



- Expansion into Connecticut
- New England settlers and Pequot Indians
- Major battle: Fort Mystic May 26, 1637



King Philip's War: 1675-1676

- First full scale New England war in the 17th c.
- Metacomet (aka) King Philip and the Wampanoag Indians
- Plymouth Colony, Rhode Island, Western Mass., and beyond

How as much as the Narraganset Indians are deeply affected in the
present bloody outrages of the Barbarous Natives, that are in open
hostility with the English, this appearing by their harbouring the
actors thereof, poisoning & murdering their women, children
& wounded men, & detaining them in their custody, not with-
standing the covenant made by their sachons to deliver them
to the English, and^{as} is credibly reported they have killed and
taken away many cattle from the English their neighbours
and did for sundry days seize & keep under a strong guard Mr
Smiths house & family, and at the news of the victory that
the Indians had over the English at or near Hadley did in
a very reproachfull & blasphemous manner triumph and
rejoice thereat. The Commission^{ers} do agree & determine

The Petition of Joshua Ray of Salem

Humbly sheweth that yo^r Petitioner's brother in law namely Cap^t Sathrop and yo^r Petitioner's son in law namely Samuell Stephens were both slain in the wars by the Indians: and Both their families - as well as his owne have dependant on yo^r Petitioner for helpe and supplies: and he hath but onely one son to yeild him assistance in the management of the affaires of the said three families - and now his said son is prest to goe out in this Expedition against the Indians: But his said son was not prest at Salem: out at Newbery for yo^r Petitioner had sent his said son together with one Thomas Haines to look after some business of his daughter Stephens at Newbery: and they were both prest by the officers at Newbery now the said Haines hath under his care and management the concerns of a Brother of his that now lies wounded at Road Island: and also of a neighbour and friend that lyeth in Garrison at Hadley and if he be forced to goe into the wars his friends concerns must unavoidably suffer: as well as his owne: who being a smallster hath a great quantity of the said goods under hand which will be all spoiled and Lost if he be forced to leave it: And moreover the officers of Newbery have provided no Armes for the said persons prest by them as afores^d: but the Major Gen^l as well as Capt^l Gorish did advise them to make their applications to yo^r Hon^{ble} not doubting but yo^r Hon^{ble} would grant them redress

Yo^r Petitioner therefore humbly requests the favour of yo^r Hon^{ble} to consider the petitioners and to grant yo^r Petitioner's son namely Samuell Ray and the said Thomas Haines a dismission from this present Expedition and service so shall yo^r Petitioner and the said persons be ever Engaged to yo^r Hon^{ble}

Sir William Phips' Expedition October 1690



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To his excellency S^r William Phips Knight Governour of the Massachusetts Bay &c in New-England; and Honourable Council, and to the worshipfull Representatives, sitting now in general Court.

The Humble petition of Edward Willy in behalfe of himselfe, soldiers, and Seamen, concerned with him; in the voyage to Cannada.

Humble sheweth unto yo^r excellency and Honor, that in the said voyage yo^r petitioner in the River of Cannada coming home; did with his company and souldiers aboard the botch stratornities; meet with a French barque, bound to Quibbeck; which was attacked and brought a prize, unto the Honourable Sir William Phips, who then was in the river, who ordered Roger Stanor his boat swaine, to command her, in her voyage, with whom my Ensigne and four souldiers being aboard; came to the Isle of Shoales, where she was run ashore, though the lardo (excepting salt) most part, with the rigging saved, but imbrilled by the Command^r; and no pail to the value of Twenty Shillings came to the hands of yo^r petitioner, or those concerned in taking her; either of what was botwixt rocks, or in heule; The Ensigne and souldiers losing their cloaths, and armes, and ever since receiving no satisfaction for them by armes, or what was brought from the Isle of Shoales to Boston; which was Two hundred and Thirty odd barrells of ff Lowe, and powder, with some of the ships armes; and other things, to what value yo^r petitioners know not, was committed to the dispose and care of Major Elisha Hutchinson, for the use of the Country and all others concerned. and yet no satisfaction given yo^r petitioner, for one Majesty of what was in her, brought hither, which yo^r petitioners humbly suppose to belong to them.

yo^r petitioners Therefore humbly prayeth, that you will order; that the proportion of what the said goods was sold for, may be delivred unto yo^r petitioners, or some other person, for the use of him, and others concerned with him, and other guns (or fire-locks) may be ordered, the men who left them; in the service of the Country on board the said prize.

and yo^r Petitioners, shall as in duty bound, for yo^r Excellency; and the Honourable General Court ever pray.

- St. Augustine attacked 1702 and 1704
- French naval action Charleston in 1706



The Humble Petition of Elizabeth Riley ^{formerly} ~~Wainford~~ Wainford,
to the Hon^{ble} Council & Representatives Assembled at Boston July 30th 1701

Humble sheweth that my Son Nicolas Wainford served his Majesty five
Weeks, one week under Lov^t Francis Perkins, & about one month under
Cap^t James Frey of Andover, about three yeares past, & have not Received
the wages due to me for sd service: I desired Cap^t Frey to take up the money
for my use, but hee deferred Demanding of it, untill the Commission^s of War
who were at that time Employed: their time was expired, that Cap^t Frey could not get
a Discharge for me: these are therefore humbly to Crave, that the Commission^{ers}
of War may be Commissioned to Grant sd money, when Cap^t Frey doth make
It appear what time my Son served his Majesty & yett Petition shall
over pray.

War of Jenkins' Ear: 1739-1742

- Capt. Robert Jenkin's displayed severed ear by the Spanish led to war being declared.
- St. Augustine was attacked by Georgia in 1740.
- Spanish attack St. Simon's Island.



King George's War: 1740-1748

- Key battle: Fortress Louisburg on Cape Breton in modern day Nova Scotia, 1745
- 1748, return of fortress to French control



French and Indian War

- “Seven years war” over boundary disputes between English colonists and French
- Recapture of Fortress Louisbourg in 1759
- Many British soldiers would later fight against the crown in Revolution



By the honorable William Greene, Esq. Governor & Captain General, in & over his Majesty's Colony of Rhode Island, and Providence Plantations in New-England in America.

To Elephelt Fullbrook, Gentleman, Greeting.

You Elephelt Fullbrook being by the general Assembly of this Colony elected & chosen to the place & Office of Cornet of the Troop of Horse in the County of Providence in the Colony aforesaid, are hereby in his Majesty's Name, George the Second, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, France & Ireland King, Defender of the Faith, &c. authorized, empowered, and commissioned, to assume the Office of Cornet of the Troop of Horse aforesaid, and to command, guide, and conduct the same, or any Part thereof, and in Case of any Invasion or Assault of a Common Enemy to infect & disturb these his Majesty's Plantations, you are to alarm and gather together the Troop under your Command, or any Part thereof, as you shall deem sufficient, and with them to the utmost of your Skill and Ability, you are to resist, repulse, repel, kill, and destroy them, in order to preserve the Interest of his Majesty and his good Subjects in these Parts. You are also to follow such further Instructions and Directions as shall from Time to Time be further given forth, either from the general Assembly, the Governor, and general Council, or your other Superior Officers. And for so doing this Commission shall be your full Power, Warrant & Discharge.

Given under my Hand, and the Seal of the Colony aforesaid the eight Day of September in the Twenty fifth year of his Majesty's Reign, James Dn. 1755.


