Hearth Tax 1691-1695

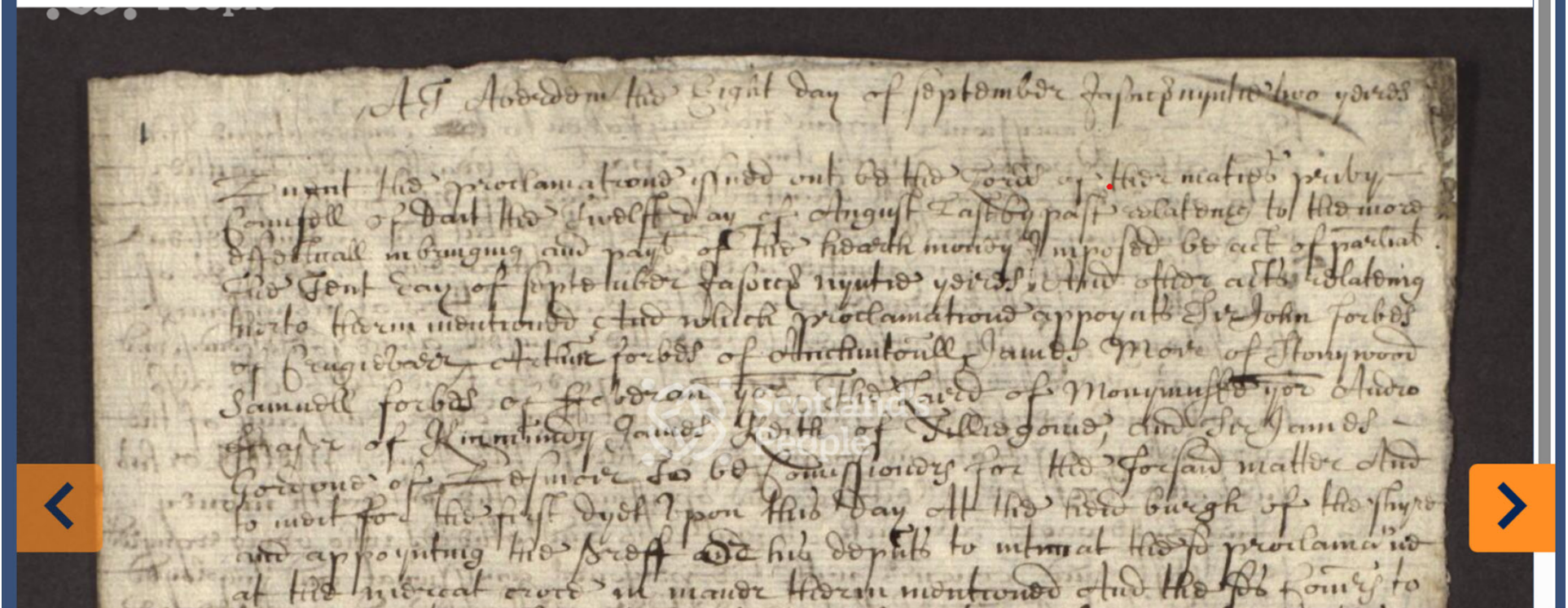
A tax of 14 shillings on every hearth in the kingdom by both landowners and tenants to raise money for the army, collected between 1691 and 1695. Hospitals and paupers were exempt from the tax. Hearth lists are arranged by county and then by parish or landed estate. This tax indicates the size of the house. While most county hearth lists contain lists of householders, some counties only give the total number of hearths and money collected in each parish or estate and a small number of counties do not have hearth lists.

Poll Tax (1694-1698)

Poll tax rolls, 1694-1698 Poll taxes were imposed in 1694, 1695 and twice in 1698 to pay off the debts and arrears of the army and navy. Payment was graduated at the rate of 6 shillings and upwards according to rank and means; only the poor and children under 16 were exempt. The collectors of the poll tax faced similar difficulties to those of the hearth tax and the records are incomplete. Arranged by county and parish, the amount of information provided varies from list to list.

1755 Population of Scotland

- ‘An account of the number of people in Scotland in the year seventeen hundred and fifty-five by Alexander Webster, one of the ministers of Edinburgh’ gives a total of 1,265,380 which is regarded as the most credible estimate of the Scottish population prior to 1801. (Webster’s Account of the Population of Scotland in 1755)
- Ministers in 909 parishes were asked to provide information about:
 - the extent of their parish
 - the numbers of ministers, Roman Catholics and Protestants
 - the total number of inhabitants
 - the number of fighting men (aged between 18 and 56)
 - the ages of the inhabitants

Cart Tax (1785-1798)



- The owners of two, three, or four wheeled carts in Scotland were taxed. The tax fell upon mostly farmers and landowners in rural communities and those carters who in the villages.

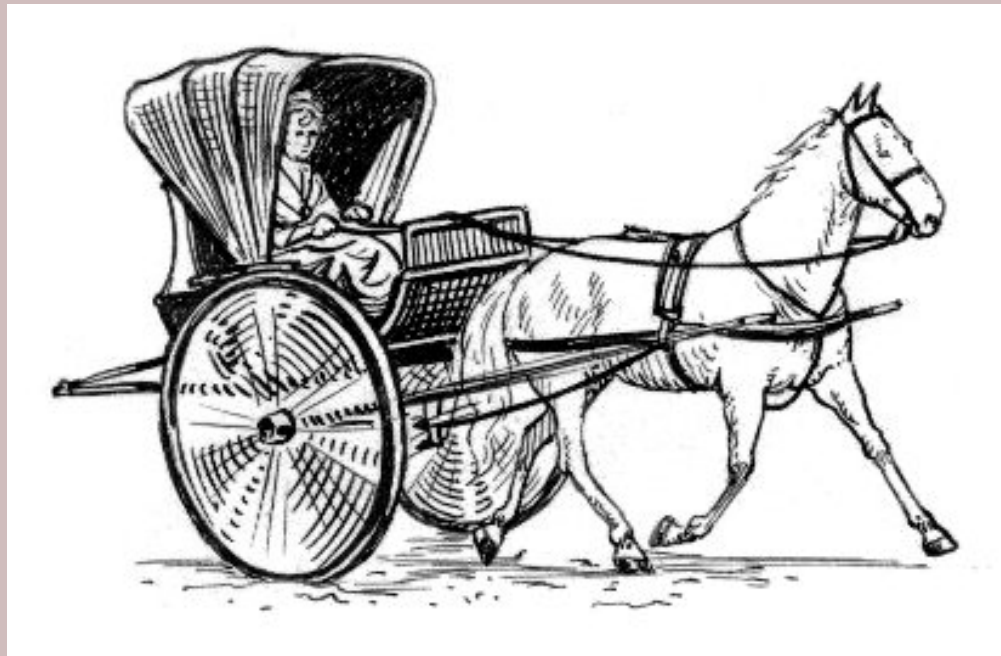

Male Servant Tax (1785-1792)



- *The male servant tax was levied on the households employing 'non-essential' male servants from 1777 onwards. This excluded farm labourers, industrial workers and servants in businesses like shops and inns. The tax was aimed primarily at the wealthy in town and country who could afford domestic or personal servants (such as cooks, butlers, valets, grooms, gardeners and coachmen).*

1801 Census

- Created because of the worry of food shortage in Britain
- Population Act of 1800
- Number of families and houses
- Number of Individuals and occupations
- Number of marriages, christenings, and burials



1801-1831 Census Content

- Contains only statistical information
- Some parishes compiled lists of names and occupations (population lists)
- Surviving pre-1841 census entries are found in:
 - Kirk session records (most) - available on Virtual Volumes in the Historical Search Room and the ScotlandsPeople Centre
 - Old Parish Registers (a few)
 - Local Archives
 - ScotlandsPeople Centre Reference Library (photocopies, transcriptions, and indexes)

1921 Scottish Census

- **June 19, 1921** – population 4,882,497

1921 Scottish Census

- New questions relating to the population of young people were introduced:
- The number of orphans living at each address were surveyed for the first time and asked whether the father, mother or both parents were deceased
- The number of dependent children.
- For the first time, a question was asked on whether a marriage had been 'dissolved by Divorce'.
- The question on infirmity was removed, but a new question asking whether individuals were eligible for benefit under the National Insurance Act 1911 was included.

1939 National Identity Register

- The Government carried out an enumeration of the population on 29 September 1939 just after the start of the Second World War. The Registrar General for Scotland, who had been making preparations for the 1941 census, was given responsibility for this task.
