protestant clients.

For the purposes of this site the only individuals included are those confirmed as Irish through the presence of the terms "Irish" and/or "Ireland" within one or more of the following fields: *comment*, *place of birth*, *birth place of father*, and *birth place of mother*. It should be noted that record keepers at the funeral home did not always include the terms "Irish" or "Ireland" in an Irish individual's entry. The subset presented in this website represents only 1,136 of 32,221 records in the full database. Therefore, to view the records of other possible Irish individuals, whose origin was not denoted in any field but whose surname may denote the Emerald Isle, and everyone else buried through Brennan's, users should access the full database.

ANTHONY O'SULLIVAN,
Grand Secretary, 1852 to 1867.

R. W. Brother Anthony O'Sullivan, the eleventh Grand Secretary, was born in the County of Kerry, Ireland, on November 29, 1808. He came to America in 1838, landing in New York City, where he remained a year, then moved to New Orleans and on March 17, 1841, he located at Arrow Rock, Missouri, where he lived until 1852 when he removed to St. Louis; eight years later he took up his residence in Springfield,

Missouri, remaining there several years before returning to St. Louis.

He was made a Master Mason in Arrow Rock Lodge No. 55 June 20, 1846; made a Royal Arch Mason in Boonville Chapter No. 5 in 1849, received the Cryptic Degrees in Boonville and was Knighted in St. Louis Commandery No. 1, K. T., August 1, 1852. He received the degrees of A, and A. S. R. in 1859 and was Sovereign Grand Inspector General of the Thirty-Third Degree for Missouri and the bordering States.

He served as High Priest of St. Louis Chapter No. 8 R. A. M. from 1853 to 1859; was the first Master of St. Louis Council No. 1 R. and S. M., and at the organization of the Grand Council, in 1864, he became the first Grand Master serving three years. He was Commander of St. Louis Commandery No. 1 K. T. and assisted in forming the Grand Commandery of Missouri, May 22, 1860. In the Grand Chapter R. A. M. he served as Grand Secretary from 1854 up to his death. In the Grand Commandery, K. T., he was elected Grand Recorder in 1863 and died in office.

He first appeared in the Grand Lodge, at the annual Session of 1849, as the representative of Arrow Rock Lodge No. 55. He was elected Grand Secretary in 1852 and served for fifteen years.

He died in St. Louis August 11, 1866, from cholera, aged fifty-eight years. The Grand Lodge erected a monument to his memory at his grave in Bellefontaine Cemetery in 1868. The oration was delivered by M. W. Brother Thomas E. Garrett. Thus passed away, possibly, the Greatest Grand Secretary that ever served the Grand Lodge of Missouri.


