Google Books

- Offers digitized books in varying degrees of accessibility:
 - Read – a book out of copyright that you can usually download a complete PDF of
 - Preview – a book that is under copyright, and likely for purchase, but you can see pages of it and search it
 - Snippet – a book that is unavailable digitally but at least you know it exists



of the more than two thousand employment applications received by New York's Society for the Encouragement of Faithful Domestic Servants' employment registry (Strasser 1982, 164–65). In 1840, one Irishman reported that it seemed to him that he had met at least a thousand female Irish domestics in Boston (Adams 1980, 224). American writer Asenath Nicholson indicated that not only had she employed Irish women as servants when she lived in New York City, but she also intended to meet their parents during her stay in Ireland (1847, 86). And Irish-born author Mary Sadlier set *Bessy Conway; or, The Irish Girl in America* (1861), her American novel concerning an ideal Irish domestic servant in New York City, in the period immediately preceding the Famine.¹ In addition, volume 1 of the records of New York City's Emigrant Industrial Savings Bank shows that around 19 percent (37 of 191) of the depositors who were Irish-born females working in some form of private domestic service came to the United States between 1816 and May 1845—in other words, before the Famine (Rich 2000).

Over time, a culture of emigration took root in Ireland in which “the
