Pre-Tour Consultation

Specific question(s) or goals for consultation:

My goal is to find a record of the birth parents of four siblings born in or around Albany County, New York, between 1800-1830.

Pertinent information related to your question:

The siblings are: Henry Shepherd, Charles Shepherd, James Shepherd, and Joseph Shepherd. I believe their father is Charles Shepherd, who appears on the 1810 and 1820 federal census for Duaneburg, Schoharie County and the 1830 federal census for Schoharie, Schoharie County. In his Revolutionary War pension affidavit, submitted in Albany County, in 1820, Charles Shepherd states that he has 3 sons, ages 6-12 and a "sickly" wife. Charles Shepherd and Henry, James and Joseph moved to Henry County, Iowa, around 1837. Charles Shepherd's wife is named Sarah Springsteen in a Shepherd family Bible and a published reminiscence written by Henry Shepherd's daughter around 1925. Would like to verify this information with documentation from New York

Any additional comments related to this consultation:

I have used Family Search's full-text search to search in church records from Albany, Schoharie, and Schoharie counties for the time period 1800-1830 with no results. I have searched adjacent pages in federal census for others with the same surnames of Shepherd and Springsteen. I have found a birth record for a Sarah Springsteen b. 1786 in Albany County, but have not found contemporary documentation linking her to Charles Shepherd. In 1844, a Letter of Administration, Charles Shepherd's wife and son James Shepherd, decline to administer Charles Shepherd's estate, no reason given.

Major Andrew Hill (1732-1810) his parents Anthony Hill (1704-1760) and Mary Ward (1708-1802).

Andrew's wife, Catherine Juda Horton (1734-1774) I have potential information of her parents which I need to confirm. Capt. Jonathan Paulding Horton (1711-1795) and Margaret K. Koel (1708-1787).

It has been written that their son, William Hill (1764-1844) was in the war also, at an early age. He later moved to New Jersey. Of course, the state lines move so it is a little confusing.

Pre-Tour Consultation

Specific question(s) or goals for consultation:

I hope to locate original sources that contain information on Jonathan Sackett Finney (ca. 1784-ca. 1819), his wife Mary Richards (1783-aft. 1863) and his parents, Joel Finney (1744-1799) and Anna Sackett (1751-1844).

Pertinent information related to your question:

J. S. Finney has few known contemporary sources. The initial link to him is from a flawed mugbook entry for his son Heman Finney (<https://archive.org/details/historyofcrawfor00perr/page/132/mode/2up?q=%22Haman+Finney%22>), which gives just enough reliable information to link him to his parents. There is also an 1811 letter from his uncle Eleazer Finney that lists him as a child of Joel Finney.

He is found in the 1810 census in Elizabethtown, Essex County, NY but has moved to Butler County, OH by 9 Jan 1813, where he appears in the estray record. He also appears in the "Field Book of Unapprised Land... in the years 1810 and 1811" for Elizabethtown, near brothers Anson, Heman, and Joel.

He is likely the age 16-25 male living with his brother Joel Jr. in the 1800 census (also in Elizabethtown) and one of three under 16 males with his father in the 1790 (actually 1791) census in Monkton, Addison County, VT.

There is no birth record for him in Connecticut, like there is for most of his siblings. Brother Anson's mugbook entry indicates that he (Anson) was born in Spencertown, Columbia County, NY. A Connecticut deed record that I can't currently lay hands on lists father Joel as "of Amenia in the County of Dutchess." IIRC, it was around the same time as Anson's birth, perhaps a year or two earlier.

I've looked at everything FamilySearch's AI can turn up for any variant of "Finney" I can think of in Essex and surrounding counties. I've physically visited the Essex County courthouse and spent three days trawling through court records but found nothing. I've attempted the same, but less extensively and without the physical visit, for Columbia and Dutchess Counties.

His wife, Mary Richards, has perhaps a bit more information, but is quickly brickwalled. A letter to her son, George Finney from Abraham Snethen, clearly shows that she was the sister of Lydia Richards, who

married Abraham Snethen in Butler County, OH in 1816. Abraham Snethen's (flawed - he gets the year of his own marriage wrong) autobiography indicates that Lydia was born in Essex County in 1796. It actually would have been Clinton County, Essex's parent.

Mary's father's name is given as "John Richards" in her son Heman's mugbook entry, but I can find no clear trace of a man of the right age named John Richards in Clinton or Essex Counties (or in Butler, OH and its neighbors) via FS's AI transcription search and the visit to Elizabethtown. I think that the father's name is probably reliable, since Mary lived until at least 1863, staying with her children, including Heman Finney. If it's in error, it's much more likely the fault of the transcriber or typesetter, I would think.

I'm hoping that church records or transcriptions of them may exist in the archive that could find some trace of the marriage of J.S. Finney and Mary Richards. Mary was presumably a Methodist (per Lydia's info in the Snethen bio) while the Finneys were Congregationalists. I ran out of time in Elizabethtown to dig deeply into what churches were there around 1800.

Their first child was born in New York in 1803.

Daughter Jane, my 3rd great grandmother, was born on 17 April 1808 in Ovid, Seneca, New York.

On 1880 census Jane lists mother's birthplace as New York, father's as New Jersey.

Census Records

1800 There is an Elias Reed age 16-25 and female age 16-25 in Minden, Montgomery, New York that is possibly my Elias Reed

1810 Elias Reed with appropriate family is in Seneca, Ontario, New York

1820 Family is in Perry, Genesee, New York.

1830 Family, minus Catharine by absence of appropriate counter, is again in Perry.

1840 Elias Reed and family are in Richfield, Summit, Ohio.

Any additional comments related to this consultation:

Other Ancestry trees that have Catharine Reed information without citation give her date of birth as 20 March 1785 which tracks with gravestone. They also list marriage date as 18 August 1796 at which time she would have been 11 years old.

I have been unable to find record's of property ownership by Elias Reed prior to the move to Ohio. Searched Register of Deeds records in both Ontario and Genesee counties.

Side note Catharine's headstone when viewed in 2023 was found to be off of the base and lying flat on the ground. I have thought of getting it repaired.

Specific question(s) or goals for consultation:

I am looking for information about the parents of Minor Meeker born July 5, 1795. In -Ranslears Patten - ?? NY. I have an account that he claimed to have been illegitimate and separated from his parents at a young age. The document claims that his father was David Meeker of Danbury Connecticut and his mother (unnamed) daughter of Thomas Thomas of Connecticut who married a man named Miller. In later information I think she is named Eliza but not certain.

Minor Meeker was separated from his mother (she gave him up –presumably to live the life of ill repute—at age 2 in the care of his grandmother (no name given) until he was 5 years old. He then lived with his uncle Elias Thomas where the family moved to Seneca County NY. When he was 16 his uncle moved to Steuben County near Mud Lake. At 18 Meeker was drafted on September 9, 1813 under Colonel Swift. About 1819 a group of people led by Elder Minor Thomas pastor of the Covert Baptist Church moved to Harrisburg, Fayette County Indianain 1820 he married Rachel Thomas, Elder Thomas’s daughter. Minor Meeker later became an Indiana state senator and my direct ancestor.

In another handwritten document, a letter written by Stephen Toney, written October 11, 1841, states that his mother’s siblings were Elias, Dina, and Sarah Thomas and at the point of this letter they were all deceased. She was still living in 1841.

Her children’s names were Horton, George, Sally, Polly, and what looks to me like Lorana. Lorana and Sally were living in 1841 and the others deceased.

She lived in Steuben County in Canton - south east corner of the county in 1841.

My questions are :

Are there any court records that indicate that she lived a life of ill repute?

Marriage record to ? Unnamed Miller?

Death record?

Who was Minor Meeker’s father? I searched for David Meeker but the dates don’t match.

Any birth records? Church records of birth?

Records for Elias Thomas? The above named siblings and children?
I have some records for Minor Thomas but nothing on Elias or Thomas Thomas.

Anything for people earlier than David Meeker and Thomases?

Those are the questions I can think of at the moment but research blooms to other questions so I am eager for any additional advise or answers.

On a few documents, my maternal great-grandmother purportedly was born in Ogdensburg NY sometime between 1856-59. On an application for a marriage license to my great-grandfather in Detroit MI (June 1874) both parties claim "parents unknown". I'd like to confirm Myra Tilghman's (born Wright) parentage and their origin(s). As an alternative, I would like to find evidence of family lore—how my mother's paternal grandfather (in the Italian Navy/Merchant Marines) arrived in New York in 1878.

Pre-Tour Consultation

Specific question(s) or goals for consultation:

Oops, I sort of responded to this on the previous page.

1. I hope to confirm the parents of my maternal great-grandmother, Myra Wright, b. Ogdensburg NY, July 6, 1856?
2. Where were Myra's parents born? How did they come to America?

Pertinent information related to your question:

I have been trying to chip away at these questions for years. My grandmother (Antoinette Tilghman, b. Aug. 7, 1890 in Chadron NE) would never talk about her family origins, even when asked, she just said that she was disowned by her family for marrying an Italian Catholic.

Her father was William Ridgely Tilghman from a very prominent family in Maryland, having come to America from England in the 1660s bearing a land grant from Lord Baltimore in England. They established The Hermitage in Queen Anne's County MD, which is still owned and operated by the Tilghman family today.

Antoinette's mother, Myra Wright, is my brick wall.

My research mainly consists of rabbit-hole diving and not-well organized. I believe that Myra's parents are Robert and Ann (b. Keto) Wright. Various censuses claim that Robert and Ann were born in either Ireland or Canada. I believe I found that Ann died in a 'poor-house' in Poughkeepsie NY in 1907, (d. Dec 2, 1907?).

I found a Robert Wright (common name) in the U.S. Town Clerks' Registers of Men Who Served, enlisted for 3 years, Feb. 26, 1864, from Ogdensburg NY. I've found no record of his death but he appears to be living in Poughkeepsie in 1870.

- 4) Presuming Archives or Library will have pertinent books/records re: military
- 5) I have reviewed Claverack clerk's records, no deaths or marriages appear. I plan to stop at Hillsdale Town Hall on my way to Albany.
- 6) Searches for Rachael have been unsuccessful. Her mother died 1881; Rachael is not mentioned in the will. I am also wondering if Rachael C. Haun and Christina are the same person.
- 7) Ancestry family trees don't mention Margaret and Sarah Story, but the lines leading to me have largely

died out so descendants of their siblings wouldn't necessarily know about them.

8) My 2nd gt-grandfather came from the Montreal area to US via Troy, according to his Naturalization papers. What would have been his mode of travel -- water or train?

9) My mother's grandfather Henry Ewer moved from Starksboro, VT to Moriah, NY. His mother died c. 1844 and by the 1850 census, he and his father Moses Ewer were living in Wisconsin.
