

# ***Tracing Scottish Ancestry: Records, Resources, and Research Strategies***

## ***Class 3: Using the Scottish Census & Census Substitutes***

Scottish census and census substitutes provide details about the immediate family of your ancestors. Using early tax records as substitutes for the pre-1841 census records, you can determine the social status and taxable belongings of your ancestors. The 1841–1912 censuses give you a wealth of genealogical detail to trace your Scottish ancestors. In many of these censuses, the place of birth, age, occupation, and the family structure are explained. Using these clues, you can better search church and vital records.

### ***Census Substitutes***

Using a variety of pre-1841 census substitutes you can occasionally locate your ancestors, as well as various taxes they paid in Scotland. Note: these substitutes do not always survive for every county in Scotland from the 17th to 19th centuries.

- 1801-1831 Census Content
- Contains only statistical information
- Some parishes compiled lists of names and occupations (population lists)
- Surviving pre-1841 census entries are found in:
  - Kirk session records (most) - available on Virtual Volumes in the Historical Search Room and the ScotlandsPeople Centre
  - Old Parish Registers (a few)
  - Local Archives
  - ScotlandsPeople Centre Reference Library (photocopies, transcriptions, and indexes)

### **Pre-1841 Statistical Data**

- Statistical charts available for the 1801, 1811, 1821, and 1831 Scotland censuses
- Government gathered statistical data to understand economy of the people
- Lists occupations, housing, and populations for every parish in Scotland; notes changes from previous census and reasons for those changes

- Contains only statistical information
- Some parishes compiled lists of names and occupations (population lists)
