The person in question ('Dunbar') was probably born prior to 1800 in Scotland - assuming somewhere in Ayrshire. According to a Scotlands People birth document, the father's first name was obviously whited out (!! ) and his last name is listed as Dunbar. It states the son, named William (1819-1862), was "born out of wedlock". In the same statement, William's mother is clearly named Ann McKenna (1789-1862). This newborn son - my 2nd Great Grandfather - William, was born on 04 Oct 1819 & Baptized 20 Feb 1820. William's last name on all documents I've seen after that, is recorded as Barr. As do the names of all his descendants including my Great Grandmother, Jane Barr.

Johann Berger and related family (Gallaschick and Kloss-Klose)

Johann Berger was born in abt. 1794 in Haynau, Schlesien, Prussia and probably died Bef. 1826 in Neisse, Schlesien, Prussia.

Note: My Berger, Gallaschick and Kloss families definitely lived in Silesia (Schlesien) since before the Napoleonic wars, but I am not sure how far back they go in the region. Most of the region was under Prussia since the mid-18th century, and I have only traced my ancestors back to about 1790. This region now belongs mostly to Poland and the names of towns have changed, although most are similar to what they were in German times.

I can provide a list of many cities where the families lived in German and Polish.

Unteroffizier Johann Berger married Henriette Kloss (or Klose). Henriette Kloss was born abt. 1790 in Raschau, Oppeln, Schlesien, Prussia and is deceased.

Johann Gottlieb Debschuetz-Henriette Kloss wedding in Breslau Garrison June 1826 mentions bride is widow of Gottlob Berger (stassenplaneur from Gros Beckern, Liegnitz)...maybe the same person??? Haynau is near Goldberg and Liegnitz-and -about 18 km from Gros Beckern, the town associated with the strassenplaneur Berger whose widow (Henriette Kloss) married Johann Gottlieb Doebenschutz in 1826.

Children of Johann Berger and Henriette Kloss are:

1. Auguste Berger born Abt. 1811 in Neisse, Schlesien, Prussia and died 23 Apr 1814 in Neisse.
2. Gottlieb Heinrich Eduard Berger born 22 Aug 1813 in Neisse, Schlesien, Prussia.
3. Louise Johanne Amalia Berger born 25 May 1816 in Neisse and died 23 Mar 1817 in Neisse.
4. Carl Heinrich Theodor Berger born 20 Dec 1817 in Neisse, Schlesien, Prussia; died betw 1872 and 1899 in Baden-Wurttemberg.
5. Julius Gottlieb Fritz Wilhelm Berger was born 28 Jun 1819 in Neisse and died 9 May 1820 in Neisse.
6. Carl Robert Berger was born on 18 Mar 1821 in Neisse and died in May 1890 in Breslau, Germany.

Lokomotivfuehrer Carl Robert Berger married Johanne Rosine Juliane Gallaschick on 17 Feb 1846 in Breslau, Schlesien, Prussia. Johanne Rosine Juliane Gallaschick was born 7 Jul 1824 in Ohlau, Schlesien, Prussia and died 2 Apr 1897 in Kothnerstrasse 60, Lissa, Posen, Germany. She was the child of Johann Gallaschick and Johanne Juliane Sophie Kloss.

Children of Carl Robert Berger and Johanne Rosine Juliane Gallaschick are:

1. Carl Paul Friedrich Berger was born 15 Sep 1846 in Breslau or Brieg, Schlesien, Prussia and died 20 Aug 1910 in Hanover or York, PA
2. Julia "Julchen" Berger [Koslitz] was born 17 Aug 1849 in Brieg, Germany and died 2 Feb 1905 in Cosel, Schlesien, Prussia.
3. Theodor Wilhelm Alois Friedrich Berger was born 21 Mar 1850 in Brieg, Schlesien, Prussia and died Abt. 1908 in Breslau, Germany.
4. Emilie Bertha Clara Antonie Berger [1-Nowak; 2-Urban] was born 18 Aug 1851 in Neisse, Schlesien, Prussia and died 17 Apr 1930 in Lauban, Germany.
5. Hermine Helene Agnes Berger was born on 1 Mar 1853 in Neisse, Schlesien, Prusisa and died 18 May 1938 in Deutsch Lissa, Breslau, Schlesien, Germany. Her mother had died at her home.
6. Ida Bertha Emilie Berger was born 24 Aug 1856 in Breslau, Germany and is deceased.
7. Paul Johannes Hugo Ferdinand Berger [married Bertha Funke] was born 24 Jun 1858 in Breslau and died 28 Dec 1934 in Breslau.
8. Marie "Mike" Berger was born Abt. 1859 in Breslau, Germany and is deceased. No records have been found.
9. Pauline Auguste Louise Berger [Liehr] was born 7 Apr 1860 in Breslau and is deceased. Her mother died at her home on Deutsch Lissa.

10. Sophie Anna Auguste Berger [von Poleski] was born on 2 Jul 1861 in Breslau, Germany and died on 23 Jul 1907 in New York City.
  11. Alexander Gottwald Georg Berger [married 1-Zugmantel; 2-Heine] was born 20 Oct 1862 in Breslau and died on 13 Jan 1940 in Breslau.
  12. Conrad Franz Oskar Berger [married Emma Kambach] was born 22 Aug 1867 in Breslau and died 14 Jul 1948 in Amberg, Bavaria, Germany. Grandchildren of Franz Berger's daughter Elly Elfriede Marie Berger [Schult] were born in Breslau before the war (Eva and Ulrich Schult) and in East Germany, near Dresden, after the war. I have been in touch with them, but they did not know that their great grandfather Franz Berger had any siblings.

Specific question(s) or goals for consultations:

I would like to trace the Berger, Gallaschick and Kloss families back to the early 18th century, starting from confirmation of Johann Berger from Haynau and finding records of his birth and family. If I can find likely records and copy them, I can review them at home later, due to the challenges of reading the old script. I do have some background in German language and the old script, but probably not enough to work with newspaper articles.

I am also trying to find records for Thomas Edward Jordan (see below), who was reportedly born in Dublin, Ireland and died in Mendota, IL in 1888, and his sister, Mary, who was born in Carrick Fergus, Ireland in 1811 (according to her death certificate), married Henry Cooper (also born in Ireland) in Rutherglen, Scotland in 1836, moved to Illinois around 1880 and died in Mendota, IL in 1888. All but one of the 7 Jordan-Cooper children I have found also immigrated to the US, starting with Paul Henry Cooper, who arrived in 1858 when he was 17 years old and lived and worked with Thomas Jordan.

For Johann Berger and related families, I have searched and made use of sources available on the internet through Ancestry, FamilySearch, Polish Archives, GenWiki/CompGen, Geneteka, Matricula, My Heritage, Poznan Project, Archive.org, the Martin Opitz Library, Family Tree DNA and other DNA sources.

For Thomas Edward Jordan, I have used primarily Ancestry and Family Search sources. I have also gotten some help from the IRAD/Regional History Center of Northern Illinois University and the LaSalle County Genealogy Guild. I have searched some through the National Archives website, but found it very difficult to use and could not get any records I did not have from other sources.

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**Q18**

Any additional comments:

Though Family Tree DNA's Big-Y DNA tests of my father and brother (both named Jere Berger), the closest relatives I found are of Czech origin, and the common ancestor is probably from the early 1700s. The surnames of the most closely related men are not Berger, so there is probably either illegitimacy or adoption, or the use of "house names" (a Czech custom) in the background. The area where I have found paper trails (Silesia) was under Bohemian and Hapsburg rule in the past, and areas where my ancestors live are close to modern day Czechia and Slovakia. The family was primarily Lutheran, but there are many marriages with Catholics.

I have some background in German language and the old script, but probably not enough to work with newspaper articles.

I am also interested in researching Thomas Edward Jordan, specifically his arrival, military career, land ownership, naturalization (if relevant), death records, birth records in Ireland and information on Mary Jordan Cooper, who was probably his sister. He was reportedly born in Dublin, Ireland in 1814 and served in the US Army at Fort Leavenworth around 1838 (this last was reported in a short bio he wrote). He then moved to Weston, Platte County, MO, and moved to IL around 1844. He married Margaret Hopson who was born in Casteltown Delvin, Westmeath, Ireland in 1831. They were all Protestants. Jordan died in Mendota, IL 15 April 1888. There is another Thomas Edward Jordan that some people (including archives) confuse with my relative.

Christopher was born in England, W England about 1739. He lived in New Cornwall, Orange County, New York in 1790. In 1795, he and his family migrated to Upper Canada. The family included Christopher's wife, daughter, grand-daughter whose mother was deceased and also includes his sons of age. In Heirs and Devisees Land Claim packet, affidavits state that Christopher's sons are Jeremiah (b abt 1758), Henry (b abt 1774) and Peter (b abt 1775). Peter was born in New Jersey. The birthplaces of Jeremiah and Henry are unknown. The wife, daughter and grand-daughter are unknown. Christopher was a foundry worker. Christopher's will was written in 1799 in Escott, Leeds County, Ontario, Canada. Christopher was a nominee of the Crown for land in 1795. Christopher died abt 1809.

My research geography is British North America. The Christopher Trickey profile includes census data as available 1790 US but no 1790-1810 Canada census info. The profile includes Christopher's will as included in the Heirs and Devisees Land Claim packet in which affidavits show Christopher's birth place, estimated age, and children. The History of Orange county provides tax assessment info for Christopher in 1775 in Goshen (District 4) and New York in the Revolution and Ancestry provides information regarding Christopher's service during the revolutionary war.

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**Q7**

Any additional comments for Question 1:

I think it's important to determine the relationship between Christopher, William and Jeremiah who appear in the 1790 census, in New Cornwall, Orange county, New York. I believe if I can determine these relationships, I may be able to unravel more of the family story, Christopher's story, in early Colonial America. I know that Christopher and his family, with sons Henry and Peter, ended up as "late" loyalists in Upper Canada abt. 1795. In fact, there are 23 Trickeys listed on a single page in the 1851 Census of Canada. Is this a rabbit hole? How do I document these relationships? Among those 23 Trickeys is an Isaac Trickey. In an attempt to begin to understand relationships, I've started an Isaac tree because I have documentation that Isaac is the son of William Trickey. I'd like to understand Rhonda's viewpoint on this. Is this a rabbit hole?

In 1980, my aunt spoke with William John Allen (son of Charles Allen & wife Martha Campbell); John was extremely evasive when it came to his father's ancestry but said Charles' father was George Allen.

In the early 1990s, my grandmother (granddaughter of Charles Allen) told me the father of Charles Allen was George Allen; she said that George was married to a "Marida Bowman" (illegible on her handwritten note to me--could she mean "Matilda"?). In another note, she wrote that Abigail Fowler m. George Allen who was killed in the Civil War & buried in the South. As a widow, she married Charles Ethridge.

Abigail seemed to disappear between 1850 census (listing Abigail Fowler) and July 1870 census listing Abigail "Allen" in household of her parents as well as 2 children, Horace & Edmund Allen--3 yrs & 1 yr. Abigail apparently married Charles Ethridge later that year or in 1871 & had children with him.

I find that Abigail was at least 14 when Charles was born and she always said she was a year older than her real age (Censuses vs. birth record). I feel like she disappeared between 1850-1870 & reappeared as Abigail Allen with a son, Charles Allen, whose father died in the War. I suspect that she bore a child by George Allen while he was married and disappeared for a few years to make it look decent. By the time George died in the War, his wife Matilda (Heath) and their kids moved to Oneida county & she remarried a Vaughn. Maybe I'm overthinking this--I realize it's possible that I have this completely wrong and have gone down a rabbit hole and can't find other possibilities.

Flora Cameron (27 Jul 1858 – 7 Feb 1944) was born on Cape Breton Island, Nova Scotia, in 1858. Her parents were probably Alexander Cameron (1830-1872) and Jessie (McLeod) Cameron McIntosh (1833-1930), both born in Nova Scotia. Flora came to the United States about 1878 according to a US Census. She married William Freeman Cornell (1843-1906) about 1880. They lived in New London, Connecticut for the remainder of their lives. William originally came from Provincetown, Massachusetts and had been married to a woman named Elizabeth Flora Dutton (1849-1914). He had two sons by that marriage. They appear to have divorced around 1875, but other than a "Bed and Board" notice in a Provincetown paper, there is record of a divorce that has been found.

  4. Who is Jenny Freeman (1880 - ?), who appears in the 1940s as a daughter of Flora Cornell in an obituary for her from 1944 and as the sister of Thomas Cornell (1883-1955)? There is no reference to her in any other document other than an 1880 census when she was newborn. No mention was ever made of her by anyone that I am aware of. Flora also supposedly had 8 children, but only 7 are accounted for, suggesting Jenny is the missing child. This is the only evidence that Jenny was the natural daughter of William and Flora. However, there is circumstantial evidence that she may have been raised by her aunt and uncle, Edna Cornell Freeman (1857-1921; William Cornell's sister) and her husband Nathaniel Thomas Freeman (1856-1932). After the Freemans had both died, she appears to have then claimed that Flora was her mother. Did the Cornells give her to the Freemans as an infant to be raised?

I am descended from a Thomas Cornell (1699? – 1756) who originally lived in Hempstead and Jamaica on Long Island in the early 1700s, but later moved to Beekman, Dutchess County, New York. He married Anatje Wiltsie (1702-1755) and they had several children. We are descended from his son John Cornell (1726-1760). This Cornell family, as far as I can determine has no relationship to another New York Cornell family, the one documented in the Rev. John Cornell's 1902 book entitled *Genealogy of the Cornell Family: Being an Account of the Descendants of Thomas Cornell of Boston, Mass., Portsmouth, R. I., and Cornell's Neck, (N.Y. New York: Press of T.A. Wright, 1902)*. This is the Cornell family that included several prominent New Yorkers, including Ezra Cornell of Western Union and Cornell University fame. Nonetheless, a story continues to circulate that Thomas Cornell is somehow related to this family, although there is precious little evidence offered for it. The most common one is that a woman name Mary Houkes/Hukes (1676-1759) married Richard Cornell (1785-1787) and that Thomas Cornell is their son. In the *New York Genealogical and Biographical Record (Vol. 41, 1910)*, the Reverend Cornell published a query, seeking help from other genealogists.

QUERY: Cornell – Would like to know the ancestry of Thomas Cornell, b. 1699, supposed son of Richard, Jr. and Mary Hukes, he m. Anntie Wiltse (dau. Of Martin Wiltsea), in the Dutch Church, Jamaica, L.I. Children: Jan (bap 1721), Anatie Tammes (or Thomas), Elizabeth, Caterin, Hendrik and Mary. – John Cornell.

To my knowledge, he never received a reply.

The 1810 Federal census for Buffalo, Niagara County, NY lists a "J Dunikin" with 1 male under 10, 1 male 16 to 25 and 1 female 16 to 25. This could be Daniel with his father "J" and mother. Henry Ketchum is listed two entries below "J Dunikin" in the 1810 Buffalo Census so that may be how Daniel ended up with Henry Ketchum. I have extensive records for Daniel Dunakin but have not found any other records for his assumed parents.

There was also a "Samuel Dunakin" in Buffalo during the same time period. Samuel made a down payment on land in May, 1810, wrote Joseph Ellicott sometime around then and had a letter at the Buffalo post office in July 1813. Samuel filed suit against Samuel Edsall for assault on September 6, 1813 and died the same month, age 25. There is no record of Samuel Dunakin in the 1810 Federal Census.

Per her obit and family tradition, her family was from Schenectady.

On 21 Aug 1839 St Joseph Co., MI, Centreville, she married Daniel Hogan (13 Nov 1801 NY - 6 Jul 1879 TX.). They appear to have no prior connection in NY.

She was his second wife.

Daniel had been in Jackson MI before moving to St Joseph Co., MI where records are in both Centreville, which is the county seat and Colon twp.

In 1840 census Daniel's Colon household has a woman 40-50 (1790-1800)- Might be Catharine's mother, as his is already dcd.

In 1850 mortality census for St Joseph Co., MI, Colon is an Elizabeth Menderse (transcribed as Menduse) widowed, aged 65 b NY (ca 1785) died in May. The regular census was in July—no older woman is in Daniel's Colon household now. Cant find a grave or other info for Elizabeth, but I believe it is possible that she is Catharine's mother.

Per my grandfather's notes, Catharine had a sister Sarah who married a Dexter.

In Schenectady newspapers in spring 1842 - Miss SH Mynderse has a letter at the post office, and in Oct 1847 is a marriage notice for Sarah H Mynderse "formerly of this city" marrying Smith H Dexter in MI. The MI record for their marriage states her residence as St Joseph Co, Centreville. I have tracked Dexter family, census, graves etc, they move to Illinois, but end up not adding more to the story after her marriage although I believe this is Catharine's sister. This Sarah was 9-10 yrs ygr than Catharine.

Daniel and Catharine moved their family from MI to central TX betw Aug 1853 and Sept 1854 where they spent the rest of their lives. According to my grandfather, Catharine was very proud of her Mynderse family and it was said that her uncles were Drs and Lawyers, and that there were still doctors in the younger generation.

Mynderse/Myndertsen/Meindertse - many variations -an old Dutch family -the earliest two brothers, Myndert and Carsten were blacksmiths/armors. Combinations of Frederickse (their father's given name), van Iveren (from whence they came) and Mynderse can be found as surnames. Carsten's line seems to have taken the Frederickse name. Many of the Mynderse lines in America seem to come from the brother Myndert. In Beverwyck originally, migrated around upstate NY.

I have focused research on the Schenectady Mynderse family and one line, not from Schenectady, but who also show up in St. Joseph Michigan. The prominent Mynderse family in Schenectady, founded by Johannes, son of the original Myndert—was in Schenectady for 3-4 generations before Catharine is born. Many Schenectady males closer to Catharine's time can be eliminated for specific, concrete reasons—provided the information I have is correct.

Some researchers place Catherine as dau of Dr. Barent I Mynderse and Catherine Douw van Dyck of Schenectady, but they don't appear to have had any children, though age-wise he and his two brothers could be candidates. Dr. Barent I. was made guardian of his brother Aaron's only son, Barent A, who also became a doctor. Aaron's daughters are identified in his estate papers, and his wife's will—are not Catharine or Sarah. As an aside, Barent A's son also became a doctor.

The third brother, Simon, has much confusing information per other researchers, and even published histories. He appears to have served in militia around 1812-1814/15, gotten into some trouble regarding his discharge. Some researchers say he used the name van Iveren, and married an Elizabeth Davis. There is a Davis family in the area, but I haven't found a marriage record. Some researchers state they had 4 ch and give names but no dates or other info, but none are Catharine or Sarah. There is a Simon Mynderse in 1820 Schenectady in Ward 1, the only other Mynderse there are Nancy (his widowed mother with whom single brother Aaron lives), and brother Barent I in Ward 2. Cant find Simon's family after that. In Schenectady newspaper obit index I found a Simon Mynderse with date 29 Aug 1832, but have not been able to locate a copy of the newspaper to see if the obit gives any other information. If he was

married to Elizabeth, she could be the widow who died in MI in 1850.

Alternately, the other line I have focused on is a Col Wilhelmus Mynderse of Seneca NY, who along with his oldest son, William C, show up in St Joseph Michigan petitioner records in 1829, and Wilhelmus buying several pieces of land there in 1835. Daniel is in Jackson MI by 1830 and in St Joseph by 1832. Catharine does not have a clear connection to these people, other than being the only other Mynderse in St Joseph at that time. She is not in Col Wilhelmus' will, but he does leave his Michigan land to son Wm C. I cant find information about Wm C marrying or having any children though he could conceivably be father to Catharine age-wise, and Col Wilhelmus' younger sons by second wife are all born in the same decade as Catharine so are not candidates. I have thought to track down wills of relatives mentioned in Wilhelmus' will on the chance that Catharine and Sarah might be referenced but haven't done so at this time. They are not mentioned in the other children's wills that I have found.

After Wilhelmus died in 1838, I can't find William C in 1840 or 1850 census in either MI or NY, and no evidence he ever went to Texas —where Daniel and Catharine go in 1854. In 1860 and 1870 William C is in MI living alone or as a boarder, but now in Wayne county (several counties east of St Joseph) where he dies alone paralyzed in the alms house in 1877. I cant find a will.

Though all of the above has nearly sucked the life out of me, I want to find Catharine's parents so I can take the line further back, hopefully to the colonist ancestor. Until the marriages and the mortality census, Catharine, Sarah and Elizabeth don't appear in MI records that I have found. Per the family history and Sarah's confirmed connection to Schenectady, I hypothesize that Elizabeth is Simon's widow, and they are the parents of Catharine and Sarah, but there are information holes. Also, two or three women alone together are not likely to just show up in a developing wilderness area without a support system. The Schenectady line and Wilhelmus line are several generations away from their common ancestor. The Schenectady line was established about 1700 when it was still a part of Albany, and Wilhelmus was from Albany and an early settler in Seneca about 1797. Schenectady and Seneca are not very near one another so while it is possible, I question that the Mynderse women from Schenectady had much relationship with the Seneca Mynderses.

William H Duncomb b ca 1794 per age on gravestone -(YOB per 1820 census 1755-1794, in 1830 and 1840 census is 1790-1800). He first appears in a newspaper listing of Letters at the post office in Saratoga Co., NY Ballston Spa in Oct 1817. His middle initial of H is established in censuses, land records, newspaper, and tombstone. I hypothesize that it stands for Henry because William's son, Moses my direct ancestor, names his own oldest son William Henry.

Wm H continues to be found in Saratoga county mostly twp of Greenfield, but also Ballston Spa through 1826. Additionally, Civil War records for son Moses state Moses was born (1822) in Saratoga Co.

By 1830 census William H is in Washington county NY, White Creek where he lives out his life. He continues to be found in some Saratoga records, and in Rensselaer county records while living in Washington County.

William's first wife is Lavina unk with whom he had son Moses and several unk daughters per censuses. Lavina died 1830 in Washington Co, she and William are buried in Rosewood Cem in WA co.

After Lavina died, William married Phebe Gooding from Rensselaer Co, NY, Hoosick, and had two additional children. After Wm H's death in 1841 Phebe returns to Hoosick with the three youngest children (the youngest child from the first marriage remained with Phebe and her two ch for the rest of their lives, none of them married). The Gooding family had also lived in Washington County earlier. Hoosick in Rensselaer county is only about 10 miles from White Creek in Washington County, so it wasn't a big move. Phebe never remarried.

General consensus amongst his heirs, is that Wm H was born CT. Per 1880 census William H's four known surviving children give his POB as CT. Alternately, one son has an additional record giving contradictory information—in one place gives Wm's POB as CT and in another gives the POB as MA in the same document.

Information from sons in each marriage, Moses and Burris, state that William H was a blacksmith, and son Moses himself was a blacksmith. I have wondered if this trade might be a tool in helping pinpoint the line.

The only other Duncombs in Saratoga around the time William H shows up there are:

Nancy Ann Duncomb listed as having a letter at Saratoga PO in 1809, the only time she appears in records there. She is likely Nancy b ca 1789 see below CT Duncombs.

And Moses b ca 1790 (before William's son Moses was born) receiving letters at Saratoga PO beginning in 1811. Moses 1790 married Sarah Oliphant in Saratoga co in 1812 and appears in deeds and other records there for some time, including being in several deeds with William H. So there is a clear connection betw Wm H and Moses 1790 in Saratoga.

Per other researchers Nancy Duncomb went to Canada in 1813, believed to have gone there after her father died in CT.

Moses 1790 is confirmed moving between Canada and Saratoga a couple of times before moving to Michigan where he died.

Nancy Ann Duncomb, Spinster, and Moses are found in Ancaster twp, Ontario Canada records in late 18-teens and early 1820s, and Nancy is found witnessing several records for Moses and his wife Sarah. So there is a clear connectons betw Nancy and Moses, who are believed to be from a Fairfield CT line of Duncombs (see below). I propose that William H, Moses and Nancy are siblings.

The CT Duncombs

Charles Duncomb Sr was b 1713 in England and is believed to have arrived possibly in Boston ca 1731. By 1736 he is in CT records. Charles Sr the colonist had at least 5 sons and possibly 7, though some of the info is pretty sketchy. After studying the oldest sons and a couple of the oldest sons of the oldest sons, I have narrowed down which CT Duncomb lines Wm H could belong to, including Nancy and Moses' family. Many descendants of Charles colonist eliminate for specific concrete reasons—mostly because some of the families are very well documented, and sometimes because they are having children at the same time that Wm H, Moses and

Nancy are being born and those three are not included as children in those families or conflict with existing confirmed children. In some cases wills or other documents eliminate the probability of parentage but I don't have wills for all involved. Charles the colonist's second and third sons are the most likely candidates, with second son William being the primary candidate.

Second son, William b 1749,— has a dau called Nanne born ca 1788 in Stratford CT Vital records and is likely the Spinster Nancy in Saratoga and Ancaster Canada. I have tracked her in various records, but don't know when or where she died. Many researchers place Moses 1790 in this family too. There is confusing info about the family —Wm 1749 married at least twice and some but not all of his kids are documented in Fairfield Co., CT vital records. There are some marriage records, some death records, and some children's birth records, but not consistent or complete records for anyone. Several sons moved to NY but not Saratoga, and from there to Canada and PA. William 1749 did not leave CT himself and a couple of his sons stayed in CT as well. In betw the listed children, William H could easily fit and based on the known or projected DOBs for them, Nancy, Moses and William H could have been born in that order 1789, 1790 and 1794. So it seems like a strong circumstantial case but there is not proof. I have not found a will for William 1749. And no other researchers put William H in this family.

Third son of Charles the colonist is John who could be candidate age-wise, and there do seem to be some gaps between the children researchers assign to him, though adding William H here would make him the youngest ch of a woman born 1753. This John's oldest son John was b 1768 so is also age-wise a possibility but I have no info for him but YOB. John Sr is listed as Armourer in Capt David Hawley's company payroll list so there is possible blacksmith connection. But in general the family is fairly well documented. They are found in in Redding area of Fairfield Co CT where many are buried for several generations so it doesn't seem like they ventured away much. I don't think these are really candidates, but may need more exploration. Also, because there seems to be link between William H and Moses and Nancy, and because their ages work and the general confusion with the family allows the connection---that seems the stronger possibility to me.

The only place researchers put William H is as the only child of Charles colonist's fourth son Thomas. Thomas' birth is established in records but no other records for him exist and some people think he died young. No one ventures a wife or other children. These all seem like red flags against Thomas as Wm H parent. Thomas gets confused with his nephew, the son Thomas of one of his siblings, --to the point that some researchers give this Thomas the date and place of death of the nephew Thomas ---who is in a family that is very well documented. I believe that Thomas son of Charles colonist probably did die young so could not be the father of William H.

The final possibilities are two unconfirmed sons of Charles the colonist named Silas and Denis. They are not in vital records with the other children and are not given even speculative DOBs. They seem to be added by some rresaerchers based on what I consider a questionable link—just the fact that they have the Duncomb surname and served in the RW in MA and NY respectively. I cant find anything else for either of these guys except their scant military records. They didn't apply for pension and are not found in census records anyplace, or land records that I could find. They have no link that I could find to any of these other people. Since it isn't even clear who these guys are and where they lived, I consider them a long shot.

However, I am sure there was a relationship. Charles was the first to settle in Mornington as he is Ontario the 1851 census. The names Robert, William and George do not appear until 1861. However, they all settled in Mornington Township near each other. Charles lived at Lot 16 Concession 3, which is the NE corner of the 3rd concession and the Poole-Millbank road. George settled across the road and north Ontario Lot 15 Concession 3 & 4. William's farm was Lot 12 Concession 4 and William's first son to take up land Ontario his own was John, who bought Lot 12 Concession 7. Therefore, the farms of William and his son were one road west of the farms of George and Charles."

Written by Don Holmes: "Charles Magwood & Jane Pinkburn first appeared in SW Ontario in the 1851 census of Mornington Township, Perth County. This site is located about 20 miles north of Stratford or 100 miles west of Toronto. The family of Charles and Jane were born in Quebec (Lori notes many in Ontario, but I understand the two provinces were mixed together in early days) during the period of the 1830-1850s's. There is a history of Magwoods being in Quebec from that time. During the 1850's the families of William & George Magwood also moved to Mornington. George Magwood and his wife Margaret Farrell are my great-grandparents. From oral family history it is stated that they married & emigrated about 1845 and first went to Quebec in the Ottawa area and later moved to Flamborough, near Hamilton, Ontario and then to Mornington. **They were from the hamlet of Roslea which lies on the border of Counties Fermanagh & Monahan, Ireland, in the Parish of Clones.**

The Parish of Clones is one of the few Irish parishes whose records have survived. I have seen the parish records back to 1700 from the Mormon Church microfilms and I am satisfied that the records of George & Margaret are contained therein. However the records are not consistent enough to trace accurately beyond about 1800. There are undoubtedly others of the Magwood name in Ireland but their records seem to be lost.

Some family writings say Charles was born in Belfast, where the family emigrated from England, but they have only sailed from there to Canada.

A person named Marmont Lodge of Ireland wrote the following on the Magwood message board of genealogy.com: There is a strong Magwood presence Ontario the Fermanagh - Monaghan Border - mostly Presbyterian, but several were Faith Mission, Anglican & even Methodist. The families that I know lived near Roslea, County Fermanagh but attended Churches in County Monaghan.

## Obituary

About 3 o'clock Saturday morning, Jan. 8, 1905, Mrs. John Myles, Sr., was stricken with paralysis caused by the rupture of a blood vessel in the brain which terminated in her death the following morning, Sunday, Jan. 8, 1905. She was unconscious from the first and although everything was done that medical skill and kind friends do, it was all of no avail.


Mrs. Myles was born in the county of Donegal, Ireland, in June 1840, and removed to Glasgow, Scotland, with her parents when about two years old. They remained there until she was about ten years of age, when they emigrated to Ontario, Canada. Her parents and their family consisting of 4 boys and 3 girls, were among the earliest settlers of Western Ontario, settling there in 1850. On Nov. 5, 1859, she was married to John Myles, to which union were born 15 children, of which 13 lived to group into manhood and womanhood, viz: Mrs. H. Elliott of Allanford, Ont., Mrs. John McCann, Mrs. R Brander, Mrs. Jas. Townsend, Mrs. S. M. Nichol, Mrs. W. Halls, and Mrs. Hugh Nichol, of this county, and Mrs. Roy Collard of Lyleton, Man. The boys are, the late Walter Myles of Palmerston, Ont., Andrew, John, Robert, and Henry. The family were all present at the time of her death with the exception of Mrs. Elliot and Mrs. Halls.

Mrs. Myles came to this country in 1890, leaving her old home and braving the hardships of frontier life for the sake of being near her family. She was a good neighbor, a faithful wife, and fond mother and will be mourned by the community as well as by her family.

The funeral occurred Monday, the interment taking place at the Mountain View cemetery. ---Contributed.
