Class 3: Church and Vital Records

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New Brunswick

- Legislation
 - a. Marriage Act (1791) - first New Brunswick act to regulate marriage and divorce
 - b. Anglican, Roman Catholic, Presbyterian or Quaker clergyman could perform marriage for men and women over the age of 21 (or with parental consent if younger) after banns were published for three consecutive weeks.
 - c. If banns were not published or if clergyman did not know the couple, a marriage bond and license was issued.

- Civil Registration
 - i. Pre-1864
 - ii. Vital records were entered in township books starting in 1702. The township system was abolished in 1859.
 - iii. Not all township books survive
 - 1. Many township books digitized on FamilySearch
 - 2. Township records microfilmed and available at the Nova Scotia Archives (Vital Records category in FamilySearch catalogue)
 - 3. Published township records at American Ancestors Research Center:
 - a. Argyle
 - b. Aylesford
 - c. Barrington
 - d. Cornwallis
 - e. Douglas
 - f. Farlmouth
 - g. Horton
 - h. Newport
 - i. Yarmouth
 - iv. No townships on Cape Breton Island
 - v. Mandatory registration started in 1864
 - vi. In 1876, the government stopped registration for births and deaths (only marriages were recorded)
 - vii. On 1 Oct. 1908, birth and death registrations resumed.

- Methodist Church
 - Methodist Conference organized in 1874
 - In 1893, divided into two districts (Charlottetown and Summerside)

- United Church

- Civil Registration
 - Mandatory registration started in 1906
 - Marriage records date back to 1787
 - Some gaps between 1813 and 1824
 - Clergy provided marriage registers between 1832 and 1923
 - Marriage licenses 1787-1919
 - Marriage bonds 1849-1902
 - The following records are at the Office of Vital Statistics in Montague:
 - Births – 1906 to present
 - Marriages – 1937 to present
 - Deaths – 1969 to present

 - No Baptist Church or minister
 - Revs. J. B. McDonald, George Armstrong, spent a few weeks in missionary work in 1875.
 - Rev. George Armstrong evangelized for nine weeks in 1879.

- Civil Registration:
 - Begins 1891/1892
 - Clergy submitted information until 1948
 - Microfilmed BMD:
 - Births, 1891-1899
 - Marriages, 1891-1922
 - Deaths, 1891-1949
 - Late registrations of births, 1840-1915
 - Recent VR's must be obtained from the Vital Statistics Division in St. John's, Newfoundland:
 - Births – 1920 to present
 - Marriages – 1923 to present
 - Deaths – 1969 to present
 - Note: 1950-1968 are available online on Ancestry.com (see link below)

Divorce Records

- Legislation
 - From 1840-1968 – Many divorces were granted by acts of Parliament
 - From 1867-1968, some provinces required the person wanting to obtain a divorce to place a notice in the newspapers.
 - From 1867-1963, a transcript of the act of divorce was published in the Statutes of Canada.
 - 1968 – First federal Divorce Act passed by Parliament
 - Central Registry of Divorce Proceedings is created.

- New Brunswick
 - 1847-1990 – Records are at the Provincial Archives (indexed 1847-1984)
 - Note: post-1940 records are the Archives are housed offsite. Order them at least 24 hours ahead of time.

- For the 1984-present records, contact the Central Registry Office Court House in Fredericton
- Nova Scotia
 - Pre-1960, records are at the Archives for Nova Scotia in two series:
 - Court for Divorce and Matrimonial Causes case files
 - Divorce Cause files
 - 1960-present – Divorces kept in area where divorce occurred.
- Prince Edward Island
 - 1867-1946 – at the Senate of Canada, Office of the Law Clerk and Parliamentary Counsel
 - In 1930, the court granting divorce was dissolved and divorces had to be obtained through an act of Parliament.
 - 1946-1980 – Index is at the Sir Louis Henry Davis Law Courts in Charlottetown; Original records are at the Prince Edward Island Archives
 - 1981-present – records are at the Davis Law Court
- Newfoundland and Labrador
 - Required an Act of Parliament to grant a divorce
 - Held by the Unified Family Court in St. John's, Newfoundland for 60% of province
 - Remaining records are at the local records office (six centers) where divorce occurred
