

**MICHAEL QUINN** — m. Ballymore, County Armagh, Ireland, 11 September 1833  
Michael Quinn was born by 1815. His family resided in Dorsy (Mullaghglass), Newtown Hamilton, County Armagh, Ireland in 1864.

**CATHERINE PRUNTY**

Catherine Prunty was born by 1815 and died after 1847.

**JOHN KILLIAN/KILLEN/KILLION** — m. Carlingford, County Louth, Ireland, 1840

John Killian/Killen/Killion was born circa 1821. John and Margaret left Glasgow, Scotland for New York, New York on the S.S. *Australia*, and they arrived on 22 May 1871.

**MARGARET RYAN**

Margaret Ryan was born circa 1824. She travelled on the S.S. *Australia* which arrived in New York, New York on 22 May 1871.

**TIMOTHY DALEY** — m. Stradbally, County Waterford, Ireland, 1818

Timothy Daley was born by 1800. In the County Waterford valuations from 1848-1851, Timothy Daly occupied a house and garden at Knockyoolahan East, Clonea, County Waterford, Ireland.

**MARY MANSFIELD**

Mary Mansfield was born by 1800 and died after 1841.

**JOHN (O')SHANNAHAN** — m. County Waterford, Ireland, before 1833

John (O')Shannahan most likely occupied a house and land in Ballyvoyle, Stradbally, County Waterford, Ireland in the County Waterford valuations taken between 1848-1851.

**ELIZABETH TROY**

**MICHAEL QUINN**

Michael Quinn was born in April 1847 and probably baptized at Ballymore, County Armagh, Ireland, 13 May 1847. He first left Glasgow, Scotland for New York, New York on the S.S. *Australia*; arriving on 22 May 1871. After residing in Scotland from at least 1880 through 1882, he returned to America circa 1885. His family lived on Edinboro Street in Newton, Mass. from 1893 until his death. He died at Newton, Mass., 4 October 1923, and was buried at Calvary Cemetery in Waltham, Mass., 6 October 1923.

Occupation: railway laborer

**MICHAEL JOSEPH QUINN**

Michael Joseph Quinn may have been born at Boston, Mass., 3 January 1873 although his World War I draft card gave the date 1 January 1877. Sometime between his birth and 1881, he and his parents moved to Scotland. By 1893 and through 1900, Michael Quinn resided on Edinboro Street, Newton, Mass. From 1902 until his death, his family remained at 29 Kensington Street, Newton, Mass. He died at Newton, Mass., 16 September 1937 and was buried at Calvary Cemetery in Waltham, Mass., 18 September 1937.

Occupations: lamp lighter and steam roller engineer

**MARY KILLIAN/KILLEN**

Mary Killian/Killen was probably born at County Louth, Ireland, circa August 1843-1847. She and her parents left Glasgow, Scotland for New York, New York on the S.S. *Australia*, and they arrived on 22 May 1871. With her husband and son, she returned to Scotland where her two younger sons were born in Grangemouth and Camphill. They returned to Mass. before 1900. She died at Newton, Mass., 12 February 1903, and was buried at Calvary Cemetery in Waltham, Mass.

**JOHN EDMOND KAVANAGH, JR**

John Edmond Kavanagh, Jr. was born at Cambridge, Middlesex, Massachusetts, 26 July 1907. He died at Beth Israel Hospital in Boston, Suffolk, Massachusetts, 1 April 1984. He was buried at Calvary Cemetery in Waltham, Middlesex, Massachusetts, 4 April 1984. His family residence was 29 Kensington Street in Newton, Middlesex, Massachusetts from about 1935 through 1998.

Occupations: accountant and firefighter.

**MAURICE DALEY**

Maurice Daley was probably born at Stradbally, County Waterford, Ireland, circa March 1841. The Daley family left from Queenstown, Ireland for Boston, Suffolk, Massachusetts on the S.S. *Scythia* and arrived on 27 August 1886. Daley family members resided at 176 Auburndale Avenue in West Newton, Middlesex, Massachusetts from at least 1889 through 1918. He died at West Newton, Mass., 30 December 1908, and was buried at Calvary Cemetery in Waltham, Mass.

**JOHANNA E. DALEY**

Johanna E. Daley [Joanna Daley] was born at Dungarvan, County Waterford, Ireland, 1876. Johanna E. Daley left from Queenstown, Ireland for Boston, Mass. on the S.S. *Scythia* and arrived on 27 August 1886. After her husband's death, she remained at 29 Kensington Street in Newton, Mass. until her death. She died at Wellesley Hospital in Newton, Mass., 29 April 1948, and was buried at Calvary Cemetery in Waltham, Mass., 1 May 1948.
